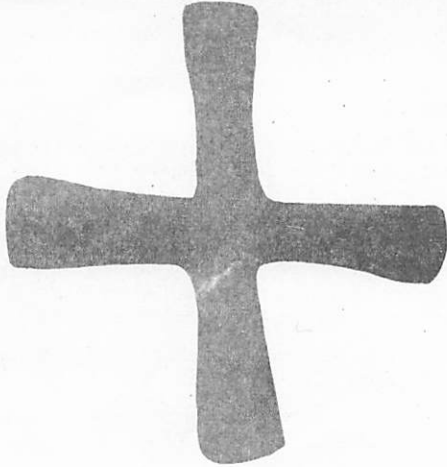

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Two Brussels Nexus forces, Vivian Paul and Paula Philbrook, arrive in London and go straight out on an awakening planning trek to Manchester and Tai'rgwaith where they help entertain an official from Rio Tinto Zinc. At the same time, Faith and Neil Vance work on development in London. Five colleagues go to the Brussels RS-I.

Internal: Neil Vance gives a very interesting collegium on the state of our work in Africa which makes the whole situation come alive to us.

Contradiction: Rehabilitating the house in the midst of exciting external troop demand. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: The Loch Ness Monster shows up on the cover of one TM document as four major events in three metros (Glasgow/Edinburgh/Inverness) in two days sees four staff members and four regional colleagues collaborating in orchestration.

Internal: On Shrove Tuesday the 6 o'clock ritual is physical activity as corporate pancake flipping in the kitchen ushers House into the season of Lent.

Contradiction: Concretizing the colleague engagement model while orchestrating overwhelming possibilities. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Local residents host key development prospect, Rio Tinto Zinc Subsidiary, with conversations on the local as key to the future.

Internal: Relationship to globe is manifest as House hosts three treks in one week and sends Danny O'Neil to Brussel's RS-I.

Contradiction: Launching new TM thrust and calling forth solid grad base in same maneuvers. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Visits in Newcastle Metro catalyze old grad to plan long-range strategy and its implementation with concrete appointments, regional circuiting and one event in the works.

Internal: Research Centrum trek uncovers many new possibilities in all metros.

Contradiction: Concretizing colleague engagement model while orchestrating overwhelming possibilities catalyzed by immediate quarter events. (Wk. 10)

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Trip to Majollon in Zargaza Province sets up a solid TM in the village of Tabuenca in May as the first of many villages. Week-long recruitment in Madrid results in four key translators.

Internal: Don Francis spiritizes House with great Week II PSU while on his visa renewal trip from India.

Contradiction: Getting a solid volunteer network for full-time daily operations. (Wk. 10)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Mr. le Tauneau, our landlord, hosts us to a grand evening to meet key French business leaders. Letter from Pere Toulat, Secretary General of Justice & Peace to the French Committee Against Hunger, is likely to free money for India. Fifty-thousand French franc proposal to Ministry of Cooperation is submitted to open Abidjan House in spring.

Internal: Dominique Mathiot performs a miracle in raising all his travel for Academy—\$712—in 2 weeks from local town meeting colleagues. Sister Yvonne Guenec sojourns and 15 are around table for Ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Building practical structures at the initial stage of colleague journey to allow them to become active. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Open House held on Saturday with 13 guests including co-workers from jobs and parents of emerging generation friends.

Internal: The McClains arrive from India for visa renewal. The Banks return for the first foray of the year to Area Stockholm.

Contradiction: Moving the molehill of practices supporting 12 major upcoming events before it becomes a mountain. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Gent (urban) and Le Chesne (rural) "sets" hold plenaries and planned miracles. House receives 2000 copies of the 1978-79 National Report inklined from IBM.

Internal: Six guests at Ecclesiola stay until collegium the next morning, one attends Area Council in Paris.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in the Brussels Region, including office duties, while getting all regions in the area activated. (Wk. 10)

ROME**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TERMINE HDP**

External: TM takes a leap with the breakloose of a network in Rieti, TM set up in Milan and the initiation of a "set" in Chieti.

Internal: Job propsecting in a supposedly impossible situation turns up the possibility of an English teaching job which would, in one day's work per week, meet half of a self-support requirement.

Contradiction: Discerning the mechanism of accelerating geographic coverage while handling commitments. (Wk. 10)

LAGOS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP**

External: Miraculous intervention of Professor Udekwo rescinds repatriation order on two and reactivates process of registration. Mufutan Jimoh, Sewing Factory Manager, gets new contracts—one with possible total of \$38,400 (N24,000). Key TM held at Umuzike-Orlu, Imo State with 300 present, led by two auxiliary and two Ijedians.

Internal: House celebrates arrival of Ray Spencer, Neil Vance and Bill Parker with fantastic Saturday night feast and great House Church.

Contradiction: Enabling events in the village which create corporateness and sustain consistent victories. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DOUALA

External: Gerald Nani, French Guardian, joins Biel on two-week framing and authorization trek through West Africa.

Internal: Suzanne completes hospital stay and starts back to work again.

Contradiction: Doing comprehensive job on base maneuvers without having the benefit of corporate input (Wk. 10)

FRANKFURT**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Sojourners John Wong and Stefani Erhart (en route to El Bayad from the Koln Region) enable the newsletter to get out. House participates in the first day-long event in France in helping staff the Economic Issues Forum in the Limoges Region. Strike Force moves to Berlin and the Hamburg Region.

Internal: At-home celebration is bi-cultural exchange of news from Sungai Lui (via John Wong) and instruction in the game of Hearts. Roland Frank returns from great RS-1 in Brussels, Yvonne Stringham is back from France and Kate Ward and John Stringham are sent out.

Contradiction: Unblocking corporate work on designing the remainder of the quarter's victories and maneuvers in the face of time-consuming and irregular permeation and scattered troops in the Area. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Project leadership struggle to consensus over the House meetings and the limited liability company after the monthly evaluation and planning session and celebration.

Internal: Research and Management Centrum presence in Berlin for PSU and management trek clarify a bold formation strategy around the extension consult and transforms amateur bookkeepers into accountants.

Contradiction: Pushing out to new frontiers and to empower what already is in being are calling for an entirely new shadowing approach. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Six-month training program is worked out with new project volunteers during same Week 11 when TM document research is the highpoint of the Global Research PSU.

Internal: Research PSU includes celebrative songwriting and dessert at Rozenboom Fondue Restaurant.

Contradiction: Creating the form of Formation Fortnight out of the interest of project volunteers. (Wk. 10)

STOCKHOLM**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: Initial framing trek to four regions, including Oslo under three feet of snow, elicits 20 religious and secular patrons who immediately begin searching for staff facility and employment. Danida continues to be optimistic toward a major grant for India.

Internal: Temporary in-kind Copenhagen facility is found by new guardians who celebrate the victory by hosting us with a feast of reindeer steak from Greenland.

Contradiction: Securing a permanent facility in a city where locals register at age two for future accommodation. (Wk. 10)

KINSHASA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-KAPINI HDP**

External: Project leadership continues to strengthen as three travel to Kabwe to visit District Governor re: primary school registration and health facility completion, and as PTA group meets with President of Zambia National Union of Teachers who visit Kapini. A Dutch Seminar group in community development from President's Citizenship College finds Kapini a "miracle" after traveling a month to projects all around Zambia. Caretakers take Guardian, Dr. Hess, on tour, and the Under-5 Clinic runs out of vaccine for 150 children and schedules a return next week. LENS No. 3 is held with Colgate in Ndola.

Internal: Eusebio and Felesters are welcomed in celebration upon their return from being married in the presence of a large family gathering. Saturday night BYOG (Bring Your Own Game) is a delightful House celebration.

Contradiction: Confusion of the community in preparation for the District Governor's visit (Wk. 9)

CAIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP**

External: A signal guild meeting uncovers solid team activity as the Marmalade Team, the Community Kitchen, the Public Work Corps and the Bayad Builders write their stories and create their symbols. Sixty-five students complete the new Community Center foundation.

Internal: The visit of the Cairo Women's Club (future GWF participants) motivates House hosting with tea and cake followed by a tour which includes the new Marmalade Building.

Contradiction: Keeping your hand inside the Gom Jabbar of victory. (Wk. 8)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Two major site visits held in Kawangware/Kabiro: One, the largest women's group in Kenya—Maendeleo ya Wanawake; and the other a combination of people from Habitat, Cooperative Housing Foundation of Washington and the Afro-American Labour Center. A great workday is held in Kabiro in which foundation trenches for demonstration house are dug.

Internal: Large road equipment in Kawangware once again runs into water pipes leaving village and House with no water for four days.

Contradiction: Building the plans which deal with maintenance of vehicles which run 24 hours a day. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcell Community Health Caretaker from Stake 4 registers 150 mothers on Clinic Day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenyan Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmers' preparation at farms, troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI facility. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY-MALIWADA HDP

External: Women's Advancement Module training held for 30 ICA staff women and three Sevagram HDP village women in preparation for five, 5-day modules in district projects this quarter creates a new vision and sense of collegiality among the women of Nava Gram Prayas. First impact and GRA recruitment foray to Jabalpur reopens that region to the movement.

Internal: Global Methods School PSU creates the means to convey the depth of the internal life to the 25 district projects while HDTI recruitment teams hold collegiums on daily ritual and demonstrate use of the *Internal Life Guide*.

Contradiction: How to ensure participation of key village leadership in upcoming HDTI. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Global Research Colloquy materials are produced and distributed to areas, four divisions of Maharashtra and all the Nexuses. First village leaders HDTI begins as Indian colleagues shoulder the responsibility of preparation and training.

Internal: Successful in-ashram experimental prayer meeting launched as residents gather nightly, prior to evening meal for simple prayers.

Contradiction: Experiencing a gap in procedures for recruiting village leaders as less than our goal of 75 are here for opening of school. (Wk. 10)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI-SIKROR HDP

External: Mid-project transition event is catalyzing rapid actuation across the programs including collection of Rs 400 for road bricks in Stake 4, permission for 75 bags of cement for stalled Community Center from local government, temple roadbricking restarted, inkind hand-pump installed on Harijan well and pest control and grain storage throughout the village. First visit to Lucknow made to being work on state frame and tax exemption while unrequested site visit is made by Deputy-Ambassador of Burma.

Internal: Reordering Delhi House space and cleaning Delhi office after transition event releasing new staff motivity.

Contradiction: Maintaining the actuation momentum gained by the transition event in the midst of document completion and Global Panchayat visitation. (Wk. 8)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Area newsletter goes out inviting colleagues to the Global Research Colloquy in Nagpur. Forth weekly regional circuit does post-Guardian Meeting visits on colleagues in the urban community development project of Hyderabad municipality. House draws initial area grid to the metro level.

Internal: Auxiliary members turn their backs on illiteracy, signing up for a villager's Telegu reading class.

Contradiction: Overcoming the isolation of the past two years to build a powerful area plan. (Wk. 10)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: On the road collegiums and Roundtable with old and new colleagues mark week of adding new dimensions to spirit sustenance.

Internal: Three (including two colleagues from continent) do ten events in five days covering three states. (Bihar, Arissa, W. Bengal).

Contradiction: Breaking open more people with whom to do concrete negotiations in relationship to site selection. (Wk. 10)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Scott Morris and Alfrida Wilkins sent to Bubun to join Hilary for major Indonesian financial accounting trek.

Internal: Chinese New Year celebrates the Year of the Monkey! Kong Hee Fatt Choy!

Contradiction: Thinking through use of Nexus facility in bringing off direct mission in region KL. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SERUSUP-HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to vilage by Deputy Chief Minister and Receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTs and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Visit with Dato Abu Hasan, a member of Parliament, opens up possibility of MTM in Kuala Selangor. Sungai Lui celebrates Mohammad's birthday.

Internal: The Kuala Lumpur House does its homework with collegiums on Negri Sembilan's history and present status preparing to re-look at the Malaysian grid and initiating a staff Cotong Royand.

Contradiction: Appropriating our victories when we don't have anything concrete to show the world. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA DUA HDP

External: House and regional priorship experiences major breakthrough as Wedge Team strategy method session produces document of Six Primary Regional Strategies and Six Common Area Strategies. Australian Women's Association visits Minada HDP cluster to see new soccer field, ball and whistle. Monier Tile and Brick agrees to inkind remaining cement blocks after viewing the progress on the Community Center.

Contradiction: Forging the detailed maneuvers that give focus. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN-BUBUN HDP

External: The second week of the bubun Advanced Training School came to an end with 32 full-time volunteers participating in a 24-hour, 4-session Odyssey on the Journey of Those Who Care and this event marks a decision in their own preparation and journey. Regional Guardians attend government meeting and Guardians' event in Jakarta with the Panchayat and produces concrete go-ahead to being Bubun Cluster Actuation circuits and modules. First cluster modules is held in Bubun on cadre formation and preparation begins for first cluster circuit.

Internal: Dick West and Wa'u Famachoi, Rose Casswell and Rob Jennings-Teats are sent out to represent three Regional Houses during the Panchayat visit. Cluster module celebration is creative release with poetry expressing Indonesian depth passion. Massive repairs and new decor begin to create environmental demonstration in the Bubun Training Center.

Contradiction: How to finally get out to the circuit villages to enable active guild building and to catalyze cluster support and action. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG-BONTOA HDP

External: Preschool restarts following rains and rice planting. Fishpond Guild leaders attend information meeting on World Bank loan program for 1% interest loans now available through the People's Bank of Indonesia (BRI). Bontoa leaders gather to rethink DOOP methods.

Internal: The suspense is over: its a boy Robert Joseph Shankland joins staff weighing in at 35 kg. (7.75 lbs.) and 52 cm. (20.5 in.).

Contradiction: Finding the story that allows staff and village to move it amidst deafening silence from the government about HDTS proposal and Year II budgets. (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Forty-five participate in Guardian luncheon at Sheraton Hotel with Hotel picking up all expenses. Global Film seen as highlight of that gathering. Sudtonggan project is documented with great victories to report.

Internal: The Hong Kong Nexus, local colleagues, plus Nancy Bain from Hai Ou engage in a 44-hour Voyage and are impacted by the four-part construct and the life questions being raised.

Contradiction: Unfocused perspective that clarifies the significant victory withing the many program demands facing us. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Guardians representing Hong Kong Shanghai Bank, Chase Manhattan, Caltex, Dow Chemical, Colonial Training Service of Hong Kong Government, and Hong Kong Tourist Association attend luncheon at Sheraton Hotel. Global film is followed by an excellent talk on the learning of Nam Wai.

Internal: House celebrates Chinese New Year with a barbeque - American style, colleagues form Nexus, village, region and Guardians attend.

Contradiction: Keeping village interior land plan moving at full speed yet allowing village informal decision making structures time to form authentic consensus. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: The Youth prepare for New Year by cleaning Hai Ou mainstreet in fine workday. Village takes next steps in forming the LEV.

Internal: House hosts Burce MacComber and George Holcome and discusses transitional model.

Contradiction: Finessing the Common Model on the future with Government, Villag and ICA. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Development Trek follow-up nets \$40,000. Checks arrive from trek follow-up in Davao and Cebu. Citibank continues support for Sudtonggan Ciba-Geegy-Swiss Drug firm releases \$2,000

Internal: House welcomes Katherine Cheng back to Area from Quarters I & II in North America and Leonard Sizer on route to Cebu and India. Katherine treats house with Chinese feast celebrating the New Year.

Contradiction: Expanding resources of space and currency to hold signal area celebrative event. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Bi-regional meeting of Kaohsiung and Taipei provides concrete directions and decisions toward completion of educational facility in Hai Ou and Taiwan extension strategy for next five months.

Internal: House celebrates the marriage of Stephen Townley and Anne Conroy with congregation dinner at the House, wedding ceremony at St. Anne's Roman Catholic Church and Chinese feast at local Sze Chuang restaurant in Taipei.

Contradiction: Maintaining past missional intensity and strategic major program positioning in a constantly emerging universe of extension possibilities. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUBTONGGAN HDP

External: Mactan 24 registers phenomenal victories highlighted by Ministry of Health Deputy Minister's visit to Sudtonggan who ecstatically speaks at a Cebu Health Officers' Conference about it, extolling the virtues of the Sudtonggan Health Program and recommending that his audience replicate the model. Project support receives a P25,000-jackhammer for the island-wide rock industry from Atlas Copco, secures the Timex factory smock-sewing contract and unloads 120 bags of CARE supplemental food for the Early Learning and Nutrition Centers. Sudtonggan HDP documentation impacts community with dramatic changes in human lives, for example, a 1600% increase in wages for rock workers. Cebu City Administration authorizes Lusanan resettlement project consult by giving everything we asked for including a 7-room elementary school.

Internal: "Love" week sees valentine card creation at Ecclesiola and early morning Bloody Marys, chocolate cupcakes and assorted fruit breakfast for Christina Alton's birthday. We welcome home Linda Knutsen and Area for SHDP documentation and Elizabeth Sands from successful 2-week Manila development trek.

Contradiction: Creating the 50-person regional House which is regionally invested and locally spent. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Biggest tomato in Davao is harvested in Langub demonstration garden. MCMPP starts with 800 children in one week.

Internal: In the midst of Ecclesiola study, House sends out Linda for documentation in Cebu and welcomes back Lester from Manila audit.

Contradiction: Waltzing in the mountain P/S aiming with a thousand kids. (Wk. 9)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Trip to Ibaraki prefecture secures the first promise of governmental cooperation in that stronghold. Saturday afternoon meeting of advisors creates the next phase strategy to turn Seibu Department Store into a Human Development Demonstration.

Internal: A new sojourner-volunteer moves in for a five to six-month stay and the first retired person applies to work with the ICA.

Contradiction: Exposing advisers and colleagues to the depth and breadth of the methods and programs so that they can see beyond awakenment to the full mission. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Three-hundred Kwang Yung Il Ri youth gather for Lunar New Year Talent Contest.

Internal: House participates in marriage of sojourner, Miss Jung.

Contradiction: Reframing in light of new governor appointment to Jeju Do. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: USAID (army surplus) initiative yields 12-seat sports van and if and as available, up to \$500,000 (acquisition value) of other property, and 15 "set" appointments are set for development week.

Internal: Permeation pays as school colleague leads us to best house possibility yet, and young lawyer introduces recent university grad to Jeju sojourn and likely internship.

Contradiction: Maintaining interior gentility while the world and the external mission writhe and rage. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: At village meeting 10 people volunteer to work in the HDS including helping with the 60 town meetings this month. They take first training session. Seoul churches give \$250.

Internal: Ester and Naomi Lazear sent out to Seoul as their parents return from Samoa ITI.

Contradiction: Finishing the road while the motor is running and the vehicle is loaded. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: TM circuiters are welcomed with intense interest in Saga Kermamoto prefecture offices. Saga prefecture recommends TM to cities sight unseen. City of Kita-Kyusu circuit leads to invitation to lunch with influential men's club, Nishi-Nippon Business Club.

Internal: House gives dinner to celebrate the parents of Kazuko Awane, a regional volunteer who is a strong circuiter and TM workshop leader.

Contradiction: Activating the practical glue to hold together the wild kaleidoscope of happenings. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Circuit to Himeji, Okayama and Takamatsu broadens contacts with Vietnamese refugee projects and churches. Women's meeting in Nishinomiya produces commitment for volunteering on a weekly basis. House development team visits Taiyo Kogyo Company for proposal follow-through and submits proposals to two new companies. Colleagues retranslate LENS brochure into understandable Japanese.

Internal: House celebrates graduation of sojourners Ko Yokoyama (college) and Hitomi Yoshida (high school). Four colleagues spend all night writing crucial letter to landlord asking him to extend inkind agreement.

Contradiction: Ensuring that we state the consensus so that we all can participate in the corporate victories. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Ski group makes two-year timeline. Visits to Vice-Governor and other important government officials are made by the Area Prior, Tokyo Guardian and representatives of the Oyubari ski group. Plans are made for 10 Oyubari residents to write the story of Oyubari. Exciting Oyubari town meeting with 10 residents is held for training purposes.

Internal: Teresa Butcher wins 2nd in ski race at school. Don Clark and George Kawai visit for three days. Informal social event moves village toward consensus for extension consult.

Contradiction: Discovering that the power of Tokyo Guardians has blocked us from seeing the opportunities for those from Sapporo. (Wk. 9)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: The great week of jumping through the hoops includes Shire Council office space assigned to the Wyong circuit team, 600 "Have-a-Go Gazettes" mailed out, postage inkinded and 33 development visits held resulting in \$1,400 in-hand cash.

Internal: Hosting is the name of the game with development task team and Debbie Farley on her return from Salani ITI stopping in.

Contradiction: Intensifying the "set" set-up while maintaining a low profile necessitated by flaccid frame. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Town of Gingin is set up for CMA in our "set" complete with Shire backing. This means we have crucial Shire authorization in two of three Shires in which we intend to do CMA. RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Whirlwind week of impact sees first two community meetings held in the area this quarter, involving 29 high school youth and a small river community. Development team receives \$1,070 in hand and \$8,450 working from 25 visits.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between moving one step at a time, doing comprehensive planning and daring to risk an imaginal leap. (Wk. 10)

Contradiction: Creating a motivating public story for community meeting "sets" as our vision for implementation clarifies. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Kath Walker, noted Aboriginal poet, impacts Murrin Bridge community as well as Lake Cargelligo as she spends one day reading poetry and talking with people in three schools, one church and a local hotel. The community events include Bush Youth Picnic with emu cooked by the men and organized by new Care Workers, poetry readings in several houses, film showing of her life and climaxed by gifts exchange of carved emu egg and screen-printed skirt and matching bag.

Internal: Kath Walker is hosted for breakfast and in impromptu visit at the end of her stay she opens her address book and guides us for future strategies.

External: Realizing TASC vision has been outrun, staff analyzes global symposium indices in relation to Area Suva and creates 4-year grand strategy, four 1-year strategies, quarterly objectives for 1980 and key maneuvers for the next six weeks, resolving to be ready to send out teams to launch five Copra Lagoon System pilot demonstrations by April 1st. Contradiction: How to concretely and catalytically participate in our new neighborhood in a manner which releases events across Hartford and the state. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Town Supervisor visits core meeting to share not only dreams but specific plans for youth and elders recreational land and facility and is eager to work with Charlottesville HDP to bring youth and elder plans to fruition.

Internal: Evening with the Institute is great collegial and informative event for metro and House members.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in framing, core training, Charlottesville: Valley Firewood options, and other keystone proposals in the absence of clear death ground. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: House does personal visits to stir up support for neighborhood block party in South End neighborhood. Starks' 185th birthday party and winter carnival event have good attendance.

Rogerio inkinds rabies vaccine, comes out with dog vaccinator and vaccinates all the dogs in the plaza. Prefect signs the papers to allow the Bananeiras Preschool to be the first private school to receive the state lunch program subsidies.

Internal: Day II time design is altered to include an evening of auxiliary Portuguese TM training.

Contradiction: Creating the myth which allows everyone to transparentize the mystery, depth and greatness of Carnival. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

Project leadership, builders and health caretakers, take full responsibility for meetings and activities and decision. External: Visit by the Ministry of Education National Planning Institute and UNDP offers the village a new preschool complete with furniture, teachers and salaries. Friday night Secretariat meeting reveals strength of village leaders.

Internal: Saturday night Thanksgiving dinner becomes a sendout party for the Castros.

Contradiction: Containing the explosions that are happening simultaneously in the Project, Development and the Movement. (Wk. 10)

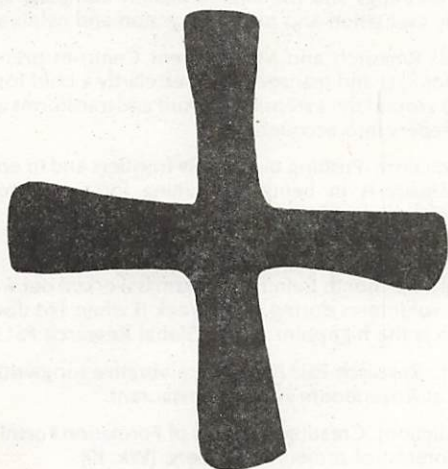

Pere Toulat, Secretary General of Justice and Peace sends letter to the French Committee Against Hunger, to free money for India. Fifty-thousand French franc proposal to Ministry of Cooperation is submitted to open Abidjan House in spring.

Internal: Dominique Mathiot performs a miracle in raising all his travel for Academy—\$712—in two weeks from local Town Meeting colleagues; Sister Yvonne Guenec sojourns.

Contradiction: Building practical structures at the initial stage of colleague journey to allow them to become active. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Patrons lunch involves 16 key leaders from industry, government and religious community in Belgium. August Vanistendael and Paris Guardian, Mr. Gerald Nani, report on the work of the Institute. Each participant promises support—from LENS for his company to introduction to Catholic Educators throughout Belgium.

Internal: Nexus tackles continental formation head on initiating practics task forces to broaden input and to handle the details of the upcoming cluster of formation activities.

Internal: Suzanne completes hospital stay and starts back to work again.

Contradiction: Doing comprehensive job on base maneuvers without having the benefit of corporate input (Wk. 10)

FRANKFURT**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Evening with the Institute with 22 guests, all new contacts, is a fine event with global film and conversation until almost midnight. The crowning event is mounting a 30 X 50 cm (1 X 1 1/2 ft) gold aluminum sign with ICA in English and German on the wall at street entrance just hours before the event. ICA books/OE books put in new form in two-day management PSU and circuit through Stuttgart Region.

Internal: House attends Ecumenical Institute Board meeting and sees the very strong, sincere and dedicated support of the Board members.

Contradiction: Slowing Village Forum momentum. (Wk. 11)

CAIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP**

External: A signal guild meeting uncovers solid team activity as the Marmalade Team, the Community Kitchen, the Public Work Corps and the Bayad Builders write their stories and create their symbols. Sixty-five students complete the new Community Center foundation.

Internal: The visit of the Cairo Women's Club (future GWF participants) motivates House hosting with tea and cake followed by a tour which includes the new Marmalade Building.

Contradiction: Keeping your hand inside the Gom Jabbar of victory. (Wk. 8)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Operations team returns from North Nakuru with site selected for Village Meeting Saturation which will not only awaken the villagers but will help priorities relative to site selection. Workday in Kabiro continues foundation preparation for demo house. Old friend, Mr. L.V. Shah of E.A. Seed Ltd., contributes seeds for Kilisa-Kyamue demonstration farm.

Internal: Wayside Inn dynamic continues: Godfrey and Margaret Mokosha sent out to Nigeria; Wesley Lachman passes through from Zambia to Nigeria to do LENS; Margarete Galle arrives from Germany for six-week sojourn.

Contradiction: Timelining priority actions when all are urgent. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcell Community Health Caretaker from Stake 4 registers 150 mothers on Clinic Day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenyan Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmers' preparation at farms, troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI facility. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY-MALIWADA HDP

External: Women's Advancement Module training held for 30 ICA staff women and three Sevagram HDP village women in preparation for five, 5-day modules in district projects this quarter creates a new vision and sense of collegiality among the women of Nava Gram Prayas. First impact and GRA recruitment foray to Jabalpur reopens that region to the movement.

Internal: Global Methods School PSU creates the means to convey the depth of the internal life to the 25 district projects while HDTI recruitment teams hold collegiums on daily ritual and demonstrate use of the *Internal Life Guide*.

Contradiction: Ensuring participation of key village leadership in upcoming HDTI. (Wk. 6)

Area staff receive invitation from Prof. Wendy, Director of Village Reconstruction Organization (with 300 village projects), to come to Vijaywada Region to discuss leadership training. Government project to upgrade Nadlapur Road starts.

Internal: V. Durguiah sent to Area Priors Council in Bombay. Images of the future conditioned by news of Indira Gandhi's promise of Rs 1,000,000 for development of our Taluka..

Contradiction: Unmotivating contexts on the purpose of leadership training. (Wk. 11)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: On the road collegiums and Roundtable with old and new colleagues mark week of adding new dimensions to spirit sustenance.

Internal: Three (including two colleagues from continent) do ten events in five days covering three states. (Bihar, Arissa, W. Bengal).

Contradiction: Breaking open more people with whom to do concrete negotiations in relationship to site selection. (Wk. 10)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Scott Morris and Alfrieda Wilkins sent to Bubun to join Hilary for major Indonesian financial accounting trek.

Internal: Chinese New Year celebrates the Year of the Monkey! Kong Hee Fatt Choy!

Contradiction: Thinking through use of Nexus facility in bringing off direct mission in region KL. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SERUSUP-HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTs and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Wedge Team, part of Singapore Nexus and K.L. House lay out context for the first Extension Module; K.L. is ready to move after an all-day planning session. Internal: Another week of global presence with the arrival of the Management Team, intentional E.G. curriculum initiated, and fresh decor goes up.

Contradiction: Assigning teams to move on specific maneuvers rather than simply doing tactics. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN-BUBUN HDP

External: The second week of the Bubun Advanced Training School came to an end with 32 full-time volunteers participating in a 24-hour, 4-session Odyssey on the Journey of Those Who Care marking a decision in their own preparation and journey. External: Great week of construction is highlighted with inking of 200 bags of cement, completion of the first floor interior walls, and the first coating of finishing cement on the whole Community Center.

Internal: Entire House attends Panchayat visit, an experience of depth care which refocuses missional sense of being a House.

Contradiction: Using keystone results as springboard for extension. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: On the home front Kinney celebrates winter with the second annual winter frolic. Barbara helps Marshall County celebrate the completion of 10 TMs with an assembly attended by over 70. The highlight of the week is getting four yeses to HDTs in Lorimor.

Contradiction: Finding the way to do the mission while meeting the demand of self-support. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: A conference with a state university results in hearty authorization for forums to be held in university dormitories; details will be discussed with dormitory representatives.

Internal: Youth tribal migration is speedily accomplished, youth are pleased, and former rooms are cleaned and prepared for guests.

Contradiction: Following-up on completed actions to set the stage for future victories. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

Contradiction: Translating enthusiasm into concreteness. (Wk. 11)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Wilton, Conn. consenses to have a day-long TM and forms a steering committee. The President of the Town Association (and father of the writer of the book, *Passages*) gave the ICA consultants an "insiders" tour of the town.

Internal: An evening of fellowship with German music and stories of Kreuzberg Ost from Bernd Arnold-Broch and slides and stories of El Bayad from Said Riskallah provide a refreshing celebration to end the week.

Contradiction: Devising schemes which allow people to see that they can take responsibility for their local community. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: House engages in private sector development push resulting in eight calls and eight proposals submitted for \$32,000; corporation chairman of the board offers to host ICA introductory event for other corporation heads.

Internal: New finance models and resume writing push economic undergirding.

Contradiction: Ensuring the two strategic wins which will open up our work in Asylum Hill as a "demonstration". (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Town Supervisor visits core meeting to share not only dreams but specific plans for youth and elders recreational land and facility and is eager to work with Charlottesville HDP to bring youth and elder plans to fruition.

Internal: Lunch-time Sun Tzu studies assist broodings on long-range strategy.

Contradiction: Letting past images of "leaving the project" blind future image of transition. (Wk. 10)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Seven agricultural engineers, candidates for resident agronomist, visit Sol de Septiembre for an orientation to the project and a description of the position, and communities surrounding Sol are explored for good community forum sites for March.

Internal: Seventy-five people of Sol accompany Joaquina Rodriguez to the airport as she becomes Sol de Septiembre's first ambassador in service to the world's communities.

Contradiction: Intensifying focus on external task with the same intensity as that given to the internal life planning and brooding. (Wk. 9).

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Community Carnival banner goes up welcoming countless visitors to Bananeiras' four-day festival of Samba dancing in the streets. Rogerio inkindes rabies vaccine, comes out with dog vaccinator and vaccinates all the dogs in the plaza. Prefect signs the papers to allow the Bananeiras Preschool to be the first private school to receive the state lunch program subsidies.

Internal: Day II time design is altered to include an evening of auxiliary Portuguese TM training.

Contradiction: Creating the myth which allows everyone to transparentize the mystery, depth and greatness of Carnival. (Wk. 10)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

Project leadership, builders and health caretakers, take full responsibility for meetings and activities and decision. Internal: Saturday night Thanksgiving dinner becomes a sendout party for the Castros.

Contradiction: Containing the explosions that are happening simultaneously in the Project, Development and the Movement. (Wk. 10)

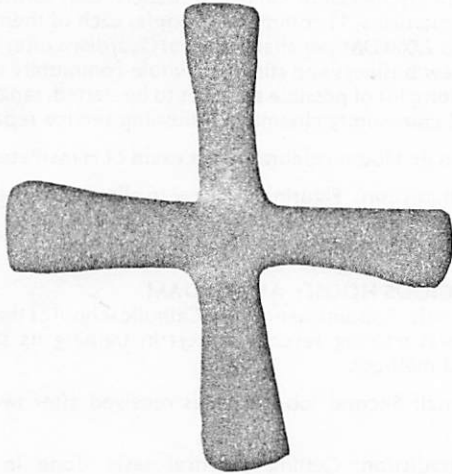
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Invitations are mailed for Panchayat visitation event, Guardians meeting and Formation Fortnight. The entire House attends Continental Council in Brussels.

Internal: Bruce and Kathy Bauknight heal House financial accounting during Management Trek.

Contradiction: Creating areal maneuvers for recruitment of "Primal Community: The Next Decade". (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Patrons lunch involves 16 key leaders from industry, government and religious community in Belgium. August Vanistendael and Paris Guardian, Mr. Gerald Nani, report on the work of the Institute. Each participant promises support—from LENS for his company to introduction to Catholic Educators throughout Belgium.

Internal: House celebrates arrival of Ray Spencer, Neil Vance and Bill Parker with fantastic Saturday night feast and great House Church.

Contradiction: Enabling events in the village which create corporateness and sustain consistent victories. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DOUALA

External: Gerald Nani, French Guardian, joins Biel on two-week framing and authorization trek through West Africa.

Internal: Suzanne completes hospital stay and starts back to work again.

Contradiction: Doing comprehensive job on base maneuvers without having the benefit of corporate input (Wk. 10)

FRANKFURT**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Evening with the Institute with 22 guests, all new contacts, is a fine event with global film and conversation until almost midnight. The crowning event is mounting a 30 X 50 cm (1 X 1 1/2 ft) gold aluminum sign with ICA in English and German on the wall at street entrance just hours before the event. ICA books/OE books put in new form in two-day management PSU and circuit through Stuttgart Region.

Internal: Whole House together for the first time since Week 1 and unexpected check boosts House out of the red and into the black for the year.

Internal: Second job permit is received after two month's wait.

Contradiction: Getting practical tasks done in midst of whirlwind. (Wk. 12)

STOCKHOLM**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: Sixteen Guardians arrive at the House for Panchayat evening and see Global Film. Guardian in the tax department offers assistance for future incorporation and tax exemption when House is ready.

Small teams visit in the Stakes getting surprising samples of people's handiwork. Small teams again fan across Lusaka discovering that businesses are very happy to have the articles to sell—from handcarved wooden spoons to demo farm pigs.

Internal: House attends Ecumenical Institute Board meeting and sees the very strong, sincere and dedicated support of the Board members.

Contradiction: Slowing Village Forum momentum. (Wk. 11)

CAIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP**

External: East Bank Cluster is initiated and Village Meeting Egypt is launched with Community Forums in Beni Soliman and Til Abu Maruz.

Internal: The mystery of the land around is experienced as staff stages a picnic among the stony, windbeaten desert hills of the Eastern Sahara.

Contradiction: Catalyzing the village to refine its story about its own human development to enable Bayad people to call forth the cluster and the cluster villages to do themselves. (Wk. 12)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: NORAD comes to Kawangware/Kabiro with two men from Oslo who are willing to entertain proposal and are impacted by the size of the task in Kabiro but also the possibilities. Group of Danish volunteers also visit Kawangware/Kabiro as part of their orientation to Kenya. Four Project Directors from Machakos District impact government officers as they march into offices with models in their pockets and visions for the future of the villages of Kenya.

Internal: Robert and Sandra Rafos return from Zambia and immediately become full-time LENS set-up team.

Contradiction: Coordinating planning structure which allows posts to continue to respond to the demands of replication and to maintain flexibility. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcell Community Health Caretaker from Stake 4 registers 150 mothers on Clinic Day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenyan Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmers' preparation at farms, troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI facility. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY-MALIWADA HDP

External: Women's Advancement Module training held for 30 ICA staff women and three Sevagram HDP village women in preparation for five, 5-day modules in district projects this quarter creates a new vision and sense of collegiality among the women of Nava Gram Prayas. First impact and GRA recruitment foray to Jabalpur reopens that region to the movement.

Internal: Global Methods School PSU creates the means to convey the depth of the internal life to the 25 district projects while HDTI recruitment teams hold collegiums on daily ritual and demonstrate use of the *Internal Life Guide*.

Contradiction: Ensuring participation of key village leadership in upcoming HDTI. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: The first HDTI for village leaders is completed with 21 participants from across Maharashtra. It marks a shift to training mature village leaders who return to their own community with new decisions to play the leadership role. Their key learning is the value of corporateness. This is the first school in which the four divisions are represented on the faculty.

Internal: The visit of the Panchayat to Maliwada reveals again the powerful demonstration which Maliwada is, while Global Research Centrum celebrates the completion of the HDTI with feast and festival in the midst of Holi, the color throwing festival.

Contradiction: Creating the winning story and timeline to get everything won. (Wk. 12)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI-SIKROR HDP

External: Mid-project transition event is catalyzing rapid actuation across the programs including collection of Rs 400 for road bricks in Stake 4, permission for 75 bags of cement for stalled Community Center from local government, temple roadbricking restarted, inkind hand-pump installed on Harijan well and pest control and grain storage throughout the village. First visit to Lucknow made to being work on state frame and tax exemption while unrequested site visit is made by Deputy-Ambassador of Burma.

Internal: Reordering Delhi House space and cleaning Delhi office after transition event releasing new staff motivity.

Contradiction: Maintaining the actuation momentum gained by the transition event in the midst of document completion and Global Panchayat visitaton. (Wk. 8)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Eleven village leaders and auxiliary representing Maharashtra Housing Cooperatives visit Nadlapur Housing Colony. Housing plans also requested by Sikror HDP. Area staff receive invitation from Prof. Wendy, Director of Village Reconstruction Organization (with 300 village projects), to come to Vijaywada Region to discuss leadership training. Government project to upgrade Nadlapur Road starts.

Internal: V. Durguiah sent to Area Priors Council in Bombay. Images of the future conditioned by news of Indira Gandhi's promise of Rs 1,000,000 for development of our Taluka..

Contradiction: Unmotivating contexts on the purpose of leadership training. (Wk. 11)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Concrete negotiations for project funding from the private sector is initiated. With half the House on assignment outside the area the impact thrust continues with six Gram Sabhas and one Gram Sabha training event.

Internal: Collegium rehearses the foundational aspects of order.

Contradiction: Identifying the private and public sector not for initiating the Human Development Project. (Wk. 12)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: WEDGE trek concludes in fine style with area prior at Nexus and document detailing region-by-region consensus on strategies for Area Singapore.

Internal: House hosts Sandy Powell's parents, the Conants from Waco, Texas, and celebrates three emerging generation birthdays with two parties.

Contradiction: Increasing self-support mechanism for rest of year in midst of very fluid assignments and shifting of anticipated income sources. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SERUSUP-HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTs and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Wedge Team, part of Singapore Nexus and K.L. House lay out context for the first Extension Module; K.L. is ready to move after an all-day planning session. The village plants 100 sugar cane seedlings and prepares ground for coffee and cocoa plants. Development closes the month with \$4,000 plus.

Internal: K.L. House takes Wedge Team to Kajang for Satay. Sandy Powell's parents visit Sungai Lui on Alison Powell's fourth birthday.

Contradiction: Having the eyes to see project as a global demonstration with methods internalized and village structures actuated. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Jakarta Guardian from JIS dies unexpectedly. Needed provincial agreements are tied up in government bureaucracy. Chickens are ordered.

Internal: Another week of global presence with the arrival of the Management Team, intentional E.G. curriculum initiated, and fresh decor goes up.

Contradiction: Assigning teams to move on specific maneuvers rather than simply doing tactics. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN-BUBUN HDP

External: ICA team of six conducts four-hour workshop for North Sumatra Rural Development, at meeting of 22 Headmen whose villages were chosen as the best in the province. Preschool module taught in Bubun for village cluster representatives who in next week's circuit intend to initiate preschools in every cluster village. Wife of Governor sends invitation to visit her office to discuss women's program for province.

Internal: House celebrates both Jennings-Teats birthdays this week, new white coconut husk walkway is laid and new window mountings are installed thus increasing ventilation and security.

Contradiction: Building story of accomplishment in Bubun and cluster village which lets them see what has happened and enables them to decide to make new leaps. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG-BONTOA HDP

External: Preschool restarts following rains and rice planting. Fishpond Guild leaders attend information meeting on World Bank Loan Program for 1%-interest loans now available through the People's Bank of Indonesia (BRI). Bontoa leaders gather to rethink DOOP methods.

Internal: The suspense is over: it's a boy, Robert Joseph Shankland joins staff weighing in at 35 kg. (7.75 lbs) and 52 cm. (20.5 in.)

Contradiction: Finding the story that allows staff and village to move it amidst deafening silence from the government about HDTS proposal and Year II budgets. (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Area Council corporate financial planning is enabled by a working packet prepared by Management and Development. Documentation in Kwang Yung II Ri reveals village income quadrupled. Collaboration with Nam Wai on development, LENS marketing, and urban probe begins to give form to the enigma that is Hong Kong.

Internal: House celebrates Michael Elliot's fifth birthday and his mother's 35th.

Contradiction: Designing practical ways to claim the victory of 70/80 which begins to articulate the commonality of stated directions. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Week with development troops uncovers new possibilities for Nam Wai's rapid development of needed programs.

Internal: House sends two to Area Council and one to celebrate the completed life of his mother.

Contradiction: Insuring sustained growth over the long haul in HDP. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: Second Edition of Hai Ou newspaper is completed, while building's interior is completed.

Internal: New staff member Lin L Ho becomes miracle worker completing newspaper in record time.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum on all work as Community Centre draws near to completion. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Development trek follow-up nets \$40,000. Checks arrive from Davao and Cebu. Citibank continues support for Sudtonggan Ciba-Geegy-Swiss Drug firm releases \$2,000

Internal: House welcomes Katherine Cheng back to Area from Quarters I and II in North America and Leonard Sizer on route to Cebu and India.

Contradiction: Expanding resources of space and currency to hold signal area celebrative event. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Development scores big with companies which we had given up on.

Internal: Liu Chuan (Alice Liu) is sent out by House and family to the Philippines, Hong Kong and the Academy.

Contradiction: Maintaining the new leap in development whilst holding the tension in all aspects of the mission. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUBTONGGAN HDP

External: Twenty-four Village Fairs are held simultaneously producing 2,000 contestants for the Mactan Island 24 Fair to be held this Friday. Preparation week is topped off by teachers' island meeting at Mayor's rest house with swimming and volleyball. Two weeks of intensive development calling in Manila result in barrage of top level visitors to Mactan: U.S. Minister-Counselor (Ambassador's Assistant), U.S. Consul (Cebu), Coca-Cola, Citibank, Atlas-Copco and Dow Chemical.

Internal: House begins Lenten Season with 5:30 Ash Wednesday mass and gives up its jeep, generator and staff of ten members to the Lusaran Consult in the Cebu Mountains.

Contradiction: Deciding that every aspect of our work is replicable and, therefore, requires procedures and documentation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Biggest tomato in Davao is harvested in Langub demonstration garden. MCMPP starts with 800 children in one week.

Internal: In the midst of ecclesiola study, House sends out Linda for documentation in Cebu and welcomes back Lester from Manila audit.

Contradiction: Waltzing in the mountain P/S aiming with a thousand kids. (Wk. 9)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: This is a week of big visits: 1) The Governor of Yamanashi Prefecture whose top priority is community building; 2) The head of the community movement in Shizuoka Prefecture; 3) The Mayor of Uenohara who organized 59 neighborhood meetings involving 50% of his town as a follow-up to our October TM; 4) The Managing Director of Seibu Department Store. Each visit is a solid future-oriented yes. New brochure "The Programs of Human Development" is delivered to a new inkind printer who also signs up to be an English student.

Internal: Anniversary party is held for the Thomson Family; Mr. Nichiguchi from Osaka visits in anticipation of moving to Tokyo and possibly joining the House.

Contradiction: Wielding an effective short sword during Quarter IV to intensify the amazing victory of the long sword during Quarter III. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Three hundred Kwang Yung Il Ri youth gather for Lunar New Year Talent Contest.

Internal: House participates in marriage of sojourner, Miss Jung.

Contradiction: Reframing in light of new governor appointment to Jeju Do. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Key movement colleagues gather the evening of "the great move" to celebrate the existence of the new ICA facility. Support is pledged for furnishing the House, programming activities and planning for a large metro meeting.

Internal: Seoul culminates extended facility search with the move to a permanent, two-story, twelve-room house just south of the city center next to the Hyatt Regency Hotel.

Contradiction: Giving revolutionary focus to the possibilities the facility now provides. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: At village meeting 10 people volunteer to work in the HDTs including helping with the 60 Town Meetings this month. They take first training session. Seoul churches give \$250.

Internal: Ester and Naomi Lazear sent out to Seoul as their parents return from Samoa ITI.

Contradiction: Finishing the road while the motor is running and the vehicle is loaded. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: TM circuiters are welcomed with intense interest in Saga Kermamoto prefecture offices. Saga prefecture recommends TM to cities sight unseen. City of Kita-Kyusu circuit leads to invitation to lunch with influential men's club, Nishi-Nippon Business Club.

Internal: House gives dinner to celebrate the parents of Kazuko Awane, a regional volunteer who is a strong circuiter and TM workshop leader.

Contradiction: Activating the practical glue to hold together the wild kaleidoscope of happenings. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Visits in Tokushima Prefecture broaden authorization with prefecture government and schedule two TM's. Setting appointment with General Affairs Department in Nara begins second front in that prefecture. Visit with Vice Governor of Kyoto Prefecture "frames" our third stronghold.

Internal: Landlord's letter stating that use of inkind facility will terminate at the end of May catalyzes creative possibilities for staying and for going.

Contradiction: Moving with power everyday while dealing with the unexpected. (Wk. 12)

Internal: Mr. Tonasaki from Tokyo House visits and catalyzes new energy.

Contradiction: Releasing people in many towns to engagement outside their own towns. (Wk. 12)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: The great week of jumping through the hoops includes Shire Council office space assigned to the Wyong circuit team, 600 "Have-a-Go Gazettes" mailed out, postage inked and 33 development visits held resulting in \$1,400 in-hand cash.

Internal: Hosting is the name of the game with development task team and Debbie Farley on her return from Salani ITI stopping in.

Contradiction: Intensifying the "set" set-up while maintaining a low profile necessitated by flaccid frame. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Bullsbrook sets tentative date for CMA during March Campaign. Adelaide Campaign learnings shared by first-hand experience. Startling response to campaign preparation workshop as nine people gather around planning table and all commit time.

Internal: Bob returns from Adelaide Campaign totaling six weeks of missional engagement. Financing prepared for circuiting car.

Contradiction: Discerning the real victory among many thirsts for many victories. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: With both House troops permeating, regional colleagues make development calls, inkind materials for Murrin Bridge Women's Industry and continue RS-I recruitment. Mike Tippett and Debbie Farly are sent out to assist in the Victoria and Queensland Community Meeting Campaigns.

External: Twin engine chartered flight secured and filled with five for Murrin Bridge job seminar. Huge inkind victory fills station wagon with biscuits, cereals, bread, tin goods etc. for seminar. Area development team receives great encouragement from Mayne Nickless advising us to submit \$5,000 proposal.

Internal: Regional colleagues create lively ecclesiola by bringing refreshments and leading fine sodality. John Burbidge performs miracle on the front lawn and public space.

Contradiction: Keeping eye on strategic objective while pursuing every new opening. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Kath Walker, noted Aboriginal poet, impacts Murrin Bridge community as well as Lake Cargelligo as she spends one day reading poetry and talking with people in three schools, one church and a local hotel. The community events include Bush Youth Picnic with emu cooked by the men and organized by new Care Workers, poetry readings in several houses, film showing of her life and climaxed by gifts exchange of carved emu egg and screen-printed skirt and matching bag.

Internal: Kath Walker is hosted for breakfast and in impromptu visit at the end of her stay she opens her address book and guides House for future strategies.

Contradiction: Capturing the new vision before it wanes with newly awakened people. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Mailing sent to Division alerts key persons of the impending Wide Bay-Burnett Division maneuver.

Internal: House welcomes Mike Tippett from Adelaide and Margaret Piper back from Sydney for the Community Meeting Set Campaign.

Contradiction: Securing the immediate victory which will impart needed momentum allowing untried models to win. (Wk. 12)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: TASC staff practices Copra Lagoon System 4 X 4 on themselves and overflow with enthusiasm and excites the outer island merchants who come in. Warehouse gets a new paint job and a beautiful new symbol on the front as the "Miracle Quarter-Mile" begins to blossom again after the disaster.

Internal: Task force dynamic breaks loose new creativity and forces a real struggle with holding the tension between daily operations, crucial analysis, and critical new employee training.

Contradiction: Creating the transition model which allows laying track miles ahead of the oncoming freight train. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: ITI grads and ICA teams circuit the village with art form conversation about the first seven pages of the Samoan Document. In one week, 14 family visits complete Stake V.

Internal: House implements new Week I—Week II time design including fortnightly village meeting on Thursdays, Friday morning village workday, Saturday morning House planning and Sunday afternoon House Church with village ITI grads and three nights a week Samoan lessons with the whole House.

Contradiction: Transforming the "wait and see" mind set. (Wk. 11)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Circuits experience new orbit as one steering committee sets up another. SIF participants train to do Forums in their county and service club contacts us to offer funding.

Internal: E.G. outnumber adults on Week II as three priors are continentally assigned and one adult and three youth do summer travel fund maneuver in Sacramento.

Contradiction: Shifting models to focus remaining troops on 8-week maneuver keystones. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Parents' Club holds first meeting of 1980 and 60 people attend. New officers are elected. Richgrove Development Association 1978-79 finances are summarized.

Internal: International colleagues again travel to Los Angeles to enable TM in Spanish-speaking communities.

Contradiction: Implementing keystones by June. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Renewed participation in events is evident as representatives from Cusick give presentations in two neighboring communities at Kiwanis and Senior Citizens meetings.

Internal: Basil Sharp and Colleen Smith are sent out to Lorimer HDTS as staff and participant.

Contradiction: Checking the economic reflex and responding objectively to the global demand. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: A meeting of Guardians from Bellingham and Seattle caps a week in which a four-week campaign on development is begun; and in which framing with workshop data is completed in the arenas of Local Advocacy, Expanded Funding Base, Network Advocacy, Public Face, Church Relations and Legal Structures.

Internal: House celebrates first check for \$250 with round of scotch and sodas as we prepare for the annual meeting of the boards for the ICA and EI and create workshop procedures for dealing in the local with the continental credibility gaps.

Contradiction: Moving on expansion of development contacts on behalf of the creation of North American Continental Maneuvers. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Staff grids the urban area around the University of Southern California, which includes House, to intensify work with the schools—still working on name for the area. Development Campaign is launched to purchase irrigation equipment for Bayad.

Internal: Edge collegiums begin which launch Development Campaign and Special Issues Forum on transportation.

Contradiction: Seeing through the maze of new concrete openings to the specific tactical actions we now need to take. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Staff is welcomed by Bishop James Rausch of the Phoenix Catholic Diocese who throws open the doors of the Chancery and recommends getting parish priests to sponsor TM's in the Phoenix inner-city. Eye-opening session is held with top staffer from the Arizona Office of Economic Planning and Development who would like grassroots input for both her agency and for the Department of Economic Security—the two largest state service agencies.

External: Winter crop harvest begins with marketing stand. Adobe walls go up on the model house and three proposals are submitted for small farms program.

Internal: Guests include Mr. Dethe doing land use planning; Dot Probst from Tucson doing architectural consulting; and Bud Philbrook from Control Data in Minneapolis to write concept paper for small farms project.

Contradiction: Matching technical assistance and training with critical program expansion. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Exploratory visit to several communities in Billings Metro gives insights on what the move on signal communities may look like.

Internal: New time design allows E.G. to launch the day and the rest of the House to end day with midnight snack and collegium.

Contradiction: Articulating the one task in the midst of multiple opportunities. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: HDTs advance team arrives and puts together Cannon Ball HDTs budget. Conversation on funding possibilities breaks loose new recruitment images for the Reservations' participants. Industry sells out inventory and installs new fire escape at the school.

Internal: House celebration in Bismark with dinner and movie celebrates Cannon Ball movie on TV for first time.

Contradiction: Moving on HDTs while keeping all other plates spinning locally. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: First draft of Colorado Report on small towns and neighborhoods is completed. Boulder Campaign is boosted by first neighborhood TM series set for March 12-18. Neighborhood TM brochure goes to printer.

Internal: Dave Mundy lands a good job. Alan celebrates his 14th birthday and the girls sell 70 boxes of girl scout cookies allowing for all kinds of celebration.

Contradiction: Sensing that we must be prepared to hold our balance on the surfboard while the wave is rapidly rising. (Wk. 10)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: The 75th Commission of the Provincial Government gives \$2,000 for the Community Forum Campaign. Three demonstration forums are held and three forum dates are set. County worker, who sponsored the county-wide Motivity Forum, said she has seen the action plans from the forum up on the walls of the community halls with people working on them.

Internal: In the midst of working with the public patrol on Vogar issues, meal conversations provide the corporate grist for sermons and Voyage spins.

Contradiction: Keeping objectivity and perspective in the midst of crisis and immediacy. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Sixth Forum in the Fraser Valley is held in Straiton. Maneuver tie-up is initiated with assembly invitations sent to Forum towns. The finest newsletter ever published here "Inside 80: Communities Alive" is designed, written and sent to printer by colleagues.

Internal: Incredible ecclesiola with five guests and two extra E.G. plans India's future, then writes articles for the newsletter.

Contradiction: Organizing time and troops to give the appropriate emphasis to all major priorities. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE-MINTO HDP
