LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Two guest nights with 20 people and a LENS training event take place in the midst of Area Council which transforms it into a powerful external event.

Internal: A new house is found just in time to give us one week's moving preparation time.

Contradiction: Clarifying the funding plan for GRA participation.(Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: House participates in the Henley-upon-Thames LENS in London. The Area Council manoeuvres document is completed in time for the necessary mailing.

Internal: After a morning spent studying eight books for the GRA input, the end of quarter celebration is held honouring the British tradition: a trip to the seaside, fish and chips, and a visit to an amusement arcade—a great cap to the year.

Contradiction: Deciding what the necessary events are to maintain the momentum of the local while honouring the year's global event.(Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP:

External: Area Youth Cluster catalyzes planning by Tairgwaith Youth Council to raise funds for community building. Phone blitz sets ten appointments with Religious Orders for week 11 in five metros.

Internal: House doubles in size temporarily with influx of youth and one EG from London during school holidays.

Contradiction: Catalyzing implementation by local groups.(Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Regional participation in the Area Council solidifies one GRA recruit and surfaces another. Internal: Participation in the area new house search reveals that it is possible to find a

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum with no regular house presence. (Wk. 1)

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Encuentro Comunitario (TM) in Tabuenca, Province of Zaragoza, so excites Father Julio Calvo that he is committed to set up TMs across the province for the fall quarter. Bishop Iniesta of Vallecas has his Caritas team arrange appointments in villages south of Madrid.

Internal: Madrid colleagues attend House Church and are surprised at the extent of the Order's work across the globe.

Contradiction: Finding the key village organizers in the face of ancient, paralyzing lack of structures.(Wk. 1)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: LENS pedagogy Week II in Brussels awakens Europe to future use of this awakening tool.

Internal: Ecclesiola study on estrangement reaffirms possibility of articulating every human's journey.

Contradiction: Identifying the launching pad in the midst of year-end program demands. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: The World Premier of the Global Film, dubbed in French and Dutch, is shown for Ecclesiola with six guests.

Internal: Collegiums on the role of institutions and awakening, impact us as the future directions for awakening.

Contradiction: Focussing operations for Quarter I.(Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Finished the *Primal Community: The Next Decade*

with tremendous symposium on the next ten years in development. Many participants work on being the staff of the next formation fortnight in Europe or Wherever. The area remaneuvers with fortnight participants and plans great quarter of Set formation circuits to all regions in the Area.

Internal: More guests than Order as the closing House Church celebrates the quarter, and gets everyone ready for the road.

Contradiction: Designing the catalytic events that celebrate this year's engagement of movement colleagues and prepare them for next year's journey of campaigns and circuits. (Wk. 11)

ROME

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TERMINE HDP

External: CEM concludes with a patrons luncheon hosted by 15 people from Termine in the Abruzzo region's finest restaurant. New national brochure completed (2000 copies) after two years of work.

Internal: Colleagues join house to produce the Italian version of the CEM document and the CEM is celebrated with colleagues at a local restaurant.

Contradiction: Pulling together the loose strands of the quarter into a solid victory on all fronts. (Wk. 10)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Bendel State Rubber Communities, participating in Village Meetings, hold their Assembly with proposals that hold significant implications for working with the other Federal Commodity Boards. This would require using LENS, then Village Meetings and an Assembly for an awakening network which would lead to cluster set-ups. New rubbish drums arrive in time for ITT rep. from New York, touring to see the project. His closing line was "This visit has made my trip worthwhile; this project must be one of your best."

Internal: Overjoyed House receives Oyler, Sanlola and Mukosha from Bendel State with victorious stories, Bill and Suzanne Parker for LENS from Accra circuit, joining the Lachmans who arrive from Zambia and two-year-old Lucy Mukosha who arrives with the Lachmans after a long wait for a passport.

Contradiction: Focusing action to put us in position to do the next year. (Wk. 13)

ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: A series of private sector call puts us in position for having an Ivoirian colleague go with us on calls. This catalyses a significant contact in the Ivoirian Chamber of Commerce.

Internal: Contact with INADES (African development organisation) leads to temporary housing with the Catholic Church.

Contradiction: Converting the support which is being generated into concrete practical action. (Wk. 1)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: In a week of circuiting in Area Vienna a breakthrough is made as heads of Religious Orders are visited with full programme potential of 30 forums of training events. Meanwhile appointments are set with high level Protestant church symbolic leadership in authorization manoeuvre--12 appointments across Germany-- with Bishops and Bishops representatives. With 3 colleagues doing set up and 3 others leading, a great CYF is held in Frankfurt Region for 40 tenth

class students in Catholic school.

Internal: As the study of Existence Rationality begins, (this time as a screen for understanding Germany) and an extended study of Friedman's Chapter 3 *Four-fold Path of Radical Practice* gives us new ways of approaching our missional strategy, the City of Frankfurt clarifies their renovation plan for the house—as they maintain this historical building.

Contradiction: Maintaining corporate focus on GRA recruitment as scatteredness in response to programme intensification in five regions seems to diffuse the victory actually won. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: English and German versions of the document *Four Years Kreuzberg Ost* are completed. A student group from Nurnberg visits the project and a student decides to work with the project for one year. Gudrun Weber gives 3rd world report at a Set meeting in Feldbergen, where four TM training events, two TMs, three GWFs, one CYF plus the closing Assembly took place--four of these events being led by local leaders.

Internal: The house facade of Wrangel Str 83 is finished with white siding, group visiting Berlin for *German Katholikentag* is sent out, and Europe's mind turns to the European football (soccer) cup.

Contradiction: Needing other demonstrations to show effectiveness of methods besides Kreuzberg Ost Project in Berlin. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Eur-Asia circuit initiates Protestant, Catholic and secular religious contacts with consensus to build new community life in Olympic village housing development.

Internal: The five adults assigned show up in four continents with Academy in North America, permeation in Amsterdam, circuit in Eur-Asia, LENS pedagogy in Europe.

Contradiction: Finding the right housing space in right place for the right price. (Wk. 12)

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: Development trip to Oslo pushes Kenya 326,140 Norwegian Kroner proposal from the very interested to the yes box. Danchurchaid indicates interest in TM and designates \$10,000(US) for ICA work.

Internal: Ingrid Banks and Hezekiah Odyambo spend week II with Bente Ost Hanses at their Nekselo farm and give a presentation on CYF with the leader of a scout camp.

Contradiction: Maintaining the tension between completing TM coverage to Helsinki and Trondheim and netting for GRA. (Wk. 1)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: As the Primary School completes its second week of classes with two first grade sessions per day of 45 pupils each, the teacher visits district offices to arrange for a grade two class (a salute to Kapini Preschool), and over 50 parentys complete the foundation to the teacher's house. The Village Forum team reports the Southern Province Victory of 40 Forums putting the national total at 432 villages. Two Health Aaretakers create and win a three day maneuver that gets vaccines in order to hold a June "under-five" clinic.

Internal: House hosts and appreciates the wisdom, work and wit of management/development team Williams and Bauknight and sends them on their way with a courtyard picnic, and a sojourn construct is written for seven

unexpected sojourners.

Contradiction: Holding our timeline and expense budgets while working with public officers. (Wk. 13)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Bayad villagers take responsibility for East Bank Cluster Assembly as date is set for June 6th. The community centre facility inner walls go up. Bayad's nearest neighbour, Sheikh Ali, has a Village Meeting.

Internal: House plus host of guests including Ken and Grace Wegner and two guests from England attend preschool teacher Mosa Salema's wedding and witness her proudly signing the wedding contract herself.

Contradiction: Enabling the village leadership to do the rest of the Village Meeting. (Wk. 12)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Kipsianan-Koisamo HDP is launched and Rift Valley now has a demonstration project. Two teams are sent out for consults in Nguluku, Coastal Province, and Kalwani-Shamalogo, Western Province, demonstrating great spirit as they depart in combis and buses. In a globalizing week, a Danish journalist visits Kamweleni, General Motors and Express Kenya set quarter II LENS dates and students from the Institute of Adult Studies, University of Nairobi, visit Kamweleni and participate in Village Meeting event—practical experience for the Research and Training Unit in Kamweleni.

Internal: The House uses LENS methods to focus on '80-'81, sends out collegium constructs to project houses for input relative to training, style and symbols and comes up with a model for Cluster Villages in Machakos District.

Contradiction: Clarifying the timeline for planning and consensus of models for '80-'81. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcell Community Health Caretaker from Stake 4 registers 150 mothers on Clinic Day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenyan Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmers preparation at farms, troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI facility. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY-MALIWADA HDP

External: Women's Advancement Module training held for 30 ICA staff women and three Sevagram HDP village women in preparation for five, 5-day modules in district projects this quarter, creates a new vision and sense of collegiality among the women of Nava Gram Prayas. First impact and GRA recruitment foray to Jabalpur reopens that region to the movement.

Internal: Global Methods School PSU creates the means to convey the depth of the internal life to the 25 district projects while HDTI recruitment teams hold collegiums on daily ritual and demonstrate use of the *Internal Life Guide*.

Contradiction: Ensuring participation of key village leadership in upcoming HDTI. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Major breaklooses occur in funding and authorization with tax exemption (100%) given for 50 villages and the block. Development raises 26,750 rupees across the continent this week plus 6,000 rupees in in-kind goods for GRC. Vaviharsh Second Consult document is produced and first continental newsletter is completed.

Internal: GRC preparation is in full swing as international faculty arrives.

Contradiction: Building realistic strategies that will release new time, energy, and money. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI-SIKROR HDP

External: Impact thrust is initiated in Area Delhi as first LENS is held with National Small Industries Corporation (Government of India). Global Film Shows are held at Australian High Commission and United Nations Office with UNDP, UNFPA and UNWFP. Actuation continues in Sikror as village finally decides to have electricity and collects deposits from 61 families.

Internal: Delhi office turned into wayside inn as LENS team arrives and quick circuit by Development Centrum provides perfect excuse for impromptu House celebration.

Contradiction: Ensuring that any action is done at the critical place and time for greatest effectivity. (Wk. 9)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Twenty farmers take a course in modern farming methods from All India Coordinated Research for Dryland Agriculture. Centrum sets up September LENS in Madras with the National Small Industries Commission. District Collector calls a meeting to set up the "Committee for the All Round Development of Nadlapur," which includes the Collector, District Department Heads, Block Officers and the VST Company.

Internal: C. Satara and R. Prabaraj return from awakening campaign in Area Calcutta.

Contradiction: Making a response to public sector pressure to expand our work while waiting for our employers' authorization. (Wk. 11)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: The second week of the HDTI is completed including the urban excursion and ending with a dynamite UR celebration. The first phase of site selection is completed as the House and continental team select potential villages.

Internal: The Nexus team stops by on its way to visit the HDTS.

Contradiction: Moving forward appropriately while meshing public and private sector timelines. (Wk. 1)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Roxana attends Toastmasters' with a guardian from Singapore, Patrick Ing. Majuro CEM begins. Another LENS is firmed up for September with Nati textbook firm.

Internal: The fast day is preceded by a steak feast and concluded with an EG cookie fest, and Ann, John and Gordon are sent out to various parts of the globe.

Contradiction: Ensuring that all bases are covered throughout July and August. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SERUSUP-HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTS and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Pilot MTM (Community Forum) training event is hosted by the Kuala Selangor District Office with 12 representing the four MTM villages. This includes all the headmen and a school principal and three of the District Officer's representatives. Ford lends the project a 1980 *Fiesta* for the duration of the MTM campaign.

Internal: Rochmat returns from CEM in Kelapa Dua and the entire House takes on the task of getting the ICA Malaysia into the mail.

Contradiction: Creating the model that will allow the MTM campaign to be done by those business and local people already possessing leadership responsibilities. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: The Community Center is dedicated with an all day program which concludes with a three hour Islamic preaching event. Community Meeting produces a three month plan which emphasizes Mosque refurbishing, community assessments of each family to pay for it, starting three more chicken houses, and preschool fees for the first time. The Area Council produces a 45 page report to the globe of its 1979-'80 work.

Internal: Much coming and going: regional Priors depart, Mansur Umar, Udin family and six Bubun citizens arrive from Bontoa HDTI Kathy Rees visits on her way to Australia, Ann Epps arrives for development joining Geoff Nixon, the Cock family departs for Summer '80 and Elvie Languido goes to visit her sick father in the Philippines. Self-support strength increases as Doris Rettig signs a teaching contract and the Rettig children receive school scholarships—all of this is topped off with the naming of the Mansur and Hasih Umar twins after one month of waiting—Hillere and Yudistira.

Contradiction: Creating the forms and structures that maximize and strengthen the symbolic shift of responsibility for the project. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN-BUBUN HDP

External: Two Global Women's Forums, two 3-month Assemblies, training from the Fisheries Department and the Education Department for the Cluster, plus meetings with the Health Department to set up Health Module for June, bring the cluster villages and the government departments together. USAID rewrite is completed to enable funding for 1980-81.

Internal: Headman of Tapak Kuda (one of the cluster villages) dies and the cluster participate in celebrating his completed life. Wa'u and Romanus are sent to the CEM in Kelapa Dua..

Contradiction: Creating the "death ground" for village leadership so they assume full responsibility. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG-BONTOA HDP

External: A hundred things go on at one time in the last week before the HDTI, a cadre meeting is held with the headmen from the surrounding villages and recruiting and cluster visiting continues invitations go out for the opening. People are up day and night writing curriculum, construction is still going on, office and kitchen start running and all is under way

for a great HDTI.

Internal: First boat people arrive with five from Bubun. Roxanna arrives from Kuala Lumpur. Faculty space is set-up.

Contradiction: Getting the participants to decide the school is the most worthwhile thing in their lives. (Wk. 9)

HONG KONG**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Community Extension Modules in North Seapac are completed and were reported out to the Nexus on Week II. The prediction is, these CEMs have "saved our soul."

Internal: Total House (with the exception of Research Centrum—Vergara and Bell) gathers and has a Mexican feast with David Scott and children.

Contradiction: Forging a central operating image for missional task relative to the future. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Completed slide-show and three-dimensional contour map educate villagers on the work of Nam Wai Foundation, Ltd. and show the Nam Wai land plan.

Internal: Feast at Ho Chung marks completion of Community Extension Module.

Contradiction: Keeping the interest of the whole village before the Board so that the whole village benefits from its structure and work. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: Letters to 50 companies are mailed for possible cottage industry contracts for extension villages. First core meetings are held prior to Economic Issues Forums. Two women and elders of Hai-Ou start their programs in the new Center with cosmetic demonstrations and a concert.

Internal: The House loses two iron women—Nancy is sent out for University preparation in Indiana and Linda joins the development team in Taipei for last major trek of the year—and the Cunninghams return from a Taipei Guardains evening to welcome a new sojourner from Ping Tung, Dave Ha.

Contradiction: Training and equipping new staff to play up-front roles before the week of Forums starts. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Visits with Philippine government officials, foreign embassies, and target corporations reaffirm support of ICA program for next year. Intensive follow-up on committed and working money from past development trek is continued, and telephoning blitz for next trek is begun. Philippine regions PSU on expansion of ICA bookkeeping system is held following the annual audit.

Internal: House hosts parish and school friends of Heather Howell in despedida party as she leaves for the US and student house and the movie Kramer vs Kramer addresses house as great image builder relative to responsibility.

Contradiction: Covering all the bases to enable finishing the year in the black and providing base for launching next year. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Development deposits \$3,500US for the week with the first support ever from Chinese companies who were approached directly from "top 500" list more than eight months ago. LENS dinner is held for representatives from eight companies, both Chinese and multinational.

Internal: The Oden family is sent out to the U.S. for the summer.

Contradiction: Securing year-end program funds for the sake of '80-'81 positioning. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Blue shirts play dignitary role at 24 Early Learning Nutrition Center graduations across the island, bestowing diplomas. June/July maneuvers of nutrition/sanitation is readied by teachers as 24 toilet bowls are delivered by Jardine Daview, one per village. The island ELNC payroll is for the first time totally handled by Sudtonggan administrative staff.

Internal: A week of celebrations and a visit by the Frank Wherrys prepare the House for the sendout of GRA participants to Chicago, and the House receives Luzviminda Estorgio into adult structures and assigns four blueshirts in the house to self-support.

Contradiction: Breathing life into carefully drawn models of the next two months.(Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Luman HDP reports youth organize to deal with corporate agriculture projects and two waiting sheds completed by puroks one and four. Langub HDP reports profits on General State payed to members, sewing Industry payroll hits \$4,000 and community decides to start a new Buri industry and National Manpower agrees to pay salary. A Community assembly makes plans for the 2nd anniversary fair and celebration. A site visit by the rural Improvement Club of Digos promotes a request for Town Meeting.

Internal: Five key colleagues from the cluster HDPs decide to sojourn in the house next quarter.

Contradiction: Getting the rainy season started so that the agriculture programs can break loose again. (Wk. 11)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Tokyo Boeki Co. confirms a LENS seminar for 25 section heads—the rising younger management of a very unique company. Seibu Department Store education manager and his assistant spend five hours at the ICA office discussing the next steps.

Internal: The monthly advisors dinner includes two new people and focuses on a lengthy discussion of LENS in Japan.

Contradiction: Building the strategy and transforming the tools to allow LENS to break into the receptive but difficult Japanese market, both public and private.(Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Twenty consultants and Guardians visit in preparation for CEM, as village bar campaign moves into final stretch of five bars.

Internal: Jeni is sent out to Seoul Region Management meeting in Seoul House.

Contradiction: Breaking loose the mythic foundations of Jeju Island for the sake of rapid and effective extension. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Fifteen people gather at new Seoul House for metro meeting and bring with them 350,000 Won. HDTs back up, with work on curriculum and Development is all-consuming.

Internal: Saturday night decor party begins the process of turning an ordinary house into a revolutionary, context-setting dwelling.

Contradiction: Planning Quarter IV using the unique missional indicatives. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: A new preschool opens in Man Chen II. The teacher spends four days of in-service training in the Kuh Du E Ri preschool under Miss Park and caps it off with a weekend curriculum workshop with the House.

Internal: Mr Um comes to visit while his university is out and doubles our local punch.

Contradiction: Turning local pastor's passion for the preschool into useful channels.(Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: The week of effulgence: three training meetings are set up in Hiroshima and a TM is held in Yamabuchi. Advisors from Tokyo, Osaka and Fukuoka gather together to pull off the first full LENS in Japan. *What a Way to End the Year* celebration is held after LENS.

Internal: The House is packed: Don Clark and two advisors from Tokyo are here to staff the LENS, plus an Advisor from Osaka.

Contradiction: Concretizing the LENS followup.(Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: A major soap company holds a TM for salesmen scheduled to go to America for training. The first registration for August LENS arrives and facility reserved. Gestetner delivers inkind used electric duplicator and a boxful of stencils.

Internal: The House gears up for a full summer with a collegium on the summer overview., flight reservations for house members headed for Chicago, Mrs. Yoshikawa getting her visa and phone network spreading invitations for Summer '80 send-out celebration.

Contradiction: Incorporating major fund-raising into an already full summer plan.(Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO—OYUBARI HDP

External: Oyubari CEM document translation into Japanese is almost completed during week II. Miss Nokaji translates for Oyubari site visits.

Internal: The house is summerized by the removal of plastic and boards from windows, the yard is cleaned and all participate in the elementary school sports day and kindergarten picnic.

Contradiction: Forgetting the missional importance of corporate celebration and rest dynamics, in the midst of a heavy teaching schedule and the short time available for all the House to be present for Week II work and planning.(Wk. 11)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: CEM documentation of five years of human development in Oombulgurri is finally completed and published, an awe-occasioning event. The director of Australian Youth Organisations responds with a yes to a city-wide CYF. The final report of the CMA set in Wyong is sent to the printer.

Internal: Lisa Smith wins a pen as the #1 employee out of 75 at McDonald's, eight people are sent to overseas destinations and the House sees the new man in *Kramer vs Kramer*.

Contradiction: Interpreting this year's Divine Economy in order to decide next year's response.(Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

Internal: The House celebrates its being with a fancy meal at home and the play *Rain*.

Contradiction: Scheduling events which will maintain momentum through the summer. (Wk.9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: HDTS ends first week with 28 full time participants, representing 8 nations, 8 US states and 7 Mississippi counties. Delta Pace Community Association meets Wednesday night with 60 from Pace and 50 from HDTS to hear about new industry and to receive economic cycle work. Ground is broken for soil testing for new sewer.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

experiment as joint venture with ICA, Legal Services organization and VISTA. Alma College team of 26 returns from three weeks in Woburn Lawn ready to go back next year and Indiana Central University chooses Pisinemo for '81 work project. Four-day neighborhood festival is outstanding success with TV coverage from all three networks.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

Internal: Participation in the regional Guardians meeting in Starks rehearses that our we of colleagueship is broad-based and deep and the house wins in self-support as all (including youth) are fully employed.

Contradiction: Preventing an effective self-support focus from cancelling out program thrusts.(Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Mary Coggeshall shows India and Sudtonggan slides to Albany Metro guardian colleagues. Three of the audience plan to attend the symposium in Chicago.

Internal: The House celebrates three wedding anniversaries on one week, two years for the Lindstroms, seven years for the Emericks, 21 years for the Roses.

Contradiction: Moving slowly on things that can get done quickly.(Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: South End participates in neighborhood block parties (one the St. Botolph street fair and the other the Canton Block Club festival). Stark's spice racks are marketed and the house engages in its immediate neighborhood.

Internal: The House sends a border off to a Cuba vacation and the remainder attend the week-end Area retreat, following a permiation blitz with all working.

Contradiction: Creating images that release summer creativity and dollars.(Wk. 1)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

Contradiction: Enabling all community leadership to see possibility and challenge of their emerging role of total community caretakers. (Wk. 9)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Cano Negro Civil Association Board of Directors approves auxiliary request to move out of the community center and re-locate office space in the two dorm buildings.

Internal: The House celebrates the completion of the CEM at the beach with representatives from two of the targeted extension villages.

Contradiction: Prioritizing auxiliary and colleague activities so that key events happen. (Wk. 1)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Intense focus completes Miserior proposal for marketing agency in time for framing maneuvers. Social programs are strengthened by eight government salaries. Nutrition team and sector teams are launched.

Internal: Ecclesiola reflection reveals wisdom gained in the year and models to share with the world. House children care for 200 rabbits.

Contradiction: Creating a weekly rhythm with the community's administrative team which includes the needed dynamics of training and consensus formation. (Wk. 9)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Four-week "May Forum Comunitario campaign" ends with total of 36 forums held in 32 municipalities with over 2,000 in attendance. Forums' high visibility enables them to be a tremendous authorization, as well as awakening maneuver, with Archbishops, corporate presidents, and state and federal government agency heads, all in attendance.

Internal: Whole house celebrates forum campaign completion with a Week II at the Rio Sheraton Hotel inked and an all-you-can-eat Brazilian churrasco dinner.

Contradiction: Seeing the next 10 weeks through August 15 as a beginning instead of an ending phase. (Wk. 12)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: Midwest Youth Project (14 from Indianapolis and Cincinnati) tear down the mountainside and plant flower gardens as part of preschool area landscaping. Two teams are assigned to special funding maneuver for GRA travel and fees.

Internal: The House participates in a village wedding and is struck again by the intentionality and seriousness that is held in tension with spontaneous and wild celebration.

Contradiction: Balancing troops and time in order to complete urgent tasks of week 12. (Wk. 1)

MEXICO CITY

External: Tony Cantese from DePaw University comes to prepare for next January's work camp in Conacaste. Rotary Club decides to sponsor another series of alphabetization classes. External: Human Development Training Module starts with opening feast. Bee classes begin in Lima with three residents in Azpitia. Inter American Development Bank asks for new proposal to replace last year's.

Internal: House and village reorients itself to House participants and hold HDTM.

Contradiction: Developing the organization which will ensure the victory of the biggest six weeks of Azpitia's history. (Wk. 9)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports from Hong Kong that the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes is interested in a \$35,000 proposal to do health in 100 villages, and \$5,000 received from American Express in Taiwan. Singapore reports \$10,000 grant from Mobil. In Brussels the Divine Word Fathers of Rome approve \$100,000 for India. Bombay reports a company adopting the Calcutta project at R.300,000 (plus car) over three years and R.30,000 raised from Bombay companies in one week. In Chicago the \$1.5 campaign accelerates as assigned personnel arrive from around the globe. Annual subscription workshop with the entire campaign team reveals the possibility of underwriting the global budget through well orchestrated annual subscription drive. The contradiction lies in the arena of releasing large contributors early in the campaign to get over the hump.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that GRA regional teams are taking shape with recruitment momentum building. Documentation of '79-'80 is underway with program victories charts in Brussels and Hong Kong. GRA prep in Chicago gains momentum in working on methods for creating the strategies for the 3rd campaign, Hope, and the Prophet. Prophets of hope are generating a new spirit mode for declaration in a time when the world is living under a cloud of doom. The key contradiction lies in having time to brood through the depths of spirit needed to undergird a move toward an Intraglobal Local Movement of Human Communities.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operation Centrum reports that Vogar CEM completes the band of 24. LENS setup continues: General Motors Kenya, Kenya Express, Mobil Indonesia, European Economic Community, La France Insurance Co. Paris, International Computers Limited London. All have dates set. The key contradiction lies in the arena of training guardians especially those with language skills other than English to teach the LENS seminar.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that preparation of facility and food services for the GRA goes into high gear in Chicago with the completion of the setup of 700 beds. Inkind wins include two live steers. Singapore Nexus reports large (almost \$23,000) debt retired in Australia, marking the end to 18 months pay-out. The Nexus finance reports are received in Chicago indicating the establishment of regular accounting and reporting patterns. The contradiction lies in the arena of monitoring closely the local systems, to spot issues before they become blocks.

Hall and plans the July maneuvers for the Fair.

Internal: Many visitors are received: the Ajinomoto regional manager with the branch manager, four from the regional health office and the vice president of the Rotary Club from Makati.

Contradiction: Orchestrating a proposal for one year's pay for ten village workers through the mayor and then the municipal council. (Wk. 2)

External: Langub hosts its second-year celebration and the Mountain Cluster celebrates its first year. Both have guild presentations, dancing, a whole pig to feast on and cluster reports. The whole event is planned and pulled off by village leadership demonstrating to all their priorship prowess.

Internal: House planning builds a 13-week timeline for the quarter, targeting key events in all seven HDPs in Davao region and planning treks to Cebu and Manila to help hold the fort down during GRA assignments.

Contradiction: Getting a financial plan that works for eight Mountain Cluster Nutrition and Early Learning Centres. (Wk. 2)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Guardians Paul Murayama and George Kawai travel to Fukuoka to teach LENS. Kawai translates all five passages from *The Ronin* into Japanese and is overwhelmed by the positive response.

Internal: Christina's 12 year old niece travels alone from California to Tokyo for a two-week visit, and is grandly hosted by the House and Japanese colleagues.

Contradiction: Allowing the scattered nature of July to intensify the local mission by requiring new leadership from local colleagues. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Twenty consultants and Guardians visit in preparation for CEM, as village bar campaign moves into final stretch of five bars.

Internal: Jeni is sent out to Seoul Region Management meeting in Seoul House.

Contradiction: Breaking loose the mythic foundations of Jeju Island for the sake of rapid and effective extension. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: The House celebrates the conclusion of one month sojourn training program that includes the Voyage, RS1, RS111a and CS111a. Two of the sojourners stay on to spend the month of July in Kuh Du E Ri expansion work. Development and inkind continue to bubble with quarterly donations and medicine for expansion villages Health Outposts.

Internal: Seoul House continues to be full to capacity as sojourners are replaced with hosting Japan colleagues and the Armas family on reroute to Chicago. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: A new preschool opens in Man Chen II. The teacher spends four days of in-service training in the Kuh Du E Ri preschool under Miss Park and caps it off with a weekend curriculum workshop with the House.

Contradiction: Pulling off the practical and imaginal transition which will make an exciting winter in Sydney. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

Internal: RH13 review reveals that the House is in the black even more than estimated.

Contradiction: Making the most creative use of new possibilities opening up in the local frame.(Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Arkansas State Health Department and TM: Arkansas have initial talks about providing health services to towns in southeast section of state, breaking open great possibilities of working together in future. Little Rock Guardian, Richard Butler, Jr., goes to Chicago Guardians Meeting.

Internal: Michael Shaw receives promotion in new job with Census Bureau through new colleague.

Contradiction: Conveying HDTs as key to release local people for the future mission. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: South Oakcliff (Dallas) workshop leader trainees participate in demo TM. Festival preparation enters final stage as Indian balloons get printed and colleagues sign up to man booths.

Internal: The House celebrates its being with a fancy meal at home and the play *Rain*.

Contradiction: Scheduling events which will maintain momentum through the summer. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: HDTs ends first week with 28 full time participants, representing 8 nations, 8 US states and 7 Mississippi counties. Delta Pace Community Association meets Wednesday night with 60 from Pace and 50 from HDTs to hear about new industry and to receive economic cycle work. Ground is broken for soil testing for new sewer.

Internal: At the HDTs the week is highlighted with visit to Laurence Murphy's farm, a B B King concert and a Saturday night fiesta.

Contradiction: Ensuring continual Pace participation and support for HDTs and residue.(Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: The work of the last weeks of the campaign are pulled together. Comprehensive notes on key contacts and hosts across the state are filed. The development team arrives on a whirlwind trip to secure \$18,000.

Contradiction: Orchestrating symphony when same musicians must play several instruments at the same time.(Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Second yearly CYF is held for Junior Leadership Atlanta. The 70 participants are led by two workshop leaders who were grads from a CYF last year. Steering committee follow-up results in commitments to set up pilot CYFs in fall for youth in Action program.

Internal: Lynn and daughters Teresa and Jessica are sent out to Pace for school preparation.

Contradiction: Maintaining some program momentum with demands of self-support.(Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Community structures become established as ELC enrollment reaches 14 with two more in process (licenses for 16) which assures financial stability. Senior citizens Nutrition Program opens with 56 registrations for Monday to Friday lunch with activities. A planning meeting is held for the third Annual Labor Day Parade and Family Fun Day.

Internal: Prior attends the Annual Conference of the United Methodist Z. Smith Reynolds grant approval of \$15,000 to CDA assures Church and is addressed by the void of issues.

Contradiction: Assuring that the auxiliary exit to GRA catalyses July activities, rather than creating a paralyzing sense of abandonment. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: House sends out J. Reese to teach in HDTs. A three week recruit from Pasco County CAP arrives with others to attend the third week.

Internal: House celebrates Memorial Day poolside with some great cookin' outdoors.

Contradiction: Finding the time and practical way to positively shape GRA planning while winding down program work and expanding self-support base.(Wk. 11)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: The Urban Probe team has a key call with the largest youth-serving agency in the U.S., the Youth Network Council, and sets up a demonstration forum with members of 25 agencies. Another of the hidden army of EI colleagues is discovered in a Chicago neighborhood with instant affirmation and a CYF scheduled.

Internal: Participant in the Global Symposium number 772, and all systems go.

Contradiction: Maintaining the perspective of the whole rather than centering on the two or three arenas that need most attention.(Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Preschool is completely moved off 3444 campus to new facility with assistance of MYF group from Hutchinson, KS. Floyd Stanley represents Fifth City at CEM in Ivy City.

Internal: Cleveland House participates in week II moving as the MOVE becomes a living reality.

Contradiction: Designing time in the crunch of moving both families and offices while maintaining programmatic thrusts.(Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA—LORIMOR HDP

External: Over 400 participate in Lorimor's Second Annual Heritage Day celebration. Day includes dedication of new community center, tours, display of Lorimor journey since 1887, pig roast, concert, alumni banquet, and dance.

Internal: House has great Memorial Day picnic.

Contradiction: Building core support and participation for evaluation week.(Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Seventy people are present for House Church in St. Joseph's celebrating the departure of Mary Z. Longstreth for the Chicago Nexus for internship. The first block party is held—in the House block—a great community relations event.

Internal: The total House spends the day at *Worlds of Fun*—most experience the orient express.

Contradiction: Caring for Kansas City (urban) while a breakloose is happening in the rural.(Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Partnership Town Meetings create interest among volunteers, catalyze hopes and dreams of young farmers. Kinney Custom Industries marketing trip to Minneapolis demonstrates transition of two women from HDP participants to business managers.

Internal: Hansons are sent out to Chicago to participate in the summer planning preparation.

Contradiction: Blending the excitement of new program opportunities with the attraction of an alluring spring.(Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: St. Louis Higher Education Council Director is excited about launching a program to promote cross cultural interchange through HDP workdays and internships. He is ready to salary one ICA staff next year.

Internal: Mary Crane—Mark Harvey garden wedding brings the Order and extended family from across the continent for week-long feasting and fellowship.

Contradiction: Ensuring regional colleagues participation in the GRA.(Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: First four of five stake meetings are held to draw sketches for a 20-year space management plan. Up-to-date information on small diameter sewer system is distributed.

Internal: Special ecclesiola celebrates the birthdays of two House members.

Contradiction: Engaging troops into a single thrust.(Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Kinney Custom Industries holds an Economic Forum and puts the company down the road. KCI partner does battle planning with her family, and runs over to tell us, "The method works!"

Internal: Addie Lyman is sent to Chicago for summer preparation. Barbara and the EG travel to graduation ceremony, leaving Mike and Joe to prepare House sale.

Contradiction: Enabling the community to fully recognize the implications of transition.(Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Planning for youth of Green Bay Diocese began at meeting with two regional colleagues and director of youth program.

Internal: House expands wayside inn dynamic with guests from Brillion, LaCrosse and Oshkosh, Wisconsin and Chicago, Berkeley and San Francisco.

Contradiction: Expanding the house's catalytic role in the region.(Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: VISTA proposal is approved providing four national

VISTAs in June and four locals in August to staff rural cluster experiment as joint venture with ICA, Legal Services organization and VISTA. Alma College team of 26 returns from three weeks in Woburn Lawn ready to go back next year and Indiana Central University chooses Pisinemo for '81 work project. Four-day neighborhood festival is outstanding success with TV coverage from all three networks. ¹

Internal: House youth and Meg Wildhack leave with regional team of 10 youth and four adults for two week work project in Woburn Lawn where they will finish interior of preschool built by Alma College team and 25 participate in Area Priors visit which includes *The Empire Strikes Back* and session outlining summer objectives and state of the movement.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: House and Metro troops hold a Church Leadership Forum with core leadership of the Episcopal Church in Loncoln Heights, to envision the '80s and to launch Everymember Visitation Campaign.

Internal: An end of quarter, end of year celebration with a picnic in the park and a movie *The Coal Miner's Daughter* is a great happening.

Contradiction: Letting ourselves fall into the mindset that people are not available or interested in the Summer, as well as living out of past images of other Summers where we just held down the fort.(Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: External forum number 17 in Munising--population 5,000--brings local business and tourist businesses together for the first time.

Internal: Computer breakthrough comes from visit with hobbyists.

Contradiction: Keeping the loose ends from tying their own knots.(Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: More things are happening in this weather than ever before. The Central Youth Group, King Kennedy Estates and the Clark Metro Task Forces are breaking loose in caring engagement and practical action.

Internal: Preparation for a garden party including sending invitation, s phoning colleagues and a *practice* celebration at *Squire's Castle*.

Contradiction: Prioritizing the palms in light of unexpected demands.(Wk. 2)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: The centerpiece of the week is the regional push for Symposium and GRA attendance with 22 yeses and \$600 in scholarships raised. Day IIs are lively with the GRA development and recruitment phoning.

Internal: Principal Joshi (Gokhale College, Kolhapur, India) enlivens the house with brown ur colleguim, a report on village adoption by Sudbury, Mass. church after his visit there, and a report on his three-hour conversation with Joseph Campbell (*Myths to Live By*).

Contradiction: Pushing our imaginations to secure the necessary financial and troop support from outside the house to enable the demanding summer presence.Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Three from the region participate in Harrisburg

GWF which has a total of 65 participants.

Internal: The House participates in Three Rivers Arts Festival and joins the city in celebrating its creativity.

Contradiction: Finding it difficult to trust the structures. (Wk.13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Nunda Area Development committee moves into new orbit with members having risked and recruited new members. First visible miracles appear in the community. Bi-metro development week nets money and new colleagues and recontextualizes old Guardians and friends.

Internal: Marge Allen impacts House with news of summer prep and Phase I activities.

Contradiction: Functioning as a house amidst pressures from school, region, and Summer presentation as year ends. (Wk.11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: At second correctional system meeting excitement is caused by possibility of providing the spirit tools to enable burnt-out prison staff.

Internal: House visits Widen project—a real sign to mountain communities.

Contradiction: Feeling that we cannot make any decisions until someone tells us what to do. (Wk.11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Widen Community Association completes arrangements to lease two buildings from the coal company. A lease is obtained for 1.6 acres for a factory.

Internal: The Area Prior visits allows visioning and reflection to take place.

Contradiction: Dropping the baton as community picks up responsibility for its own life structures. (Wk 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

Contradiction: Articulating the readiness and the openings in the urban out of this year's work, focused on the urban. (Wk. 2).

External: Favorable review of last year's VISTA project finally completed. Glen McGee participate in great trip to Washington D.C. and Ivy City for Congressional calls.

Internal: House takes Jean and Stew Stowell to dinner at

Lakeside Inn and attends a hilarious local musical revue.

Contradiction: Precipitating a corporate focus on the transition events. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: A CYF presentation to Stratford Youth Advisory Board sets up possible forum series. Six confirmed Symposium Summer '80 participants make firm plans for the Chicago trek.

Internal: A week II Area retreat creates time and space for brooding on next year and the future, in preparation for Summer '80.

Contradiction: Discerning the timeline that effectively engages limited Summer troops in the myriad tasks. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Mary Coggeshall shows India and Sudtonggan slides to Albany Metro guardian colleagues. Three of the audience plan to attend the symposium in Chicago.

Internal: The House celebrates three wedding anniversaries on one week, two years for the Lindstroms, seven years for the Emericks, 21 years for the Roses.

Contradiction: Moving slowly on things that can get done quickly. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: South End participates in neighborhood block parties (one the St. Botolph street fair and the other the Canton Block Club festival). Stark's spice racks are marketed and the house engages in its immediate neighborhood.

Internal: The House sends a border off to a Cuba vacation and the remainder attend the week-end Area retreat, following a permiation blitz with all working.

Contradiction: Creating images that release summer creativity and dollars. (Wk. 1)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: A victorious week caps the quarter and starts with the Pontiac County Assembly (after 12 forums). An expansive development thrust is made into the region with help from Paris on breakopen visits to French Religious Orders. Visits to new movement contacts uncover Symposium candidates and scholarships.

Internal: Victoria Lin and Dominique join the House following the Academy and more from the area join the ranks of the employed in a strong self-support surge.

Contradiction: Discovering and working through blocks to Symposium participation from the region. (Wk. 2)

Contradiction: Covering self-support comprehensively. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Community Extension Module reveals new reality in midst of project as Documentation/Keystone Task Force trains core leadership to hold community visioning session. Toronto woodworking consultant enables new community corporateness relative to Lornecraft Woodworking.

Internal: Festive mood is created this week with New Brunswick Lobster Party with the core at the Hickeys and specially prepared Indian meal by Mr. Dethe at the House. House overflows with guests who stay in 5 additional community homes.

Contradiction: Enabling all community leadership to see possibility and challenge of their emerging role of total community caretakers. (Wk. 9)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: The first all-in-Spanish LENS is held with the Municipal Transit Institute of Caracas. This creates a practical vision for 33 top level management personnel.

Internal: LENS staff celebrate at a local Italian restaurant and receive work of five more possible LENSs in the next few months.

Contradiction: Lacking the maneuvers to coordinate surprise are breakopen with the need to participate in global consensus formation. (Wk. 1)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Intense focus completes Miserior proposal for marketing agency in time for framing maneuvers. Social programs are strengthened by eight government salaries. Nutrition team and sector teams are launched.

Internal: Ecclesiola reflection reveals wisdom gained in the year and models to share with the world. House children care for 200 rabbits.

Contradiction: Creating a weekly rhythm with the community's administrative team which includes the needed dynamics of training and consensus formation. (Wk. 9)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Four-week "May Forum Comunitario campaign" ends with total of 36 forums held in 32 municipalities with over 2,000 in attendance. Forums' high visibility enables them to be a tremendous authorization, as well as awakening maneuver, with Archbishops, corporate presidents, and state and federal government agency heads, all in attendance.

Internal: Whole house celebrates forum campaign completion with a Week II at the Rio Sheraton Hotel inkinded and an all-you-can-eat Brazilian churrasco dinner.

Contradiction: Seeing the next 10 weeks through August 15 as a beginning instead of an ending phase. (Wk. 12)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: Notice is received of the co-operative's registration, making Woburn Lawn legally eligible to receive and disburse funds. The Passport Director issues emergency certificates to

three Woburn Lawn residents so they can attend the GRA. The third CYF this quarter is held at Penlyne Castle after the youth club secretary walks to Woburn Lawn to request the forum.

Internal: The House holds a nightly debriefing session which allows maximum flexibility in troop use and keeps all of us up-to-date on all fronts.

Contradiction: Experiencing paralysis in the face of bureaucratic slowness in several key arenas. (Wk. 2)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: A sign of care is exhibited by the community through a workday involving 35 children. The results include a clean plaza and streets, the uniting of guilds to retrieve broken sector sign, and the acquisition of 622 trees for reforestation. Manuel Samayoa accompanies Margaret Griffin to the annual luncheon of the National Committee of Reconstruction—the key authorization for the project.

Internal: The week begins with the creation of intentionalized decor, new time design, and rationale for collegiums and lunch conversations and Ruth Landmann is sent out to the GRA, the community participating with marimaba cassettes.

Contradiction: Maintaining motivation in the midst of hard work so that leadership emerges and the job gets done. (Wk. 2)

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA—SANVINCENTE DE AZPITIA HDP

External: Human Development Training Module starts with opening feast. Bee classes begin in Lima with three residents in Azpitia. Inter American Development Bank asks for new proposal to replace last year's.

Internal: House and village reorients itself to House participants and hold HDTM.

Contradiction: Developing the organization which will ensure the victory of the biggest six weeks of Azpitia's history. (Wk. 9)

WEEK TWO

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports from Chicago that troops swell to 54 for July. The bottom line of \$76,000 for week 1 is made bringing the total to \$350,000 on target towards the 1.5 million. New images are broken loose for an on going travel pool which would open up a new constituency of givers. The contradiction lies in the arena of expanding the base of possibilities for major funding.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that preparation of facility and food services for the GRA goes into high gear in Chicago with the completion of the setup of 700 beds. Inkind wins include two live steers. Singapore Nexus reports large (almost \$23,000) debt retired in Australia, marking the end to 18 months pay-out. The Nexus finance reports are received in Chicago indicating the establishment of regular accounting and reporting patterns. The contradiction lies in the arena of monitoring closely the local systems, to spot issues before they become blocks.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operation Centrum reports from Chicago that the Global Symposium, working on pressure points, laid the foundation for a new global strategy. Finance packets are in process for Widen, Ivy City and Fifth City. From Brussels recruitment to the Guardians' Council—Europe continues with key colleagues helping. The contradiction lies in the arena of demanding competency in economic skills, in a time of economic collapse, so that the profound life experience of self-sufficiency is realized in local community.

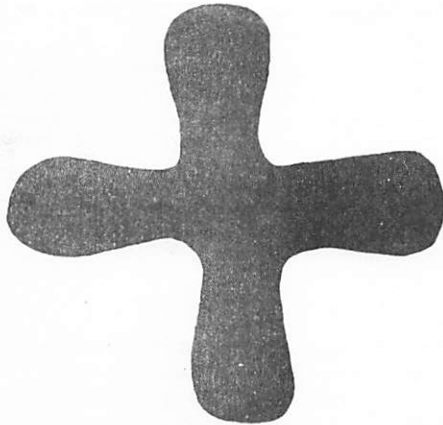
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Internal: David Cunningham spends Week II and brings first-hand information to Development appointment. House attends Orange Lodge Parade of Hundreds; the House Agricultural Guild reaps 8 radishes from first harvest in backyard.

Contradiction: Gearing up with winning plan for doing the Regions in Scotland during the "Quiet Time." (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Carnival Day, despite heavy rain and cold, was a crowd gatherer, including local M.P., leader of Borough Administration, county surveyor, county engineer and local borough councillor — this was the culmination of Carnival Week which was kicked off by the *Best Dressed Street* competition, children's bike contest, youth cabaret and other community events in the Parish Hall.

Contradiction: Finding the consensus while still in experimental state of quick set-up and event of Town Meeting campaign. (Wk. 3)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Addressograph-Multigraph prints, free of charge, 48-page report on the first 22 Community Forums in France. They also agreed to print 2000 workbooks and expedited inking of 50,000 sheets of paper. This fall ICA staff will be trained to run their machines, with unlimited access thereafter.

Internal: In a flurry of last minute preparation and tying up of loose ends, six from the House depart for GRA.

Contradiction: Keeping everything moving and not losing advantages during the "vacation" months. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Italy is *Gold!* The last of 18 regions has its *Riunione Cittadina* (Town Meeting). More than 500 Italians have participated. Ten young bilingual Italians joined a two-week task force to set up and lead RCs across the whole nation. Meanwhile Termine HDP gears up for June 30 with 100 invitations put in the mail. Spanish priest returns from Academy overjoyed.

Internal: Grand celebration in Rome as all treks return victorious. Reflection, dinner and dancing prepare for sendout of Continental Task Force to Belgium, France and England. Two Italians pack for Isle of Dogs, one for Chicago and a Terinese for Kreuzberg.

Contradiction: Enabling long march engagement and movement building in the midst of all the awakenment flurry. (Wk. 1)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: July celebration held with 500 present, officially opening the sewing industry, generator house and erecting Iron Man to symbolize community decision to accelerate the Project; bedsheet industry finishes 12,240 for month of June, 50% more than original estimate.

Internal: House celebrates end of quarter and sends out Kitneys and Taju to Chicago with a day at the beach, followed by dinner and dancing out.

Contradiction: Tightening up in order not to lose things through cracks in midst of intensified engagement and fewer troops. (Wk. 3)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Rounding up Phase I of summer travel arrangement

Internal: Impromptu celebration of three-member Nexus happens with whiskey sours, Indian curry and profound conversation on musical journey of Paul Simon.

Contradiction: Keeping focus on the futuristic and comprehensive while immediacy of travel and maintenance consumes Nexus. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Official notification of 230,000 BF (\$6,400 US) grant from Belgian Ministry of Dutch (Flemish) Culture for Qtr.III Dorpsdag (Community Forum) received in Flanders.

Internal: Collegium on history of religious orders intensifies understanding of the role of the religious in society.

Contradiction: Using inside data to unblock 2-year red tape time limit for new proposals. (Wk. 3)

2 RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: A Development trek to the far reaches of Holland (north and south) results in cash and metro colleague formulation.

Internal: Area budget projections finally in the black! The House experiments with summer evening collegiums. Greg Maxwell, RS-I grad from Salina, Kansas, bicycles through and stays for three days.

Contradiction: Discerning the concrete products of this reflective time that will enable quick fall victories. (Wk. 13)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: House participates in Kreuzberg Ost yearly evaluation and planning and is extremely impressed by the participation and enthusiasm of the Kreuzbergers and their astute picture of what has been accomplished in these two years.

Internal: House is down to one adult and two emerging generation; updated mailing list and straightened-out office are fantastic accomplishments after months of being on the road.

Contradiction: Maintaining missional momentum while juggling practical tasks involved in running House alone. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: July 1st preparations marked by in-kind successes, finishing touches on *treffpunkt*, as community excitement grows with birthday party in Senioren meeting and Hannah Muraya's Kawangware report to Guild.

Internal: House welcomes Hannah Muraya from Kawangware, as collegium reports explode globality in House.

Contradiction: Allowing the community to corporately *gun* the July 1st event and experience authentic leadership. (Wk. 2)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: The first quarterly Assembly explodes community's images with guild parade, to the Iron Man song with drums, and each guild in new bright uniforms. District Governor starts new maize mill, in yellow KHDP hat, amid cheers and dancing. Stake and guild reports dramatize quarter's victories. The Green Warriors win again (6—0) in their new green football jerseys presented at the Assembly.

Internal: Charles Mwansa Health Guild Leader received as Intern at House Church. Kingdom of God readings are events as they reveal the wonder of demonstration and deepen our actions. Quarter maneuvers are completed, and Vernon Haggwamuna and Regina Ramos are sent out to the GRA.

Contradiction: Unblocking the way to depth village leadership through methods training and extending structures. (Wk. 3)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Marathon workday (6 am — 12 midnight) finishes water pipe to tank site, under village generalship, and broad participation of village. Government requests that ten men be assigned to Project for training in methods.

Internal: June 30th committee meeting highlighted by decision to invite Bedoin tribes to race their camels against village camels.

Contradiction: Bird-dogging events to completion corporately. (Wk. 2)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: *Completion of the 24* celebrated with all-night dance marked by an address by a Kapini Bwana Kubwa, a fire swallowing act, performance of guest local band from Stake 5 and attendance of Assistant Chief Kibe. Despite rain, workday was best ever, with 300 participating all day.

Internal: The completion of the 24 was celebrated by receiving Mr. Lenga Lenga from Kapini, sending the Lamphears to the Isle of Dogs and turning ecclesiola into a hilarious affirmation of the past and launch into the future.

Contradiction: Using GRA participation as an opportunity for demonstration of self-reliance by staff. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Embu Village Meeting turns Eastern Province *gold* at district level, Mwanyani and Kalimoni Village Meetings turn Kivandini sub-location *gold* at the village level (all Kamweleni's sister villages); foundations dug for buildings granted by Canadians, and community makes constant use of first aid supplies provided by Provincial Hospital.

Internal: Area Council at Kawangware gives troops new life, while House does quarterly planning around the edges.

Contradiction: Changing the idea that Kamweleni is a failure because of recent departures by several staff for new assignments. (Wk. 3)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: Race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in its relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the replication school and the Centrum. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: The maneuvers for 25 projects are enabled as papaya seeds are delivered. The State Bank of India adopts 15 villages. The Polyester Khadi Industry is finalized.

Internal: Sent out Gordon Harper family to Chicago and Hanna Murray to Kreuzberg Ost. Celebrated the completed life of N. Gavai.

Contradiction: Anticipating how to move beyond the six weeks of the Campaign of the 25. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR—KENDUR HDP

External: Shramdan on bus stand tree ring involves 15 villagers in carrying Shabud Stones, inkind labor of two masons, inkind 100 cut stones and 15 rupees are raised for another 100 from local merchants; 34 people are recruited to take loans on cows and 15 recruited to raise papaya for popain.

Internal: New decor highlights the campaign of the 25. One more auxiliary becomes ICA and dons new blue shirt. Auxiliary toilet is completed with new doors attached.

Contradiction: Finding a way for villagers to come up with own resources for village needs and activities.(Wk.13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH—VAVIHARSH HDP

External: The local doctor from Auti visits Vaviharsh. Teams are sent out to Nasik to inkind materials for the preschool.

Internal: The first divisional project directors meeting of the Bombay Division is held in the divisional office at Vaviharsh. Colleagues arrive from Chikhale, Khambale and Kalambhir HDPs to plan divisional operations and end the meeting with writing a Bombay Division song.

Contradiction: Training and organizing Vaviharsh Village to host four villages visiting the HDP for the first time (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a diary scheme, poultry farm and general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON—TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satura, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared by each of six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Manila Mandal has successful GWF in Satura and village sends two women to the Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jaspur to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Galkwad and S. Galkwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI—UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI—SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of *Shivni Voice* is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, grids, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic look. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON—ANJANGAON HDP

External: Project is launched with 80 villagers present full-time. Preschool is immediately launched with two women vounteers teaching and 30 students participating. Two sugar factories donated 20 pipes for temporary bridge over Khara River, enabling a road to come to Anjangaon when it is built. Ex-villager now living in Baramati came to closing celebration and agreed to donate 2,000 rupees worth of poultry equipment for new poultry farm. One villager will donate rocks for the new dam. Document is cyclostyled in English and Marathi.

Internal: House begins Project battleplanning and decor for auxiliary. House sends out consult team and Jadhav to Wodegaon Consult, and begins to settle down to doing Nava Gram Prayas or socio-economic development at the local level.

Contradiction: Discerning when "antsiness" is running the Project and when there is really a need to move. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAKALI—TAKALI HDP

External: Loan applications for irrigation pumps for 50 farmers are taken along with applications for electrifying 25 homes. Electricity Board approves plan to provide street lighting.

Internal: Auxiliary House welcomes Brent Winstone for three-day monitoring visit. Project director and assistant director attend first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Establishing guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MALIWADGAON—MALIWADGAON HDP

External: Government sanctions bore well for drinking water purposes. Village donates 10,000 bricks for construction of public sanitation facilities and community buildings. Former landowner of the whole Gangapur Taluke donates his Maliwadgaon residence as auxiliary House and Community Center along with 50 acres for the demonstration farm.

Internal: Auxiliary sends project director, assistant director and three village leaders to attend the first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Training emerging community leaders in methods of guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Three members of Delhi House participate in Nava Gram Prayas as Vivian Paul is doing guiding work in Maliwada, Marie Paul is doing Development in Bombay, Röger is at Vaviharsh and Goethau is on six-week intensification trek. Six villagers from Maliwada come to Delhi to do research in carpet making, as arranged by Birlas.

Internal: Pre-monsoon showers bring down the temperature by several degrees and give new life and energy to the House. Marie Paul returns to begin the preschool and Global Language School.

Contradiction: Keeping the ship afloat in the midst of a raging storm. (Wk. 13)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Rope making machine ordered and first wool muffler is produced. Baby weighing highlights Health Guild Week, 1056 feet of new road completed, 18 new bulloch loans sanctioned, 10,500 cubic feet of morem is used to fill old village compost pits, eye camp examines 50 people, and application filed for electrification of Stake 1. Foundation dug for Women's Activity Center and hybrid jowar seeds distributed, with 10% of product to go to the mid-day meals program.

Internal: Jack Gilles returns with mountain of information from Maliwada, regarding the great campaign of the 25. All auxiliary move in to new House and celebrate with fine meal. Send out Balms, Dyhrs, Jack Gilles and Lance Ternasky to Project Directors' Meeting in Maliwada, with Dyhrs and Gilles to continue on to Europe.

Contradiction: Understanding project actuation in midst of radical staff turnover and keeping emerging monsoon from dictating models. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Jalawai Amba, first Iban intern sent to GRA Chicago and global assignment.

Internal: House celebrates fourth wedding anniversary of Westre family. Discontinuous ecclesiola plans initiated with night at the beach, complete with fried chicken and music.

Contradiction: Protecting project and program coordination when current demands of Management functions continually overshadow House. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SERUSUP HDP

External: First consignment of Landicrafts sold; pre-school building procured and transformed. New bus stop becomes community node, and major workday clears main road as impacting entrance. Decision of pre-school parents to pay for all cost of pre-school marks significance of life and death of leading young guildsman.

Internal: Week marked by feasting with clams and crabs at overnight beach celebration with community youth. House welcomes Julie and Erica Hays back with reports from Arc Planning Session.

Contradiction: Finding the implementaries that will sustain the Consult motivation. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI

External: Development team hits \$7500 second week in a row:

Internal: George and Ruthe Yost arrive from Kelapa Dua as Sherwood and Eunice Shankland are sent out to GRA.

Contradiction: Finding a way to channel current surge in community into project victories. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Eleven villagers begin machine class; Singer Company decides to assist in beginning a sewing industry in Kelapa Dua; a first in health care occurs as five pregnant women go to government health center for prenatal care; land is prepared for vegetable planting and nests are prepared for the laying hens; one of the village men begins teaching a class on how to make shallow wells and install hand pumps.

Internal: Three staff return from discontinuity and one returns after medical treatment; Truuske Nortier (a social worker in Holland who spent two weeks in the Isle of Dogs HDP) visits and brings reports of the Movement in Europe; staff holds clean-up party to prepare for Dutch Embassy visit.

Contradiction: Rethinking who the real shadows are and deciding on the next steps for their training. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian Pancasila (creed).

Internal: Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know, do, and be profound humanness. Celebrative meal out in Medan Fair restaurant marks common sense that we really know how we are going to do it felt by all.

Contradiction: Keeping pace going while nearly whole House is required for Sabah Consult. (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: House joins with Nam Wai auxiliary in Open Day celebration; One Day Wonder Development in Hong Kong nets \$2000 (US).

Internal: Oberg returns from Tokyo trek; Nexus hosts Joanne Slicker enroute from Maliwada to Hai Ou.

Contradiction: Maintaining finger on pulse of activity in zone in midst of pulling together year-end reports. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Four young adults sent out to Sudtonggan for Completion celebration, one sponsored by his company Duty Free Shoppers to the tune of HK\$1200, and 35 key villagers are present for send out and celebration planning with all ages and phases represented. Meeting and sendout established commitment for our own celebration July 2, 1978.

Internal: The House shifts into second phase of the quarter with a trip to local Chinese restaurant which renews vitality in preparation of rest of quarter. Student volunteer comes back to work in project 3 days a week after the completion of her school intern commitment.

Contradiction: Speeding up the tortoise pace of private and public in relation to the pace of competition. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Newly initiated 4H Club will not be blocked and finds new location to prepare for pig raising project. Village beautification has caught on and villagers now bring new plants for all the planters and assist in the planting and care.

Internal: Weekly collegium of Chinese lessons enables more spontaneous relations with the village.

Contradiction: Learning patience while the village follows through on the tasks constantly slowed down by red tape. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: S.C. Johnson donates \$3,000 and 5 other companies donate \$700. Inkind playground equipment from Goodyear and pre-school uniform material from Ramie Textiles is shipped free to Davao for the Langub HDP.

Internal: Dr. Roger Williams from Canberra visits on way back from Surusup consult and decides to visit Sudtonggan. Faithful remnant of three engage in house management and self-support with 10 new English students, bringing projected income to \$1,000 per month.

Contradiction: Holding the symbolic life of the Order when self-support necessitates 2 people leaving the house at 6:45 A.M. and returning at 9:00 P.M. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Published models for Hai Ou villagers' Philippine trip, including budget and task/itinerary chart; four people from Taiwan planning to attend Hokkaido ITI.

Internal: Metro colleagues join House in celebrating USA Independence Day; Joanne Slicker reports on India.

Contradiction: Locating new facility for the House which holds the relevant values. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGANN HDP

External: Received order for 14,000 rocks, with contract for another 9,000 pieces to bring profit of P5,000 to HDP.

Internal: House celebrates two wedding anniversaries and two birthdays in one week. Dr. Roger Williams reports on Serusup and Sabah.

Contradiction: Finishing what you have not finished, after you've "finished". (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Week begins with two days of imaginal teachers day care training; leadership training with every *sitio* es Tito De laSerna from Cebu and celebrates the return of Judy Albers from Manila. House sends out Geni, Leroy and Micah Philbrook to GRA Chicago. House receives Elsa Languido as a fellow.

Contradiction: Engaging a broader portion of the total community. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: House mails grassroots letters and one year report of Oyubari H.D.P. to 200 supporters.

Internal: House receives Judy Hickey back from 4 weeks of study and travel in US and sends Carl Hickey out to Global Priors' Council, Chicago.

Contradiction: Focusing on summer planning while energy is diverted toward housekeeping matters. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Chicken farm manager is key issue of late night meeting of Board of Directors of Village Treasury. Pre-school Health Clinic examines early education care; Kwangyung II Bulletin begins its second year of publication; another installment is paid toward Training Center boiler.

Internal: HDP Quarter Celebration is combined with End-of-Year Celebration. Proper water pressure restored to village, reactivating Training Center showers. Training Center garden is weeded, with radishes and squash planted. Quarter I planning is begun.

Contradiction: Finding the one villager who will completely involve himself in a village industry. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Two village workdays build cement block forms, line drainage ditch with large rocks, clear land for piggery foundation, and complete village store inventory. In Seoul, Consult Document in Korean is given to printer, and Development calls continue. Village buys chairs for community hall with funds from the village treasury.

Internal: House welcomes Art Rowe family enroute from Hong Kong Nexus to GRA.

Contradiction: Fighting five crucial battles on widely scattered terrain with one platoon. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Maureen Jenkins goes to Hiroshima with new woman colleague, Miss Kawasaki, who was at Oyubari HDP this spring and another Global Womens Forum is held.

Internal: House picks up its roots and moves to next station down the line--with a little help from our friends.

Contradiction: Getting ourselves back in gear when the motor's sputtering from the heat. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Colleagues and staff corporately plan the time-design for the Town Meeting Training event. GWF is impacted by their own reflections on the needs for a global sisterhood.

Internal: Yamaoka family agrees to Osaka House moving into their father's home; only 20 minutes from present House.

Contradiction: Engaging colleagues which enables the ongoing mission. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Development thrust continues with 38,000 Yen in hand and inkind tapes from Sony; ITI letters of invitation are sent and follow-up begins so decision for holding ITI can be made; meeting with City of Toyomaki set up for August regarding initiation of work project, while Week II focuses on summer program construct with two people attending ACCESS retreat.

Internal: Fourth of July party, complete with hamburgers, french fries, strawberry shortcake and fireworks is held, while summer brings hottest weather in Oyubari in 30 years; Eija Karikoski is sent out at House Church to Finland for the summer, and collection of wood supply for winter begins.

Contradiction: Pulling sketchy ideas of summer, including GRA participants and assignments from Area, into final form.

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Open House in the new facility demonstrates seriousness of Guardians as they openly discuss Oombulgurri situation and make creative suggestions.

Internal: Send out GRA participants and welcome Barry Oakley back from HDTs.

Contradiction: Turning interest and commitments into cash. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Colleague gives \$500, while Local Warriors loan \$90 to keep circuits on the road; local parish holds committee meeting at House to consider significant donation.

Internal: House spends week in-kind painting and brushes, ending with painting the hallway and stairs.

Contradiction: Building the thrust of the Global Campaigns to broaden and intensify the State Campaign. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Key people visit for Murrin Bridge Consult.

Internal: David is sent on Area Development assignment.

Contradiction: Maintaining regional responsibility as real demands shift. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI—OMBULGURRI HDP

External: School opens with arrival of Elaine Telford.

Internal: Linda Zahrt returns from visit to Perth. Joanne Baker returns from Adelaide.

Contradiction: Creating a plan for the next year to move Oombulgurri toward economic self-sufficiency. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Forty-five people attend first Guardians dinner in Adelaide, highlighted with before and after pictures of Kelapa Dua being shown by John Murchland.

Internal: Resurgence of Guardians results in renewed House incentive to restyle House space, starting with the lounge; post meetings bring creative of new guns to Management arenas.

Contradiction: Finding creative approaches to ICA solvency.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Thirty at Guardians dinner catalyze transportation for Murrin Bridge HDP; donation of a Combi-Van (and registration fee) puts auxiliary on road to car for satellite communities; Commissioner for Probate Duty gives green light for Victoria Community Forums.

Internal: Mark Mitchell and Olive Evans arrive to take up posting on Murrin Bridge auxiliary; host Mike Vosler and Billy Blight from Murrin Bridge to do Development; Gabrielle and Roberta Evans return from Oombulgurri and are re-instated in school.

Contradiction: Taking crucial steps to grasp the future in the face of unaccustomed certainty. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA—SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Serusup Consult finished and both Areas hold Councils; Sydney and Singapore for the quarter as key political contacts are made across a broad spectrum.

Internal: Host Development PSU and hear great reports as Garnet and Liz Banks return from Singapore and George Holcombe from HDS.

Contradiction: Discerning the mood of the nation to create the next steps in authorization and development in order to engage new troops. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Development push with visit to Utah Foundation who promise funding for Queensland this year; John Jago, Regional Guardian, decides to be ongoing member of Development team and calls on President of Brisbane Rotary Club.

Internal: Mark Green decides to sojourn after working with the CMAs; and House celebrates Queensland CUP Maneuver by sending the youth dancing while the adults see *Saturday Night Fever*.

Contradiction: Standing between maneuvers and moving it.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Community signals its decision to contribute to its future through community fund payments; two community members and two Auxiliary travel to Canberra for weekend PSU; many visitors stop by to witness Auxiliary House transformation.

Internal: Interior of the new Auxiliary House (formerly the most run down building in the village) is completely transformed, and the Big Move is accomplished.

Contradiction: Enabling resource flow to match community momentum. (Wk. 3)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: Community works for a week in preparation for celebration on Saturday night, with over 200 Showplace residents feasting and dancing to honor expansion of project this year.

Internal: Return to full-strength with seven adults, after a quarter with only four in as circuits are completed in Region.

Contradiction: Shaping the next sixty days, when the next twelve months maneuvers are waiting in the wings. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: ITI grad core group meets to workshop site selection model for Western Samoa HDP second round and agrees to do village visitations.

Internal: Cleaning, baking and preparing House for Metro Cadre Meeting, HDP Core Workshop and GCF training intensifies engagement.

Contradiction: Enabling Western Samoan colleagues to take responsibility for the mission. (Wk. 3)

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Six Guardians travel to Richgrove to participate in pre-consult planning on the sewer system, ending with the completed application. Consultant recruitment continues and inked blitz nets flour, fish, beans, fruits and an electrical junction box.

Internal: House welcomes back Barbara and Bob Prather from three months of working with Town Meeting: Iowa, the April Guardian's Consult, and a visit to Inyan Wakagapi.

Contradiction: Using the Consult as the primary tool to spark engagement. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: First community meeting in Richgrove following the decision to be the California Human Development Project attended by 85 local residents, culminates in 50 more homes being visited on Saturday, the first block meeting with 25 attending, the commitment of a Consult facility, and distribution of the first *Richgrove Voice* to all homes.

Internal: Colleagues from San Francisco and Los Angeles Regions, including a small army from the Fresno Metro Cadre, participate in the first community assembly and the "Casa a Casa" visits, welcoming the chance to utilize their bilingual abilities.

Contradiction: Actualizing California's potential in terms of consultant recruitment. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: July 3rd and 4th Calispel Valley Day festivities explode community spirit with over 400 attending the dance that culminated a day of chicken dinner, box social, tug-of-war, and parade.

Internal: Wike Hall is blitzed, resulting in painted interior, and operable kitchen and bathrooms.

Contradiction: Expanding participation in doing the tactics in the midst of new excitement about summer community events. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Lockman family returns from weekend of work and celebration in Cusick; Rev. Warren Crain visits Cusick for the first of three work projects demonstrating regional support for HDP.

Internal: House move to summer quarters is completed just in time to welcome first guest from England.

Contradiction: Discerning necessary deeds to be done before departure for Council. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Six months of planning for the California HDP culminates in active involvement of surprising number of new and old colleagues from Los Angeles Region in HDP set-up and consultation alongside Richgrove citizens.

Internal: Bob Vance reports on Richgrove, grounding the story, the reality and commitment to HDPs.

Contradiction: Using Richgrove to advantage as a visible demonstration to increase the momentum and focus the Los Angeles region. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Pre-Consult Program Research Team gathers plethora of literature and suggestions.

Internal: Gala feast with metro cadre to send out four to GRA.

Contradiction: Completing mop up tactics from Spring Quarter that necessary, yet impinge on fresh imagination required for new quarter. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Long-distance Consult prep becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food, household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with ordering, cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Attendance at Low Income conference at State Capitol shows grassroots decision in caring for local people.

Internal: Audry Wagner attends Conference and the two youth have fantastic weekend capped off by House Church with their Arizona HDP requires.

Contradiction: Preparing for the summer. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Petition to divide old community gym for expanded shopping center arrives and is being installed; full-time truck farm supervisor is hired; and \$4400 arrives the same day from various developed income sources.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates 4th of July week with pecan pie from Texas and Cannon Ball rhubarb meringue pie.

Contradiction: In the midst of the community beginning to discover what it really means to be self-sufficient, continuing the push on the community not to become dependent upon the auxiliary staff. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Thursday slide report by the Benedicts and Kyes on the Richgrove HDP Consult reminds us of the need for corporateness in effective action. Send out the Benedicts, Armando Divas and Nancy Carlson to Guatemala Consult.

Internal: *Where two or more are gathered in my name* there is care for the region going on, is theme for House Church.

Contradiction: Keeping involvement of metro active during July and August. (Wk. 1)

EDMONTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: Initiated five week development blitz with \$475 in hand and \$3750 working which opens up new networks among architects and accountants, topped off with May 17th advocates event with representatives of six nations and public and private sector.

Internal: Week II is a round of celebrations as Timothy Wright is sent out at House Church to US 12 consult, initiating his "sabbatical" year of engagement, and house celebrates maneuver and Robert Tobin's birthday with inkind chicken in the park.

Contradiction: While standing present to the global priorities spinning development and saturation and the area task into one operation to ensure total victory. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: New collegiality is birthed through GWF as women of widely diverse experience struggle to articulate ways of engaging in practical care for the world.

Internal: Colleagues from Vogar, Edmonton, Anchorage, and Vancouver celebrate the expenditure of weeks' work with inkind feast at Keg 'n Cleaver Restaurant following GWF.

Contradiction: Using momentum of GWF happening to move colleagues into a summer of engagement. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Twenty visits in one week reveal the exciting possibilities of a truly cultural fiesta flare for the Fairview Ethnic Festival, with Chicano and South American groups present and enthusiastic support-building among Advisory Board members at the prospect of an Alaskan HDP.

Internal: Fishing trip nets no fish, but strengthens colleague presence in the Region.

Contradiction: Achieving the signality in tactical events that will assure enthusiastic continuation of tasks in the absence of House staff. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Watson Community Forum completes eight in Humboldt district and District Assembly uncovers new movement colleagues.

Internal: House celebrates completion of Saturation Experiment with movies and hamburgers.

Contradiction: Tying up all loose ends in time to participate in Summer Program. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: The one year report brochures roll off the press, as the Vogar Products plan and funding proposal is completed for next year, and the Young Canada Works crew cleans up the ditches.

Internal: A sigh of "at last" escapes, as the new entrance storage shed is built onto the House, a new washing machine arrives, and 200 feet of hose simplifies the water system.

Contradiction: Creating the revolutionary image that will ensure the set up of Vogar Woodworks. (Wk. 3)

HOUSTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: Old and new colleagues gather for dinner at House to hear reports and reflect on recent Consults; Ann and Dick Whanger show slides from Widen, Steve Rhea shows snapshots from Woburn Lawn, and several report on Asherton.

Contradiction: Finding effective ways to build a strong network of colleagues. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Indianhoma Consult began with a tremendous Opening Feast on Sunday evening, June 24 with 300 local citizens present. The community was graced with the presence of two state Senators, the State Representative for the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and leading businessmen from the county and state.

Internal: Over 100 people were present at the Closing Banquet after completing the Saturday Miracle Day. Evening celebration with barbeque and dancing concluded the Consult Week.

Contradiction: Moving ahead rapidly with designed maneuvers in the midst of overwhelming possibility on our hands. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Implementaries Workshop and quarter battleplan are completed; incredible workday held with 32 community youth working with House to paint Community Center and Health Clinic.

Internal: House plumbing finished; Liz Ann Slotter arrives for 3-week stay.

Contradiction: Ordering House space is seen as distraction from the Project. (Wk 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Three USA 12 slide show presentations given and half of additional consultants confirmed with money. Plans for GWF are privileged with visit to Decorator Show House to plan the use of space.

Internal: House sends out Slicker Family to Indianhoma HDP and celebrates new House configuration with Fiesta at Panchos.

Contradiction: Putting together the new configuration of forces to complete the myriad of tasks. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Texas Town Meeting Summary Report is inked and distributed to 1800 people across the State. Charlotte Graham decides to do anthropology research in Indianhoma. One hundred thank you letters are sent to *inkind contributors* for Texas TM.

Internal: Metro and House collate 2,000 TM: Texas Reports, topped off with a midnight enchilada dinner.

Contradiction: Recruiting for GRA '78 when all efforts have been placed on nearby consults. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA-DELTA PACE HDP

External: Seventy-four youth and adult counselors from churches in Indiana and Texas joined the Pace Youth Service Corps in the *Week of Miracles*. Major transformations happened, a few of which are 13 houses painted, hedges renewed, and residents' name signs up. Completed restaurant patio and dining area while the laundromat is renovated and awaits new machines. Two thousand *inkind Comprehensive Plan Brochures* arrive.

Internal: Guests Laura Ennis, Mark Porter and Carole Payne join the Youth Work Camp for the week. Week II was a time of celebration with swimming and shish-ka-bobs.

Contradiction: Inventing the plan that will continue the large numbers of community participation and complete the work begun during the Youth Work Camp. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Region is represented by three colleagues at Asherton Consult, who bring home reports of victorious *inkind* maneuvers, enthusiastic community involvement, and tremendous growth potential.

Internal: An almost empty House becomes wayside inn for a Guardian's son from Boston, a Korean minister trekking around USA, and a Pace couple on discontinuity.

Contradiction: Creating the symbols and rituals that will daily pronounce the Word, when there is no other person to pronounce it. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Tennessee is completed in actuality with Riverside Community in 41-year-old country store, complete with hand-cut bologna sandwiches and chewing tobacco.

Internal: Memphis his firemen's strike (with 301 fires in 3 days) keeps city and House awake, alert and aware of the interdependence of the urban; Tennessee Report completed and ready to take to Xerox for donated printing.

Contradiction: Continuing the everyday preparation for the needs for the next campaign. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Five Georgian colleagues serve as consultants to the Gibson HDP. *In-kind* effort nets 125 pounds of peanut butter and five cases of pickles.

Internal: Assignment of all troops to locations outside of Atlanta.

Contradiction: Mobilizing the Movement not involved first-hand in the Gibson Project. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Completed document allows troops to focus on first visible community and stake impact since Consult, producing workday which constructs benches for park, builds brick patio, community bulletin board, confirms land offer for children's park — topped off with distribution of Gibson's first *Voice*.

Internal: Consult document completion creates a mad dash to airport, sending out all but five auxiliary who remain to reclaim space and time design, topped off with a fine meal at Stanton's Fish Camp.

Contradiction: Re-creating the community's time design to build on present momentum and not sink Project into Gibson's old story and structures. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Xerox prints Florida Summary Report free and United Telephone sends grant of \$300.

Internal: Church gives two weeks paid so staff can go to Gibson Consult.

Contradiction: Knowing what to do and doing it now to be ready for late August. (Wk. 12)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO—NEXUS

External: Priors arrive to participate in the global Priors Council. The opening feast begins the Council with an Indian meal and an opening address presented by a member of the Panchayat.

Internal: Decor becomes even more powerful after extra attention during the 3 day period between GRA and Council. The second floor has become a place of collegiality and storytelling as people linger after evening sessions are over.

Contradiction: Planning for August while making sure that Council comes off in style. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Saheed (Chicago Economic Development Organization) goes to Mill Shoals on behalf of the industry work. Three new mini-zones are approved by the City of Chicago.

Internal: The House receives summer preparations as new kitchen door is put up.

Contradiction: Remembering the GRA is the Movement's first priority, while secondary items are handled. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Letters from towns in response to the question, "What happened after your town meeting?" report that newsletters, grant requests, cleanup days, more town meetings, joining the PRIDE (state community development program), and plans for a festival are in the works.

Internal: Office decor updated with document covers from each Kansas Town Meeting and six-color timeline.

Contradiction: Waiting until the Summer Program answers all of the questions. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Local history night generates enthusiasm for Project. Des Moines Register, Iowa's only state-wide newspaper, spends full day taking pictures and talking to people for a "before" story. They will also cover the Consult and follow up on the Project. VISTA contracts arrive for signature.

Internal: John McAdam, Karen Kivimaki and Asher Ertel arrive to bring auxiliary to full strength. Regional work weekend with 20 colleagues transform hotel into residences and offices.

Contradiction: Preparing 800 people for the coming journey into the new world. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Lorimor Human Development Consult has everyone turned on and going full steam—metro colleagues to put finishing touches on auxiliary accommodations.

Internal: House and Metro celebrate the cluster's school year's end with dinner at Stevenson's Apple Farm.

Contradiction: Maintaining self-support push while sustaining Lorimor Consult dynamic. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: As fourth LENS Course ends for the Department of Natural Resources, the largest state department and the third largest landowner in the U.S., 150 staff will have participated in four such courses, for the purpose of learning how to use citizen participation as part of the Department's work and planning.

Internal: House hears report on the four LENS courses from veteran Loudermilk and reflects on the deep necessity to use LENS and other tools to include the established structures around the upcoming HDP town of Kinney, in the creation of the project so that in two years the town will have established the new links with the world that will enable it to continue.

Contradiction: Creating and using the imaginal charts and working decor which hold the accountability and urgency of the task at hand. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: GWF at Babler State Park with 34 women around the table representing St. Louis, East St. Louis, Springfield, Illinois, Kansas City, Missouri and Mill Shoals, Illinois, was a significant bi-state event as all phases were present and strong possibilities for future engagement of women were evident.

Internal: Wrap-up of the GWF day with returning tables to the church, visiting Souard Market for donations of produce for HDP Consult, returning the borrowed truck, and inking celebration supper and largest mug of beer ever seen, reveals "the wonder of total engagement."

Contradiction: Enabling Mill Shoals HDP. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA-MILL SHOALS HDP

External: In the midst of the completion of the document, auxiliary and global consult team celebrate the next two years in Mill Shoals with a backyard barbeque.

Internal: Elders' bus trip to Carmi for lunch and to see nutrition center in operation points toward a similar lunch program here this quarter.

Contradiction: Creating forms of motivity for the long march projects. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Kinney HDP moves into high gear as second newsletter comes out; 20 show up for pre-stake meeting, and first workday has people out working in every stake before auxiliary arrive.

Internal: Town Councilman's family invites auxiliary out on their boat after workday; waterskiing behind 150 hp engine is new experience of contingency.

Contradiction: Getting the rest of Kinney out of their living rooms. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: The International Lions Convention in Tokyo in June excites colleagues with possibilities of visiting both the convention and HDP's along the way.

Internal: House experiences first week of new House location in the middle of the city by taking mini-tours of area.

Contradiction: Wetting peoples' appetites for far away places while also exciting them about the possibilities of participating in HDP's right here at home. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: The House and metro celebrate and participate in US 12 by sending consultants, enablement forces, a patron and actuation forces to Mill Shoals HDP. Two GWF and six Town Meetings are set up for next fall.

Internal: House hosts David and Jackie Speicher's parents and spins tales of US 12 and TM: Indiana. Breakfast out to celebrate the very last county going gold, and the rest of us take off for Mill Shoals and GRA.

Contradiction: Standing before both the 100 open doors in Indiana and the global wisdom of GRA '78. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Great Kentucky Cotillion is finished in grand style—all 120 counties are GOLDEN.

Internal: Cotillion celebration with colleagues, with sendout of Jim Armour to the Widen Consult and Shirley St. John to the Alabama Campaign.

Contradiction: Gathering all loose ends in order to focus on the summer. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Held training event for Town Meetings in urban saturation community, involving Michigan Bell community relations staff as volunteer workshop leaders; set up Town Meeting in Michigan's last county for June 8; hosted GWF, CYF, and LENS teams to set up forums as part of saturation.

Internal: Colleague Lois Martin brings acquaintance Gavle Thompson to house, who is interested in doing something with her life. Made call to London to ask to spend at least a year in HDP there or Wales.

Contradiction: Playing the trump we have. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: The East End Neighborhood House Training Meeting is highly successful in weaning new Town Meeting grads from ICA leadership to newly awakened community leadership.

Internal: The House installs a revolving door and sends out Lois Reeves and colleague Mike Tippet to Brazil Consult and receives Chris Copley, Mary Poole and Genevieve Morrill on stopoffs along with Jane Booher and Addie Batica on Development.

Contradiction: Maintaining steady beat in midst of summer comings and goings. (Wk. 7)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Quarter I Maneuver writing begins the eventfulness of quarter; Loisaída (Lower East Side) decides to participate in Starks workday.

Internal: Embracing the urban begins with a series of celebrations with the theme *Meeting New York City*. July 4th celebration includes seeing Picasso's *Guernica* at Museum of Modern Art, a trip to Chinatown and spectacular fireworks over the Hudson River.

Contradiction: Unfocused action due to unclaimed victories. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Metro participates in the dynamic of GRA: reports and research.

Internal: Area data gathering reminds us of care and accountability.

Contradiction: Articulating activity of programs as profound humanness so that formulated region sees itself filling all GSF roles. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: President of Ithaca — New York's Chapter of the Federation of the Blind, expresses desire to have a Town Meeting exclusively for the blind and will ensure facility and attendance.

Internal: Update letter is sent to key Metro colleagues announcing past victories and invitation to participate in the Area Council in New York City; send out David Hutcheons for two-year stay as staff member in Gibson HDP.

Contradiction: Defining the role of the Religious House. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Two more Town Meetings are set for Isle of Wight county saturation.

Internal: House celebrates with Ivy City at House Church.

Contradiction: Quickly firming up commitments that have been made and expanding the GSF base. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON—IVY CITY HDP

External: Quarter I launched with Development Strategy Meeting with metro colleagues, community residents and consultants present, as new directions are laid out.

Internal: House symbolizes shift to Quarter I with redesign of Day II to allow maximum time for stake visitation and being out in the streets as summer signals door-step gatherings all over the community.

Contradiction: Moving swiftly and deliberately on local framing, without destroying the delicate balance that is always present. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: The Document arrives and stakes meet to discuss it and arrange for its distribution; residents can be seen reading the Document on their front porches.

Internal: Daily Office is moved into an adequate, newly roofed room just in time to meet need for humble prayer as rough water is encountered and safely navigated.

Contradiction: Affirming contradictions as doorways to the future, while wildly spreading rumors demonstrate reality of unconsented polity structure. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Development Task Force visits donor prospects and the person who chaired the editing of the Pennsylvania Foundation Directory. July picnic in New Jersey claims a new couple to Guardian roles.

Internal: Quarter Celebration is highlighted by an Egyptian meal prepared by Nabil Migalli from Beni Suef (and El Bayad), followed by a viewing of "Madame Rosa", Academy Award winner of the best foreign film.

Contradiction: Increasing the Development Task Force's momentum for naming and setting appointments with development prospects. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: New core which has sprung to life in Northern New Jersey sends three people to July maneuver writing session, two to Metro Night, and two to GRA.

Internal: July 4th allows House to *Meet the Big Apple* with Shakespeare in the Park, and fireworks coordinated to music on WNBC.

Contradiction: Focusing action to unclaimed victories. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Representatives from State University and National Guard Engineers visit to offer assistance; paper in-kind for document after printing had begun, while 30 youth initiate a recreation/service program called Starks' Trekkers.

Internal: Stowels are sent out for discontinuity and return to find many friends, old and new, gathered with Area Prior to celebrate 40th wedding anniversary.

Contradiction: Projecting meeting rhythms clearly to enable enlistment of wider participation. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Weekly "Campaign Night" continues to re-engage colleagues, and enable effective reflection on vocation and the new year's missional priorities.

Internal: House celebrates the week and the new quarter by seeing a movie Saturday night.

Contradiction: Planning for the fall while facing pre-Council ambiguity. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER — CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Phase II planning session with seven local participants identifies seven arenas of activities, and results in decision to operate in task forces.

Internal: Museum trip and picnic celebrates work weekend with Philadelphia House and Rochester colleagues.

Contradiction: Shifting focus of activity from immediacies to long-range, solid implementation. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: GSF celebrates a great 4th of July with Starks and decides to meet twice *mor* during the summer to get out newsletters and marketing letters for fall impact courses.

Internal: Inspired by HDP, Boston holds Beautification Day to clear backyard, pull weeds in the mini-park next door, and polish the House plaque.

Contradiction: Creating realistic strategy for saturation in '78-'79. (Wk. 3)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Final round-up and send-out of House and colleagues to summer program; two left in the House prepare research data for the Assembly.

Internal: Wedding of Stannard and Francis impacts Order and colleagues as four from Region Montreal travel to Lorne; community wedding is a fine signal event of June 30th completion celebration.

Contradiction: Brooding effectively over missional thrusts for next year while one step removed from Summer Research Assembly. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Area team successfully yellows five districts in two-week Northern Ontario GCF maneuver.

Internal: Three House members are dispersed for area self-support maneuver. Half of house is in Ottawa, half is in Detroit.

Contradiction: Clarifying the image of Toronto House relocation strategy. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Visits to three senators this week, including Senator Molson.

Internal: Rev. David Bugler comes to help put consultations task force on the road; closing celebration of year sends out youth to camp, farm and Chicago, leaving remnant to proceed with details of moving into summer program configurations.

Contradiction: Holding futuric vision for House in midst of everything seeming to draw to a close. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Newly formed task team beginning work on New Day Canada Assembly for fall, symbolized the victory in hand relative to 12 visible miracles in process for June 30 global celebration.

Internal: Intensification of Project symbolized by the arrival and departure of troops. Creation of a guardian of the symbolic for each week and completing plans for the task forces for the summer.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between optimizing accomplishments for the summer and giving attention to leadership training and formation. (Wk. 1)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Long-awaited week of CHA, Cano Negro Hacia Adelante, arrives including scavenger hunt, parades, Community Assembly, workdays and Health Agricultural Fair in which seven agencies participate. Inkind nets new Gestetner, refrigerator, 500 reams of paper, kitchen supplies and whole cow for HDTS. Faculty works on HDTS adaptation. Foro Comunitario in Maracaibo for Rotary youth is a great success.

Internal: Staff sends out Paul Calhoun to the Academy and celebrates with village the ending of the week of CHA.

Contradiction: Expanding funding base for HDTS and Continental expansion. (Wk. 2)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: First guild meetings create symbols and slogans for each guild. Work Day overflows into 2 days producing 30 benches, 15 tables, a huge 2 meter square Welcome Sign, beautification of the health clinic with flower pots made from light bulbs, latrines for auxiliary housing, and delicious homemade Chilean bread. The first Santiago guardians meeting is launched. Key guardian, Exequiel Rivas, inkind composer for document and translation of document is completed.

Internal: Auxiliary moves into village dividing itself between an abandoned house and the local soccer team's club house until permanent housing is built.

Contradiction: Building the link between the village and external resources. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAMP NAVA GRAM PRAYAS

External: Visits by guests indicate camp's efforts in village health and living environment have become a part of camp life

Internal: Village Industry and Commerce nodules culminate in Friday's village market in which everyone experiences the economic, political, and cultural dimensions of the market.

Contradiction: Experiencing camp as a spirit journey when so many day are crammed with abundance (Wk. 3)

WEEK THREE

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Brussels reports that nurturing of women's groups in Berlin yields 500-DM contribution from one women. Milan corporation networks show interest in funding Provincial Campaign in Italy. The year end recapitulation shows that over \$200,000 has been raised in Hong Kong, with Area Hong Kong more than doubling its developed income for the year. Hong Kong reports that intensified results in Development came about through the priority which the Area Councils gave the task. The contradiction lies in the arena of maintaining local initiative and finding ways for development troops to act as a team in the midst of areal dispersion.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Priors Council in Chicago continues the task of reflection on the insights and learnings of the past year. Council names the victories in Global Social Demonstration and Global Community Forum. Hong Kong reports that "doing it" is the key to breaking the image of "it can't be done here." The contradiction is in the arena of allowing front line data to be seen as "victories" and becoming part of the global momentum for the year ahead.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Brussels sends continental troops to the United Kingdom counties campaign, filling out its three-ring circus for next month. Tracking map of the UK Campaign is prepared as a symbol and monitoring tool. Hong Kong reports that young adults from permeator's English class participate in Nam Wai workdays and "Open Day" celebration. Breakthroughs occur in the arena of acting out of the stance that every human being is a potential troop, with invitation and engagement the key to actuating that potential. The contradiction is in the arena of relating the edge of the New Reality to everyday tasks involving us.

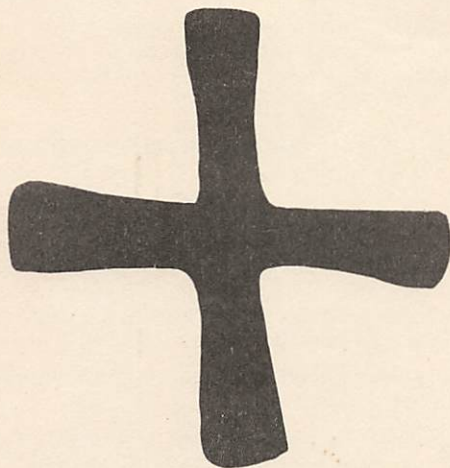
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Brussels celebrates the release of 550,000-BF (\$17,000) in matching funds for use for Maharashtra. A fourth Ibdia visa is secured to return American staff to India. Hong Kong creates Cash Voucher forms that serve both as a check request form and a specific individual logging of expenditures by the recipient receiving the check. Petty cash back up receipts for the Hong Kong ICA books are organized for the first time in six months. The contradiction is maintaining cash flow and all management systems until the return of troops from the summer program.

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: A fine representation at the GRA is assured as final phase of funding goes into operation.

Internal: The new house begins to take shape as roofers stop the leaking, plumbing becomes operational, broken windows are replaced and lighting installed in every room.

Contradiction: Struggling to define the external mission with a small House in the midst of establishing the new facility and all that that entails. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Follow-up meetings with colleagues in the Glasgow and Manchester Regions plan leadership training events with a local congregation in Coatbridge, Glasgow and an emerging LENS strategy in Leeds Metro, Manchester.

Internal: The House takes Saturday night to celebrate the fact that keeping the systems going with half the troops is a full time job.

Contradiction: Scheduling events for the summer quarter when most everyone seems to be on holiday. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAIRGWAITH HDP:

External: Area Youth Cluster catalyzes planning by Tairgwaith Youth Council to raise funds for community building. Phone blitz sets ten appointments with Religious Orders for week 11 in five metros.

Internal: House doubles in size temporarily with influx of youth and one EG from London during school holidays.

Contradiction: Catalyzing implementation by local groups. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Kathren Taylor visits the House on the way to the GRA. She goes by Brussels Nexus and visits U.S. Embassies.

Internal: Participation in new area House relocation

"Then I said to them, 'You see our wretched plight. Jerusalem lies in ruins, its gates destroyed by fire. Come, let us rebuild the wall of Jerusalem and be rid of the reproach.' I told them how the gracious hand of my God had been upon me and also what the king had said to me. They replied, 'Let us start the rebuilding.' demonstrates that it is possible to find House and be living in it within three weeks.

Contradiction: Maintaining a Manchester identity in midst of operating out of the London House. (Wk. 4)

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: An April contact and May correspondence leads to a June demonstration meeting in Cretas (province of Teruel) with the possibility of a set in 17 villages within one hour's drive of one another. A demonstration meeting in Valdaracet outside Madrid leads to the possibility of the first TM in Bishop Iniesta's vicarate.

Internal: Six great Madrid colleagues say yes to being on the ICA Advisory Board and Dr. Thomas Goslin leads House Church and hears exciting reports of the global work.

Contradiction: Finding a rural village near Madrid as a future project where a project answers its contradiction. (Wk. 3)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: A one day planning session with Credit Agricole on the future of rural France has colleagues from all six regions of Area Paris represented around the table and is a grand success.

Internal: A feast of endings celebrates the Credit Agricole seminar and sends the Area out to Quarter I assignments.

Contradiction: Radicalizing the understanding of being assigned. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Documentation workshop using all the TM data is held. Internal: The House celebrates with a movie on T.V., popcorn and lemon pie while hosting colleagues.

Contradiction: Securing facility for Continental Council and the Guardians' Meeting. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: The year's vision of establishing the ICA with a strong French organization is realized with the Credit Agricole Symposium. Nine French guardians attend from throughout France.

Internal: The week is highlighted with year-end celebrations: one is in Paris with three French guardians and two potential interns, and the other in Brussels with the nexus.

Contradiction: Putting the necessary details into the quarter plan so victories can be realized.(Wk. 3)

ROME

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TERMINE HDP

External: The village ACUTO decides to do a CYF and GWF in September. The TM *movement* becomes part of their local government programme. The third circuit to Sicily strengthens colleagues' understanding of ICA programmes and results in the decision to do a set in September.

Internal: The House celebrates the end of a quarter with a beach party, and an impromptu party on Friday evening celebrates four birthdays.

Contradiction: Creating a story of missional priorities for the summer that will engage colleagues and release future funds to ensure Italian participation in the GRA.(Wk. 3)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Bendel State Rubber Communities, participating in Village Meetings, hold their Assembly with proposals that hold significant implications for working with the other Federal Commodity Boards. This would require using LENS, then Village Meetings and an Assembly for an awakening network which would lead to cluster set-ups. New rubbish drums arrive in time for ITT rep from New York, touring to see the project. His closing line was "This visit has made my trip worthwhile; this project must be one of your best."

Internal: Overjoyed House receives Oyler, Sanlola and Mukosha from Bendel State with victorious stories, Bill and Suzanne Parker for LENS from Accra circuit, joining the Lachmans who arrive from Zambia and two-year-old Lucy Mukosha who arrives with the Lachmans after a long wait for a passport.

Contradiction: Focusing action to put us in position to do the next year.(Wk. 13)

ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: A series of private sector calls puts us in position for having an Ivoirian colleague go with us on calls. This catalyses a significant contact in the Ivoirian Chamber of Commerce.

Internal: Contact with INADES (African development organisation) leads to temporary housing with the Catholic Church.

Contradiction: Converting the support which is being generated into concrete practical action.(Wk. 1)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: In a week of circuiting in Area Vienna a breakthrough is made as heads of Religious Orders are visited with fall programme potential of 30 forums of training events. Meanwhile appointments are set with high level Protestant church symbolic leadership in authorization manoeuvre--12 appointments across Germany-- with Bishops and Bishops representatives. With three colleagues doing set up and three

others leading, a great CYF is held in Frankfurt Region for 40 tenth class students in Catholic school.

Internal: As the study of Existence Rationality begins, (this time as a screen for understanding Germany) and an extended study of Friedman's chapter three *Four-fold Path of Radical Practice* gives us new ways of approaching our missional strategy, the City of Frankfurt clarifies their renovation plan for the house--as they maintain this historical building.

Contradiction: Maintaining corporate focus on GRA recruitment as scatteredness in response to programme intensification in five regions seems to diffuse the victory actually won.(Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN--KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: A letter from Feldberpen set (week 12) expresses the change of mood in the village. A visit with Dieter Schmidberger to a government-sponsored Austrian seminar of almost all community development experiments--with 40 representatives of all structures present--gives the opportunity to show the global film and present a report from Kreuzberg Ost HDP. The Project leadership meets and deals seriously with the question of how to stand on their own feet.

Internal: Korean couple Rev. and Mrs. Kang Byong Huon visits the one-person house.

Contradiction: Missing corporated information exchange leads to vulnerable open ends in key programs.(Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: The third regional participant for the GRA is confirmed. Transfers of 400 guilden (\$US200) are received into the travel fund.

Internal: The last day of school and the end of the year is celebrated with a vegetarian dinner followed by an organ and choir concert in the cathedral.

Contradiction: Holding a productive balance between summer priorities and the emerging generation adventure of the 80s.(Wk. 3)

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: Banks is sent out to do a TM trek in Stockholm and Helsinki. The World Health Organization--regional office Copenhagen--asks for research into Womens' role in health care. One more possible phones up to say yes to Summer '80.

Internal: The House celebrates finishing of research on Syktyvkar area with large banana splits.

Contradiction: Securing longer term work in a country where long term work is at a premium.(Wk. 2)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA--KAPINI HDP

External: The Farmers' Association purchases a plough for winter ploughing. Eighty-five attend a workday at the new teacher's house, and health training centre. Health caretakers appear in new uniforms to hold their first class, with 11 new trainees from neighbouring villages.

Internal: The Muloshi family returns from Kenya Replication with great stories and join in another *Saturday Night Special* (SMS) highlighted by card magic tricks by a new sojourner, and six sojourners arrive.

Contradiction: Keeping the cash on hand that ensures the continuous flow of building materials and uninterrupted programme schedules.(Wk. 2)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE : CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Bayad villagers take responsibility for East Bank Cluster Assembly as date is set for June 6th. The community centre facility inner walls go up. Bayad's nearest neighbour, Sheikh Ali, has a Village Meeting.

Internal: House plus host of guests including Ken and Grace Wegner and two guests from England attend preschool teacher Mosa Salema's wedding and witness her proudly signing the wedding contract herself.

Contradiction: Enabling the village leadership to do the rest of the Village Meeting. (Wk. 12)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Kipsianan-Koisamo HDP is launched and Rift Valley now has a demonstration project. Two teams are sent out for consults in Nguluku, Coastal Province, and Kalwani-Shamalogo, Western Province, demonstrating great spirit as they depart in combis and buses. In a globalizing week, a Danish journalist visits Kamweleni, General Motors and Express Kenya set quarter II LENS dates and students from the Institute of Adult Studies, University of Nairobi, visit Kamweleni and participate in Village Meeting event—practical experience for the Research and Training Unit in Kamweleni.

Internal: The House uses LENS methods to focus on '80-'81, sends out collegium constructs to project houses for input relative to training, style and symbols and comes up with a model for Cluster Villages in Machakos District.

Contradiction: Clarifying the timeline for planning and consensus of models for '80-'81. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcel's Community Health Caretaker from Stake 4 registers 150 mothers on Clinic Day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenyan Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmers preparation at farms, troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI facility. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY-MALIWADA HDP

External: Women's Advancement Module training held for 30 ICA staff women and three Sevagram HDP village women in preparation for five, 5-day modules in district projects this quarter, creates a new vision and sense of collegiality among the women of Nava Gram Prayas. First impact and GRA recruitment foray to Jabalpur reopens that region to the movement.

Internal: Global Methods School PSU creates the means to convey the depth of the internal life to the 25 district projects while HDTI recruitment teams hold collegiums on daily ritual and demonstrate use of the *Internal Life Guide*.

Contradiction: Ensuring participation of key village leadership in upcoming HDTI. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Major breaklooses occur in funding and authorization with tax exemption (100%) given for 50 villages and the block. Development raises 26,750 rupees across the

continent this week plus 6,000 rupees in in-kind goods for GRC. Vaviharsh Second Consult document is produced and first continental newsletter is completed.

Internal: GRC preparation is in full swing as international faculty arrives.

Contradiction: Building realistic strategies that will release new time, energy, and money. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI-SIKROR HDP

External: Impact thrust is initiated in Area Delhi as the first LENS is held with National Small Industries Corporation (Government of India). Global Film Shows are held at Australian High Commission and United Nations Office with UNDP, UNFPA and UNWFP. Actuation continues in Sikror as village finally decides to have electricity and collects deposits from 61 families.

Internal: Delhi office turned into Wayside Inn as LENS team arrives and quick circuit by Development Centrum provides perfect excuse for impromptu House celebration.

Contradiction: Ensuring that any action is done at the critical place and time for greatest effectivity. (Wk. 9)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Twenty farmers take a course in modern farming methods from All India Coordinated Research for Dryland Agriculture. Centrum sets up September LENS in Madras with the National Small Industries Commission. District Collector calls a meeting to set up the "Committee for the All Round Development of Nadlapur," which includes the Collector, District Department Heads, Block Officers and the VST Company.

Internal: C. Satare and R. Prabaraj return from awakenment campaign in Area Calcutta.

Contradiction: Making a response to public sector pressure to expand our work while waiting for our employers' authorization. (Wk. 11)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: The first event in Bhawanipatua Metro, Bhubaneswar Region is held. The HDTI report goes to the printer.

Internal: HDTI grad, Baidyanath Sardar arrives, Summer roundtable begins (recalling the original 24 HDPs) and the House planning for the quarter takes place in Hindi, Bengali and English.

Contradiction: Creating the imaginal brooding that elicits the map of the new external mission. (Wk. 4)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Another 100% program month! More than 25 people are sent off to the GRA. LENS calling continues to be successful.

Internal: The self-support push continues in preparation for the coming year and management charts the year (onward and upward!) and holds an end of quarter celebration.

Contradiction: Establishing the systems which care for the zone through the GPC. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SERUSUP-HDP

External: Seven months after strategically relocating the ICA

auxiliary outside the village, another report is received from the villagers. Recent victories include: legal incorporation of the LEV, 40 full time employees in the handicraft industry and 17 full time employees in the village fish farm. The fish farm production has doubled, produce sold for \$18,000(US) and 900 chicken layers have begun producing. The fishing co-op has ordered its first deep sea trawler and the Serusup leaders have visited other villages to train and help them set up their own LEV.

Internal: Dixie Jennings-Teats is sent to Chicago to assist in GRA preparation.

Contradiction: Maintaining relations between Serusup and the Global Movement over great distances. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Pilot MTM (Community Forum) training event is hosted by the Kuala Selangor District Office with 12 representing the four MTM villages. This includes all the headmen and a school principal and three of the District Officer's representatives. Ford lends the project a 1980 *Fiesta* for the duration of the MTM campaign.

Internal: Rochmat returns from CEM in Kelapa Dua and the entire House takes on the task of getting the ICA Malaysia into the mail.

Contradiction: Creating the model that will allow the MTM campaign to be done by those business and local people already possessing leadership responsibilities. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: A Global Women's Forum is held in Munda with all Indonesian staff. The Women's sewing group sells cloth to villagers in preparation for the end of the fasting month celebration.

Internal: The House travels to Puncak hills resort area for Quarter I planning and great discontinuous event for the entire staff and the Umar family's mother, aunt and cousin arrive from Ujung Pandang to meet the new twin boy grandchildren and stay for three days.

Contradiction: Implementing tactics that will create consensus with motivation for development with the government and the present authorization. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN-BUBUN HDP

External: The cluster health program begins with Health Caretaker recruitment in six villages, a survey is begun in Bubun, and a workday launches Bubun electrification. *Cluster News* is distributed. Legislature members from a neighboring Province visit Bubun.

Internal: Troops are sent to Jakarta for Area Council while the House celebrates the life and death of an auxiliary member's brother.

Contradiction: Waiting on the Area Council to decide the next moves. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG-BONTOA HDP

External: Bontoa hosts Bupati (County Chief) as he closes the three week HDTI. Bubun Cluster participants are sent out, back to Sumatra. N.Dg. Paujung village headman, is sent out to Kelapa Dua CEM.

Internal: The staff reflects and celebrates the closing of the HDTI, in Bantimurung, a nearby resort, and the Shanklands and Arifin are sent out to represent the region at the Area Council in Jakarta, the Udin family sent to Jogjakarta to enable Udin to continue his schooling.

Contradiction: Gaining renewed momentum on village actuation and sustaining the cluster cadre decision before cluster consults. (Wk. 3)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: A visit with CIBA Goegu brings a commitment of financial support, and opportunity for an apprenticeship program for villagers, and prompts a site visit by the general manager. \$HK10,000 is received from S.C. Johnson.

Internal: The discovery of a great, cheap neighborhood restaurant, results in dining out twice in one week.

Contradiction: Building practical daily structures that enable the sporadic permeation schedule and leaves time to respond to the region's requests. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: The summer program is funded by a government grant. One of the underwritten programs is an international cultural night for the village.

Internal: The project hosts Charles and Alice Latimer from Panama, and You Koon Lin, village leader and his sister, from Canada, for an evening of dining and conversation..

Contradiction: Concretizing the whole village's interest over against individual villager's interests. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: Extension maneuvers uncover two companies genuinely interested in setting up sub-contract work in three villages around Hai-Ou and the local Director of Social Affairs gets excited to hear of the program. Hai-Ou women plan their first outing of the year and the summer youth program starts with English lessons and sports. Typhoon Ida hits Hai-Ou at 4 a.m. and a mountainous sea floods the entire village making access to and from the shops possible only by boat.

Internal: The House welcomes four students to sojourn for the summer.

Contradiction: Running with the Extension momentum but leaving room to maneuver after the July Council. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Visits with Philippine government officials, foreign embassies, and target corporations reaffirm support of ICA program for next year. Intensive follow-up on committed and working money from past development trek is continued, and telephoning blitz for next trek is begun. Philippine regions PSU on expansion of ICA bookkeeping system is held following the annual audit.

Internal: House hosts parish and school friends of Heather Howell in despedida party as she leaves for the US and student house and the movie *Kramer vs Kramer* addresses house as great image builder relative to responsibility.

Contradiction: Covering all the bases to enable finishing the year in the black and providing base for launching next year. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: A request for assistance with cottage industry program in the villages of Fang Liao township (surrounding Hai Ou) are printed in Chinese and ready for mailing to colleagues and local companies. The staff enlistment process is redesigned, including new application form, P.O. Box number, introduction letter, newspaper advertisement, and one page summary of the Hai Ou Project and ICA work. Twelve companies are contacted with regard to finding cottage industry possibilities.

Internal: June House finances are pulled together through the completion of the month's ledgers and the summer internal models are done.

Contradiction: Testing and establishing an objective, continuous process of enlisting new staff to support extensive program and development thrusts in Chinese society during the next four years.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Village cooking demonstrations through trained village Health Nutrition workers, coordinated by the Ministry of Education and the community, kicks off the first week of July, allowing Mactan Island to radically participate in this national nutrition month. National Ministry members are so impressed that they take movies of cooking demonstration and send films to the First Lady. Sudtonggan's second elementary school building is finished.

Internal: Ben Aguirang arrives from the academy just two days before his wife, Victoria, gives birth to Benjamin Aguirang Jr., and Lester Knutsen arrives for a three day consult with the House as part of his circuiting between Manila, Cebu and Davao.

Contradiction: Enabling government agencies to unite in the Nutrition Fair. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: The Ministry of Social Services and Development provides lots of food for the eight Mountain Cluster preschools. A second group of doctors from Brokenshire Hospital arrives for a month's stay in Langub. Magruod HDP General Stores hold an inventory and declares a profit, and Lumun HDP plants a community demonstration farm.

Internal: The house gets a new burner to cook on, new locks for the doors and has a workday for beautification.

Contradiction: Maintaining preschool attendance in the midst of the rainy season. (Wk. 4)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Guardians Paul Murayama and George Kawai travel to Fukioka to teach LENS. Kawai translates all five passages from *The Ronin* into Japanese and is overwhelmed by the positive response.

Internal: Christina's 12 year old niece travels alone from California to Tokyo for a two-week visit, and is grandly hosted by the House and Japanese colleagues.

Contradiction: Allowing the scattered nature of July to intensify the local mission by requiring new leadership from local colleagues. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Twenty consultants and Guardians visit in preparation for CEM, as village bar campaign moves into final stretch of five bars.

Internal: Jeni is sent out to Seoul Region Management meeting in Seoul House.

Contradiction: Breaking loose the mythic foundations of Jeju Island for the sake of rapid and effective extension. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: The House celebrates the conclusion of one month sojourn training program that includes the Voyage, RS1, RS111a and CS111a. Two of the sojourners stay on to spend the month of July in Kuh Du E Ri expansion work. Development and inkind continue to bubble with quarterly donations and medicine for expansion villages Health Outposts.

Internal: Seoul House continues to be full to capacity as sojourners are replaced with hosting Japan colleagues and the Armas family on reroute to Chicago. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Three villagers from Cho Yang Expansion village visit Seoul. They check on material and machinery for a rice bag industry they hope to begin in the very near future.

Internal: A chicken barbeque on the mountainside overlooking Kuh Duh E Ri orives to be the perfect spot to have a send-out celebration for the Armas family.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum high as tactics become harder to do. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: An advisors meeting looking to Fall, decides to have a meeting in August. A speaking engagement in Kita Kgushu is set with Joe Iida to heads of industrial companies.

Internal: David is hosted for the weekend in Nagasaki by the Bank of Tokyo.

Contradiction: Preparing to play the supporting role in an ICA presentation led by an advisor. (Wk. 41)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Eighteen ICA volunteers attend the International Women's Meeting for Osaka City Fujinkai Organization and UNESCO. A circuit team makes a TM presentation for Tokushima prefecture government and follows up the Nara prefecture presentation with visits to local government offices. A Guardians' Meeting invitation is sent to the wrong person and gets a yes response.

Contradiction: Bringing into focus the emphasis of the summer by naming the major thrust. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO—OYUBARI HDP

External: Final arrangements for the YMCA camp are made with the city office. TM documentation is completed and sent to Urakawa and the CEM document translation continues. Thank you letters are sent to social education directors visited on *Hokkaido 10* circuit.

Internal: The House goes swimming at Shimizusawa, Naomi and Yu Sato participate with many community residents in the Kindergarten sports day, House staff including children participate in English classes in Takikawa and Roger and Mr and Mrs Kirata are sent out to the GRA.

Contradiction: Finding corporate time to accomplish what is needed with the House in two places. (Wk. 3)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: The best production to date of *Have-a-Go Gazette*, printed on gold paper, tells stories of winning community programmes in six towns. It is mailed to 550 regional contacts. Twenty Mother superiors respond with delightful collegiality to a showing of the Global Film and immediately set a second showing for July 20th.

Internal: July 4th is celebrated with an evening indoor picnic with hot dogs, chips, apple pie and cream and toasted marshmallows over the open fire; Dianne Oakley sojourns and joins the House in late nights of tennis to see aboriginal Evonne Goolagon-Cawley win at Wimbledon.

Contradiction: Maintaining missional intentionality in the midst of a relaxed winter style. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: The quarter's planning is completed and key victories are named.

Internal: Colleagues come to House Church to send Sue Chapman out to the GRA and Barbara gets a promotion and a \$1,500 raise.

Contradiction: Maintaining objective missional focus when the House is actually one nuclear family. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: A training meeting for local residents is held in preparation for a Community Meeting in Two Wells. Visits to two campaign sets result in two more planning meetings scheduled.

Internal: Quarter IV ends with a gala three ring circus: ring one is Quarter I manoeuvre writing, ring two the great preparation, and ring three the main event, with original drama by House and regional colleagues, all capping off a fantastic quarter of engagement.

Contradiction: Creating images of effective independent aboriginal action. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

Internal: The House participates in the annual Blue Nursing Door Knock appeal (raising \$72 in two hours) and has an end of year celebration, with fine feast and movie.

Contradiction: Building strategies that will release participation and events for 1980-'81. (Wk. 2)

Contradiction: Ensuring the troop base for next year's regional activities. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: The first four of five stake meetings are held to draw sketches for a 20-year space management plan. Up-to-date information on small diameter sewer system is distributed.

Internal: A special Ecclesiola celebrates the birthdays of two house members.

Contradiction: Engaging troops into a single thrust. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY—KINNEY HDP

External: Kinney Custom Industries holds an Economic Forum and puts the company down the road. KCI partner does battle plannig with her hamily, and runs over the tell us, "the method works!"

Internal: Addie Lyman is sent to Chicago for summer preparation. Barbara and the EG travel to graduation ceremony, leaving Mike and Joe to prepare the House sale.

Contradiction: Enabling the community to recognize fully the implications of transition. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Planning for youth of Green Bay begins at a meeting with two regional colleagues and a director of youth programs.

Internal: The House expands the Wayside Inn dynamic with guests from Brillion, LaCrosse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin, Chicago, Berkely and San Francisco.

Contradiction: Expanding the House's catalytic role in the region. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: VISTA volunteers, assigned to work with ICA to do a demonstration rural cluster are in place, gridding, interviewing and preparing for a set of forums. An Inner City Youth Forum brings together youth from eight neighborhoods and provides opportunity to do initial training for 20 new workshop leaders. Sixteen from the bi-metro attend the GRA Symposium and one returns from the weekend ready to attend the fall Academy.

Internal: The development team adds greatly to one adult's capacity to handle all the tasks; colleagues decide to go ahead with house Church and it provides a fine corporate celebration in the midst of GRA dispersion.

Contradiction: Finishing up '79-'80 self-support in the midst of lining up self-support '80-'81. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: House and Metro troops hold a Church Leadership Forum with core leadership of the Episcopal Church in Lincoln Heights. It's purpose is to envision the '80s and to launch everymember visitation campaign.

Internal: An end of quarter, end of year celebration with a picnic in the park and a movie *The Coal Miner's Daughter* is a great happening.

Contradiction: Allowing the mindset that people are not available or interested in the summer alongside past images of other summers of just holding down the fort. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: External forum number 17 in the town on Munising, population 5,000, brings local business and tourist business together for the first time.

Internal: Computer breakthrough comes from a visit with a hobbyist.

Contradiction: Keeping the loose ends from tying their own knots. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: More things are happening in this weather than ever before. The Central Youth Group, King Kennedy Estates and the Clark Metro Tak Forcs are breaking loose in caring engagement and practical action.

Internal: Preparation is made for a garden party including sending invitations and phoning colleagues and practice celebration is held at *Squire's Castle*.

Contradiction: Prioritizing the plans in light of unexpected demands. (Wk. 2)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Twenty people are sent to the Global Symposium. Ten stay on for the GRA.

Internal: A summer theological study is et up for the House and region while everyone is permeating.

Contradiction: Figuring out how to make permeation an effective external missional thrust. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Three from the region participate in Harrisburg GWF which has a total of 65 participants.

Internal: The House participates in Three Rivers Arts Festival and joins the city in celebrating its creativity.

Contradiction: Finding it difficult to trust the structures. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Nunda Area Development committee moves into new orbit with members having risked and recruited new members. First visible miracles appear in the community. Bi-metro development week nets money and new colleagues and recontextualizes old Guardians and friends.

Internal: Marge Allen impacts House with news of summer prep and Phase I activities.

Contradiction: Functioning as a house amidst pressures from school, region, and Summer presentation as year ends. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: At second correctional system meeting excitement is caused by possibility of providing the spirit tools to enable burnt-out prison staff.

Internal: House visits Widen project—a real sign to mountain communities.

Contradiction: Feeling that we cannot make any decisions until someone tells us what to do. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: "I am glad we came," comment at the end of a site visit—work session symbolizes hope for the future of local communities. This was representative of the wide scope of site visits this week as final preparations for Summer '80: *Alive, Gifted and Black*. Two summer work crews of 50 youth each prepare for the opening Monday.

Internal: A collegium on the impact of Pace HDS on participants proves globalizing amidst the intensity of local expenditure.

Contradiction: Articulating covenants for our time. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: The core of community leaders holds strong rumors. Stake visits intensify.

Internal: Gene Hunter returns from Summer preparation to intensify stake visits in Widen; the House celebrates Gene's real 54th birthday by going to see *The Empire Strikes Back* (it's worth seeing) (Wk. 13)

Contradiction: Envisioning the project's third year so its not just last-year-only-better.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: International colleagues Margaret Fareed and Juana Neriquita arrive for development. Development calls take on increased impact and power and local commitment and response is intensified.

Internal: Collegium on the Religious House journey over the last year impacts the consciousness of the unlimited possibilities for creative action within the region relative to the third campaign.

Contradiction: Articulating the readiness and the openings in the urban out of this year's work, focused on the urban. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Favorable review of last year's VISTA project finally completed. Glen McGee participate in great trip to Washington D.C. and Ivy City for Congressional calls.

Internal: House takes Jean and Stew Stowell to dinner at Lakeside Inn and attends a hilarious local musical revue.

Contradiction: Precipitating a corporate focus on the transition events. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: A strategy meeting in South Stratford cares for colleagues there. Collins Common Block Watch task force makes assignments for a community survey.

Internal: July 4 weekend enables a discontinuous time with colleagues and family and a collegium on *The Empire Strikes Back* sparks brooding on the reality of popular mythology.

Contradiction: Finding ways to appropriate the fact that bracketing things that desperately need doing is part of your comprehensive model. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Mary Coggeshall shows India and Sudtonggan slides to Albany Metro guardian colleagues. Three of the audience plan to attend the symposium in Chicago.

Internal: The House celebrates three wedding anniversaries on one week, two years for the Lindstroms, seven years for the Emericks, 21 years for the Roses.

Contradiction: Moving slowly on things that can get done quickly. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: An Evening at the Institute film event introduces some 10 new people to the international work. Two hundred dollars unexpectedly comes in from a local church for India.

Internal: Self-support effects the House as members build porches, give a presentation on the missional family at the church and preach the sermon.

Contradiction: Bringing House self-support up before the end of July. (Wk. 4)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: The House collaborates with Ottawa in creating *Decade of Service* panels. Three are sent out to the Global Symposium.

Internal: The House begins generating extra self-support income, rearranges corporate work space and receives inkind vacuum cleaner.

Contradiction: Designing time to enable the House to put corporate articulation on brooding and plans for next year in the regions. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Bi-regional year and council with area priors in attendance looks at the advantages created from last year. Missional strategic thrusts are project for the next years and the next year.

Internal: The collegiums for the Panchayat selection and assignment values gives depth and global perspective to issues facing us as an Order.

Contradiction: Securing new symbolic religious house which reflects the missional demands of Toronto. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: This is a week of stake visits on the Hill as M.P.s get

caught up on Pontiac county cluster and ICAs work nationally.

Internal: The House hosts the Montreal House and creates a *Decade of Service* artform for the GRA, covering LCX, PCX, CFC, Demonstrations and Clusters, and Service to the world which evokes deep contemplation on the mission.

Contradiction: Covering self-support comprehensively. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Community Extension Module reveals new reality in midst of project as Documentation/Keystone Task Force trains core leadership to hold community visioning session. Toronto woodworking consultant enables new community corporateness relative to Lornecraft Woodworking.

Internal: Festive mood is created this week with New Brunswick Lobster Party with the core at the Hickeys and specially prepared Indian meal by Mr. Dethe at the House. House overflows with guests who stay in 5 additional community homes.

Contradiction: Enabling all community leadership to see possibility and challenge of their emerging role of total community caretakers. (Wk. 3)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: One of the four targeted extension villages sets dates for an Imaginal Education course and a Community Assembly.

Internal: The House celebrates the 4th July with a visit to the Sons of Mary, a beach trip and dinner out.

Contradiction: Instilling methodological prowess in a village leader in 1.5 weeks. (Wk. 4)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Intense focus completes Miserior proposal for marketing agency in time for framing maneuvers. Social programs are strengthened by eight government salaries. Nutrition team and sector teams are launched.

Internal: Ecclesiola reflection reveals wisdom gained in the year and models to share with the world. House children care for 200 rabbits.

Contradiction: Creating a weekly rhythm with the community's administrative team which includes the needed dynamics of training and consensus formation. (Wk. 9)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: A trip to the regional medical structures in Macae reveals an openness towards getting a visiting community nurse into the community. More guinea pigs arrive; existing guinea pigs flourish as the July sale approaches, street names are chosen and signs painted, naming the historical heroes of Bananeiros. Money comes in, \$1,000 from ITT and \$700 from Nutricia to tide us over the summer.

Internal: The community arrives on our doorstep to say goodbye to Ruth and Alicia after a year in the village and Eneide, Brazilian Academy grad arrives to sojourn in Bananeiros and guns the children's after-school program.

Contradiction: Allowing the community to calim recent victories as their victories. (Wk. 4)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: As the last requirement for the registration of the Woburn Lawn Cooperative are met, the grant from the Netherlands Embassy arrives ensuring ensuing initiative for action.

Internal: Auxiliary transportation is ensured as the Netherlands Embassy decides to licence the car while strategies are enacted to transfer the registration to the ICA.

Contradiction: Overcoming the lack of indicative-imperatives as the future directions of 1980-'81 are unclear. (Wk. 4)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: The Education guild is surprised at the success of its first benefit dance. Proceeds are for pre-school uniforms. *La Voz* is published once again.

Internal: Laura Wulff translates meal constructs from the Internal Life Guide, allowing more helpful participation in the House meals.

Contradiction: Gently shoving leadership while beckoning for community engagement. (Wk. 4)

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA—SAN VICENTE DE AZPITIA HDP

External: A circuit team of three, including one from Cano Negro and one Azpitian, hold two forums completing one in each of the metros of Region Lima. Ramon is thanked and sent out to Cano Negro with Peruvian cebeche. Visas fro Peruvians to the U.S.A. are aquired and Luz Marina is sent out to attend the GRA.

Internal: Quarter IV reflection and planning for quarter I is lead in part by all House members and celebrated with casual drinks around a donated bottle of scotch. (Wk. 3)

WEEK FOUR

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports from Chicago that troops swell to 54 for July. The bottom line of \$76,000 for week 1 is made bringing the total to \$350,000 on target towards the 1.5 million. New images are broken loose for an on going travel pool which would open up a new constituency of givers. The contradiction lies in the arena of expanding the base of possibilities for major funding.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that GRA regional teams are taking shape with recruitment momentum building. Documentation of '79-'80 is underway with program victories charts in Brussels and Hong Kong. GRA prep in Chicago gains momentum in working on methods for creating the strategies for the 3rd campaign, Hope, and the Prophet. Prophets of hope are generating a new spirit mode for declaration in a time when the world is living under a cloud of doom. The key contradiction lies in having time to brood through the depths of spirit needed to undergird a move toward an Intraglobal Local Movement of Human Communities.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operation Centrum reports from Chicago that the Global Symposium, working on pressure points, laid the foundation for a new global strategy. Finance packets are in process for Widen, Ivy City and Fifth City. From Brussels recruitment to the Guardians' Council—Europe continues with key colleagues helping. The contradiction lies in the arena of demanding competency in economic skills, in a time of economic collapse, so that the profound life experience of self-sufficiency is realized in local community.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that a fiscal services task force has been set up in conjunction with the GRA, and is looking at total funding aspects of the ICA and O:E for presentation to the Order Council. Incredible inkind victories continue with the second gift of beef (650 lbs) and the largest vegetable and fruit market donating four times a week including 27 cases of Bing cherries. The contradiction lies in the arena of allowing the immediate demands of July to limit creative strategies for the ongoing months.
