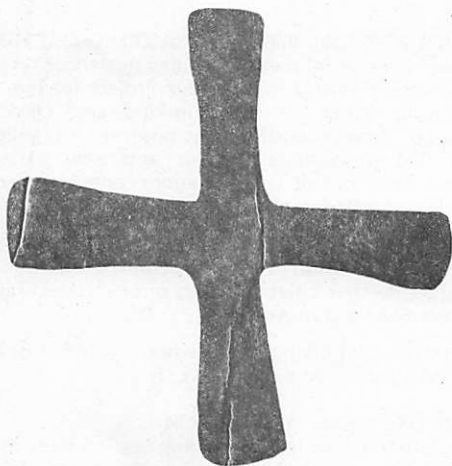

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Statements by colleagues who participated in the continental Formation Fortnight, Academy, patron's event preparation, and Tai'rgwaith building push manifest strong decision to care for the region, area, continent, and world.

Internal: Twenty Area London participants at the Formation Fortnight and Art Smith's assignment to Tai'rgwaith concretely reinforce decision to bring off the area.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between moving straight into the remainder of the quarter and creating the still unclear but necessary new. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Circuits are launched following great continental formation event. Staff participates in key EEC visit to Isle of Dogs.

Internal: One month of sunny weather prompts House to transform tatty yard and front into picturesque garden.

Contradiction: Deepening the regional formation while ensuring area metro circuits are covered. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Bristol circuit nets two seriously considering Formation Fortnight and sets date for first ecclesiola with colleagues in Bristol. Village completes building foundation and levels ground.

Internal: Area circuit team assigned to Bristol and Dublin Regions meets to create Project backup maneuvers.

Contradiction: Enabling community to see future economic node as a crucially needed demonstration of the economic viability of villages in Wales. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Manchester colleague participation in continental Formation Fortnight surfaces new possibilities for the region.

Internal: Around the edges conversations among colleagues at Formation Fortnight re-ignite old fires.

Contradiction: Holding in tension the regional long-range and quarter possibilities. (Wk. 6)

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Caritas Madrid social workers request TMs throughout province of Madrid. Bishop of Granada says yes to future work in his diocese. Caritas Espanol also says yes to ICA TM proposal.

Internal: New Madrid House is cleaned up and painted in one week at owner's expense.

Contradiction: Extending networks to the public sector. (Wk. 6)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Two French participants attend the entire Primal Community: The Next Decade training program in Brussels. An animateur from Grenoble participates in the final Week II symposium. Gerald Nani helps House plan quarter events calendar.

Internal: Another of a continuous stream of small House refurbishing miracles results in the kitchen being painted and becoming human work space.

Contradiction: Operating effectively off the Formation Fortnight momentum between remaneuvering Week IIs. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Great prayer meeting with panchayat includes reports on visits to areas in Africa, NAME, and Europe.

Internal: Panchayat celebration involves colleagues from the city in a Julien Bream concert followed by pizza party.

Contradiction: Creating the systems to get through the Fortnight and get a new quarter launched simultaneously. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Circuits nail down participation of nine people in the Primal Community: The Next Decade Research and Training Fortnight. Guardian hosts dinner with key people in Lige Metro putting a stake in Wallania frame.

Internal: Movement event shifts visitors into colleagues at Panchayat visitation concert.

Contradiction: Accelerating awakenment sets while focusing on training and formulation. (Wk. 3)

ROME

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TERMINE HDP

External: Local colleague decides to take responsibility for Cooperative industry and helps launch the cooperative members into a new orbit of activity and responsibility. Three-hour old sojourner travels with three staff to Brussels Formation Fortnight.

Internal: Attending the Easter celebration at St. Peter's Square along with 100,000 from around the world impacts the House with the global church as the Pope gives Easter greetings in 20 languages.

Contradiction: Finding ways to turn the dial of responsibility for the mission on regional colleagues. (Wk. 5)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJÈDE HDP

External: Ijede's Social Commission is set-up for the first meeting. Two-month salaries paid in full to the Ijede Community Industries marks village victory. After initial contact through LENS, the Nigerian Rubber Board (government para-statal) openly receives a proposal to support, through funds, field staff, transport and village contacts, and an initial cluster of Village Meeting programs.

Internal: Penny Portman arrives for the GWF trek, and has inside high level contacts through former students with the Permanent Secretary of External Affairs, and the Former Nigerian Ambassador to France.

Contradiction: Giving form to all dynamics of community organization quickly. (Wk. 5)

ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: Translation and submitting of necessary governmental requests for free housing and program funding and a dinner with group of Abidjan residents enliven images of rapid program initiation.

Internal: House establishes a temporary location with telephone, puts up decor, unpacks missional materials, and celebrates Area's first House Church.

Contradiction: Deciding to move boldly in the midst of getting our feet on the ground. (Wk. 6)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: After two weeks of extensive circuits and phone calls 18 people from eight regions are committed for the Formation Fortnight with more than 30 still considering attending. House spends Week II on documentation of Town Meeting, writing stories of Gemeinde forum and follow-up and creating visual charts of challenges and geographic coverage to serve as data for the Fortnight's work.

Internal: Holy Week includes canonical hours, Scripture readings, mural, 10 minutes in the Dark Night, watching the Gospel According to St. Matthew on TV, Passion music, two space miracles in the basement, and quarter battle-planning.

Contradiction: Finding corporate time for the corporate task. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: One day of metro circuiting nets three registrations for Formation Fortnight with four Project leaders strongly considering. Week of more in-kind and Development victories by Project Development Taskforce is highlighted by 15,000 DM professional lay-out and new plate-making machine. Area council, United Nations conference, and youth group from Hamburg make Kreuzberg Ost the center of the whirlwind.

Internal: House Church, after area council with four regional colleagues present, celebrates area prior's birthday and sends Margreet Farid out to Academy.

Contradiction: Thinking "big" when small not only seems beautiful but realistic as well. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Workshop leader training session with 28 present kicks off Ratingen West (near Dusseldorf) set. All pick up assignments as leadership in some event during week.

Internal: New job situation creates new visions of possibilities for Amsterdam House next year.

Contradiction: Releasing new images of formulation possibilities into region. (Wk. 6)

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: Pastor Viggo and Mona Mollerup arrive at 10:00 p.m. with blanket letter of authorization only two hours after request and stay until midnight.

Internal: Professor Anaesthetics locates a three month appointment beginning June 1.

Contradiction: Making facility secure enough for staff to be missionally effective. (Wk. 6)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-KAPINI HDP

External: Thirty-eight Village Forums are done in Kasama. LENS is held in Ndola. Quarterly celebration preparation as well as the pre-school teachers' celebration take place at the end of their term.

Internal: House sends out Eusebio for an HDTI in Nairobi and LENS team, and welcomes Village Forum team and Mr. Kangwa.

Contradiction: Discovering the troop configuration that wins on all fronts. (Wk. 6)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Community Development Association launches fly-free village campaign through procuring of in-kind equipment and insecticide from Wellcome Foundation.

Internal: New quarter assignments allow the new women of Egypt to claim priorship roles.

Contradiction: Seeing through the morass of tactics preceding the CEM to the miracle swirls that spin into the extension phase. (Wk. 5)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Ford Foundation okays grants for Zambia and Kenya—word from director of local Ford office: "We won!" NORAD comes through with 16,000 KES for 10 scholarships for second round and does it in less than a week. Machakos District coverage is completed as remaining two consults in villages of Kitandi and Muni-Mwanyani this week hold the seven divisions with HDPs.

Internal: All project directors participate in consults for Kitandi and Muni-Mwanyani.

Contradiction: Being the jugglers who can keep all plates spinning in every arena of replication. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcell Community Health Caretaker from Stake 4 registers 150 mothers on Clinic Day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenyan Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hageja to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmers' preparation at farms, troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI facility. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY-MALIWADA HDP

External: Women's Advancement Module training held for 30 ICA staff women and three Sevagram HDP village women in preparation for five, 5-day modules in district projects this quarter, creates a new vision and sense of collegiality among the women of Nava Gram Prayas. First impact and GRA recruitment foray to Jabalpur reopens that region to the movement.

Internal: Global Methods School PSU creates the means to convey the depth of the internal life to the 25 district projects while HDTI recruitment teams hold collegiums on daily ritual and demonstrate use of the *Internal Life Guide*.

Contradiction: Ensuring participation of key village leadership in upcoming HDTI. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Major breakthroughs occur in funding and authorization with tax exemption (100%) given for 50 villages and the block. Development raises 26,750 rupees across the continent this week plus 6,000 rupees in in-kind goods for GRC. Vaviharsh Second Consult document is produced and first continental newsletter is completed.

Internal: GRC preparation is in full swing as international faculty arrives.

Contradiction: Building realistic strategies that will release new time, energy, and money. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI-SIKROR HDP

External: District Panchayat Raj Officer (Government Development Officer) presents village leaders an 8,500 rupee check for community center construction. Grant from Food Specialties Ltd. (Nestles) provides impetus to preschool as materials are purchased and attendance drive pushes numbers to 57. Australian High Commissioner and Australian Development Aid Bureau offer finance for project after site visit.

Internal: House hosts Development team from Bombay and celebrates victory of the quarter with fine feast in Ghaziabad.

Contradiction: Ensuring village decision to move on community center construction thereby releasing village visibility, area framing, and Global Research Colloquy. (Wk. 6)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Global film showing captures imagination of villagers on the movement of Those Who Care. Whitewash shramdan transforms Stake 4 into the limelight. Members of the Village Reconstruction Organization visit village and view the global film.

Internal: Three staff members and two villagers are assigned to Global Research Colloquy in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Reinvigorating village structures which seem like a glacier in their sluggishness. (Wk. 3)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Framing maneuvers are written drawing on wisdom of West Bengal visits with key business contacts.

Internal: Maneuver session with Wedge Team and Development team ends with cold beer and feast.

Contradiction: Expanding strategy beyond working with agencies to go to the local communities in light of the quarter thrust of extensive impact in West Bengal. (Wk. 5)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Management-Development team covers Operations demands, specifically LENS marketing.

Internal: House Church celebration formally announces Nixon-Pesek-marriage and welcomes Kitneys back.

Contradiction: Enabling corporate input into individual centrum decisions when communication is minimal. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SERUSUP-HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTS and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Sungai Lui youth brainstorm and gestalt language needs, creating a 2-week intensive English course in preparation for final exams. Focus on pronunciation exercises, using disco song titles and names of popular American TV shows, incites new appreciation of the global language.

Internal: Entire staff takes 3-day discontinuity: the final calm before a storm of impact (MTM—Town Meeting Malaysia) and training.

Contradiction: Enlisting and training troops needed to pursue impact opportunities. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Community workdays complete the floor of new Kelapa Dua community center. Community Chicken Industry sells its first 200 chickens. GWF is set up with wives of rubber plantation employees.

Internal: Ecclesiola is an event with amazing depth as House probes profound function of social process triangles.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves in the middle of an unexpected new leap without the plan to capitalize on it. (Wk. 6)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN-BUBUN HDP

External: AID Jakarta visit to Bubun and cluster villages sets stage for evaluation of the human factor based on learnings of ICA around the world and in the Bubun HDP. At meeting with Team Desa Panti chief of PVO section in Jakarta AID reports his excitement at participation and enthusiasm in the cluster villages. GWF for Governor's wife and 80 others in Medan is an impactful event.

Internal: Assignments to Bontoa HDTs are a great event with whole House participating in weighing up all the demands.

Contradiction: Creating the kind of evaluation of the human factor which will move toward a new evaluation screen. (Wk. 6)

ATULUTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG-BONTOA HDP

External: Fifty-two leaders from six villages gather to plan the Bontoa Demonstration Cluster with the Bontoa Headman delivering an 18-month progress report, followed by an exciting discussion of the upcoming HDTI. The Bontoa Secretariat is commissioned by the head of the local Parliament in an awefilled afternoon assembly, following four hours of TV filming upon the invitation and supervision of the Bupati county head. The vilage then watches its own story on a special evening TV broadcast.

Internal: The L.D. arrives to join HDTI drive.

Contradiction: Clarifying the role and image of the HDTI to enable maximum participation in the preparation push. (Wk. 6)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Centrums enable each other's work as Development links with Operations as CEM continues. Jim Bell is sent out to HDTs in Nairobi. Management trek to Tokyo, Seoul, and Taipei claims financial victory for the year.

Internal: Nexus hosts many guests including Hilliards, Wayne Marshall, and John Epps.

Contradiction: Discerning the role of the Nexus in the next step of the urban probe. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: The Chairman of the Council (Board) hires an architect to undertake design of the village land plan. This is a long awaited move.

Internal: Mary Kaye So derlind makes a permeation trip to United States to investigate jobs for next year.

Contradiction: Keeping the interest of the whole village before the Board so that the whole village benefits from its structure and work. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: Preparation for the Big Move into new Centre is initiated. House welcomes Taipei colleagues who perform vital cleaning in preparation for final tile polish. Group of 30 Provincial Government officials visit Hai Ou.

Internal: Friday night Ecclesiola expands images of world with research on Addis Ababa. House celebrates completed life of Mae's grandfather.

Contradiction: Keeping our sight on the far horizon in the midst of the blinding light of approaching Grand Opening day. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: In-kind for HDTs includes P10,000 worth of food. Ben Aguirang attends Academy and Debbie de Vela visits projects on west coast of USA. Month closes with second largest in-hand cash total recorded.

Internal: House celebrates four day Easter holiday and is especially impacted by the emphasis on Good Friday.

Contradiction: Dealing with global issues in midst of requests for support of specific concerns. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: LENS proposal is submitted to Johnson & Johnson Taiwan Ltd. Cosa Liebermann sends 1,200 USD as requested to support 1979-1980 program and expansion of human development work on the island.

Internal: Taipei staff is sent out on weekly circuit to assist Hai Ou auxiliary in final push of preparation for the Grand Opening of new facility in the village.

Contradiction: Going ahead with Quarter IV events while expanding development orbit and self-support for 1980-1981. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Human Development Training School IV opens with 50 participants and 22 staff. Bus tour of 24 villagers selects winner of model village contest, Buagsong, who lines two kilometers of road with streamers and flower pots and also selects five winning model houses, in Maribeach, Canjulao, Sudtonggan, Buaya, and BabagII. CEM arrives and immediately sits down with board to plan out 4-year vision and a great 4-year celebration.

Internal: Openign feast of school has 120 present with blue galore.

Contradiction: Pushing for one thrust in midst of orchestrating a 3-ring circus. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: In the six projects—Valancia, Luman, Carman, LaPaz, Magtquad and Langub—223 children are enrolled in eight preschools. Workdays involving over 100 people prepare the preschool buildings; activity includes painting and cleaning classrooms and building toilet, tables, chairs and even frames for entire school. A total of 81 farmers sign up for farmers' class on air-a-radio program.

Internal: The ecclesiola study keeps everybody spinning.

Contradiction: Finishing the second weighing of all children by the end of the month. (Wk. 13)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Groundwork is completed for two community LENSes. Excellent visit with a director of Sony Corporation opens many long-term possibilities.

Internal: Two new resident volunteers move in.

Contradiction: Keeping the mission in phase with the Japanese year. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Thirty villagers from Bans two and three attend meetings in which each household receives copy of documentation revealing the four year miracle of Kwang Yung II.

Internal: Major weekly news magazine provides substantial story on Burma, enabling in-depth ecclesiola sodality on Area Bangkok.

Contradiction: Rallying the Movement around the upcoming Community Extension Module. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Fifteen people gather at new Seoul House for metro meeting and bring with them 350,000 Won. HDTS back up, with work on curriculum and Development is all-consuming.

Internal: Saturday night decor party begins the process of turning an ordinary house into a revolutionary, context-setting dwelling.

Contradiction: Planning Quarter IV using the unique missional indicatives. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Intermediate technology hits in a big way. Staff prints Stronghold Consult Document, 5200 impressions on hand single sheet silk screen process "mimeograph" machine.

Internal: House sends out Park Si Won family to new Seoul facility and welcomes new interns Park Young Chul and Lee Kang Jin.

Contradiction: Getting out the people to the six village mini consults next week. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Follow-up calls in Shimane and Kumamoto result in yes to atleast five TMs. Key appointment set up at Kita Kyushu Industrial Club with Jaycess VP attending. Meeting is set up by Guardian in Kurosaki.

Internal: House welcomes David Hutchins to Fukuoka staff from Korea.

Contradiction: Strengthening the Movemental structures to enable LENS, CYF, and strongholds to come off. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Sahai City research begins with volunteer planning session and first circuit for new national staff. Catechitical Center appointment unearths old church colleagues. Three people from Osaka go to Advisors Meeting in Tokyo including Mr. Harada of Nestles Company.

Internal: April brings new beginnings with House member, Ko Yokoyam, starting company job.

Contradiction: Determining how to walk the fine line between Eastern and Western style. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO—OYUBARI HDP

External: Businessmen's Association sends two and the You Club sends one to the Guardians Meeting in Tokyo where all three give fine reports on Oyubari economic and social events, including map presentation of Nihon Cable gondola and chair lifts for ski site.

Internal: Spring shifts as Teresa Butcher is assigned to spirit colleague, Mr. Watanabe, for the third grade.

Contradiction: Moving the village from initial confidence to steady confidence. (Wk. 6)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Fifth GWF in region since March is held in Sydney House. Development receives first money from Roman Catholic orders. Assembly, GRA, and CEM mailings are printed.

Internal: Ken Otto is welcomed back from Indonesia. Olive Evans returns to celebrate the completed life of her father King Peter.

Contradiction: Spiritizing the doing in the midst of the most victorious quarter of the year. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: George Powell, retired businessman, agrees to accompany staff for an Economic Community Forum in

Moora. Assignments are made and a workbook is completed for that ECF. A transrational model is initiated for working with colleagues to fill the rest of this quarter with event-fulness.

Internal: Letter from Research occasions a fruitful discussion in ecclesiola on the future of the Order.

Contradiction: Moving from trying to get a clear image of the quarter to doing the quarter events. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Key authorizations made for new sets. Mass mailing is sent to contacts in both Fleurieu and Lower North districts.

Internal: ANZAC weekend is celebrated with trip to a farm for a picnic and an Andalusian horse show.

Contradiction: Building models for imminent events and visitations. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Fourteen religious orders visit in 10 days resulting in \$500 committed and \$4,200 working. Eight missional arenas and their four components are named.

Internal: ANZAC Day parade celebrates heroes of world wars and highlights the week.

Contradiction: Designing effective troop configuration to both rural and urban at same time. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Dubbo circuit sets CMA date and develops new level of service to Gilgandra. Community core begins transferring old House into community center.

Internal: Guest from Lake is present for ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Converting community's new desire to do things into practical, sustained corporate action. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Quarter plan is finished for the Bread of Life Bakery with maneuvers for Feeding the 5,000, Leavening the Loaf, and Bake House Bonanza.

Internal: House attends Esther Jago's graduation and reception following.

Contradiction: Releasing participation and commitment to the South Burnett Assembly. (Wk. 6)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: Twenty-four-hour shifts preparing for SBA trip look at TASC inside, outside, upside-down, and sideways and especially towards the future.

Internal: Night fuses with day as all internal structures are focused on the external task.

Contradiction: Surfacing from the immediate to really consider the long-range exclusive of financing. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: Community Forum Samoa accelerates as Ulutogia Village Forum has 90% of adults present including matais, women, and youth working together. Chief Matai offers to set up the rest of the district villages for a Village Forum. The glorious quest for electricity continues as Salani Chiefs and Apia Guardians give fine report on success of SHDP to the Secretary of Western Samoan Government in long process toward approval of Canadian High Commission Grant.

Internal: Barbecue celebration and movie following Community Forum Samoa orchestrator training celebrates 10 new Samoan speakers prepared to lead the expanding national campaign.

Contradiction: Understanding the complexity of twentieth century operations. (Wk. 6)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Special Issues Forum is held with U.S. Fish and Wildlife. Four youth are sent to two CYFs in Los Angeles. Mailing system is updated in time to use for Gateways, the regional newsletter which is also completed this week.

Internal: House experiences a week of celebration with the completion of quarter maneuvers and a fine ecclesiola with an introduction to the *Good Society*.

Steady income base is reported globally including regular Canadian corporate contributors continuing support amidst media criticism. The key contradiction lies in the arena of meeting the bottom line while building a firm commitment for Quarter I to prevent summer slump.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports Maliwada opening Methods Training School. Guardian meeting in Brussels hosts Nobel Laureate Jan Tinbergen, inventor of econometric's and prime architect of post W.W.II reconstruction of the Netherlands. First draft of speech on Village Development is sent to Brazil in preparation for World Conference of Rural Sociologists to be held in Mexico City. Pushing the questions and constructs in several arenas will allow global dialogue to occur toward preparation for Summer 80. 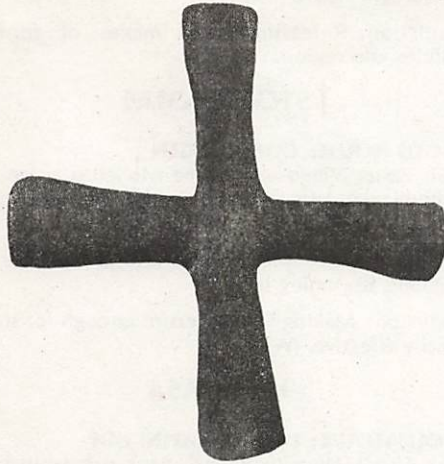
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

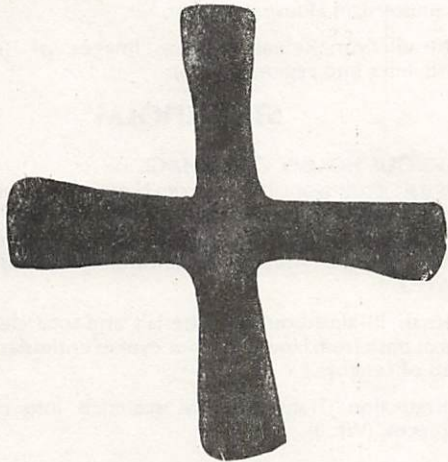

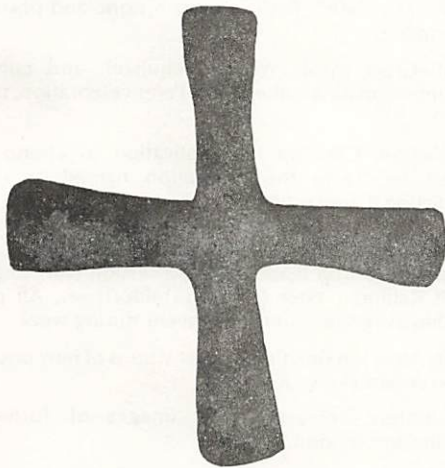
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTs and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Excitement mounts as the government begins its utilization of the famous Sungai Lui waterfall to expand electricity to the outer boarders of the community. Introduction to a Negri Sembilan district officer is made possible through the assistance of the Kuala Pilah Band Pertanian Manager, a recent LENS grad.

Internal: Strongly impacting the House, *The Good Society* creates a foundation for reflectin on the differences of Eastern and Western attitudes towards the covenant of family.

Contradiction: Keeping the victories of the strategic thrusts in view while experiencing the tactics being ground into the dust. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Community workdays complete the floor of new Kelapa Dua community center. Community Chicken Industry sells its first 200 chickens. GWF is set up with wives of rubber plantation employees.

Internal: Ecclesiola is an event with amazing depth as House probes profound function of social process triangles.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves in the middle of an unexpected new leap without the plan to capitalize on it. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN-BUBUN HDP

External: New step is taken toward coalition cadre taking responsibility for cluster as Oamat and head men call meeting in Bubun to plan next steps. Cluster leadership selects five responsible village leaders to attend Bontoa HDTs who are sent off on 10 day boat trip story of Bubun is taken by invitation of government to Northernmost province of Sumatra.

Internal: All volunteer staff participates in weekly priorship meeting; House send Tim to Bontoa HDTs, Dixie to GRA planning and welcome Nurul from Kelapa Dua.

Contradiction: Finding strategy that will allow cluster villages to take a leap in their decision to be the cluster. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG-BONTOA HDP

External: A hundred things go on at one time in the last week before the HDTI, a cadre meeting is held with the headmen from the surrounding villages and recruiting and cluster visiting continues invitations go out for the opening. People are up day and night writing curriculum, construction is still going on, office and kitchen start running and all is under way for a great HDTI.

Internal: First boat people arrive with five from Bubun. Roxanna arrives from Kuala Lumpur. Faculty space is set-up.

Contradiction: Getting the participants to decide the school is the most worthwhile thing in their lives. (Wk. 9)

HONG KONG**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Management trek reports corporate financial responsibility present in all nations, a firm projection of self-support victory, and a new level of national economic integrity.

Internal: Many colleagues visiting nexus and leading collegiums which affords opportunity for more reflection on area and centrum dynamics.

Contradiction: Enabling Houses to struggle with vision of next year while the nexus works at structural ways to allow those models to get consensed on globally. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Completed slide-show and three-dimensional contour map educate villagers on the work of Nam Wai Foundation, Ltd. and show the Nam Wai land plan.

Internal: Feast at Ho Chung marks completion of Community Extension Module.

Attractive wall plaque is unveiled to honor the private sector support to Hai Ou HDP and the long awaited brochure is presented to the community by the printer.

Internal: First night of opening is celebrated with colleagues from Taipei, Hong Kong, and Manila.

Contradiction: Creating future missional thrust while the luxury of the new facility forces us to sunbathe on the adjacent tropical beach. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: In-kind for HDTs includes P10,000 worth of food. Ben Aguirang attends Academy and Debbie de Vela visits projects on west coast of USA. Month closes with second largest in-hand cash total recorded.

Internal: House celebrates four day Easter holiday and is especially impacted by the emphasis on Good Friday.

Contradiction: Dealing with global issues in midst of requests for support of specific concerns. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: HK Centrum Community Extension module team arrives and travels with Taipei staff and colleague from Japan to Hai Ou. *Spring Update* is printed and mailed to over 200 supporters in Taipei and Kaohsiung. Development follow-up continues with Chinese and multinational companies.

Internal: The ICA office is reorganized; collegium on self-support gives clear picture of options for next year.

Contradiction: Building bridges and structures which set up moving head-on into 1980-1981, including self-support options. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: HEALTH MONTH is in full swing with 120 Health Caretakers from 24 villages participating in first training session and set-up of clinics for June 1 Vitality Fair. HDTs joins by organizing stake competitions in Basak Mercado and Sudtonggan for Most Beautiful Baby, Most Healthy Child, and Mr. and Ms. Mactan contests and putting the finishing touches on the Sudtonggan Highway. Projects swirl with division, village and island meetings, 10 new pumps delivered, payday and supplies from the city for the preschools.

Internal: HDTs sends out Godofredo Estorgio (Langub staff) and Purita Limpangog for Hai Ou CEM.

Contradiction: Enabling 48 village blueshirts and 47 HDTs grads to have the time of their lives in HDTs COUNCIL OF VILLAGES, planning for next year and next quarter. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: In the six projects—Valancia, Luman, Carman, LaPaz, Magtuad and Langub—223 children are enrolled in eight preschools. Workdays involving over 100 people prepare the preschool buildings; activity includes painting and cleaning classrooms and building toilet, tables, chairs and even frames for entire school. A total of 81 farmers sign up for farmers' class on air-a-radio program.

Internal: The ecclesiola study keeps everybody spinning.

Contradiction: Finishing the second weighing of all children by the end of the month. (Wk. 13)

Meeting with Delmo Housing Corporation opens real possibility for forums and signal community in the Missouri Bootheel.

Contradiction: Locating and meeting with targeted ESL contacts to do ESL completion. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: First four of five stake meetings are held to draw sketches for a 20-year space management plan. Up-to-date information on small diameter sewer system is distributed.

Internal: Special Ecclesiola celebrates the birthdays of two House members.

Contradiction: Engaging troops into a single thrust. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY—KINNEY HDP

External: Barbara and Addie create two-day package of LENS and TM training for North Dakota retired farmer VISTA project, and do it, with a Minneapolis-Kinney-Cannonball team. ACTION official says that in 15 years of working with planning consultants, he's never seen a better model for Community Meetings.

External: Flowers bloom from seeds planted long ago. Crown Assoc. approves ICA fund raising. Central Youth Council asks for funding for CYF and Collinswood moves toward contract for 24 meetings.

Internal: Vances spin on the journey of the Order and provide images of Summer '80 options during area prior's visit.

Contradiction: Coordinating a four-ring circus: Collinswood, Central, Clark Metro and Summer '80. (Wk. 9)

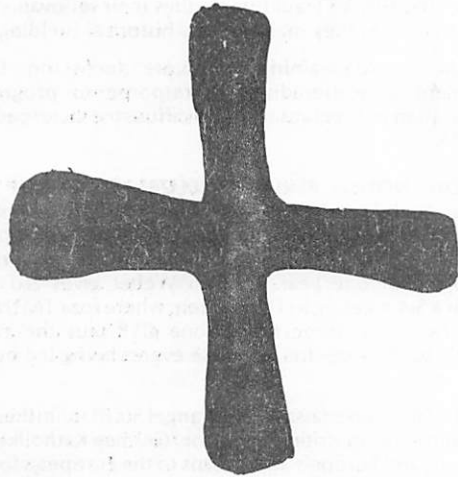
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Contradiction: Transforming a schedule into a dynamic event-filled time line. (Wk. 12)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: In a week of circuiting in Area Vienna a breakthrough is made as heads of Religious Orders are visited with full programme potential of 30 forums of training events. Meanwhile appointments are set with high level Protestant

church symbolic leadership in authorization manoeuvre--12 appointments across Germany-- with Bishops and Bishops representatives. With 3 colleagues doing set up and 3 others leading, a great CYF is held in Frankfurt Region for 40 tenth class students in Catholic school.

External: Eur-Asia circuit initiates Protestant, Catholic and secular religious contacts with consensus to build new community life in Olympic village housing development.

Internal: The five adults assigned show up in four continents with Academy in North America, permeation in Amsterdam, circuit in Eur-asia, LENS pedagogy in Europe.

Contradiction: Finding the right housing space in right place for the right price. (Wk. 12)

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: The Brostrom family visit and a dinner with Kroeger help set up previously unknown development possibilities.

Internal: Banks are sent to Brussels for LENS pedagogy and council while two more rooms are rehabilitated.

Contradiction: Breaking supporters loose from inkind gifts to funding the program. (Wk. 13)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: As the Primary School completes its second week of classes with two first grade sessions per day of 45 pupils each, the teacher visits district offices to arrange for a grade two class (a salute to Kapini Preschool), and over 50 parentys complete the foundation to the teacher's house. The Village Forum team reports the Southern Province Victory of 40 Forums putting the national total at 432 villages. Two Health Aaretakers create and win a three day maneuver that gets vaccines in order to hold a June "under-five" clinic.

Internal: House hosts and appreciates the wisdom, work and wit of management/development team Williams and Bauknight and sends them on their way with a courtyard picnic, and a sojourn construct is written for seven

unexpected sojourners.

Contradiction: Holding our timeline and expense budgets while working with public officers. (Wk. 13)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE :CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Bayad villagers take responsibility for East Bank Cluster Assembly as date is set for June 6th. The community centre facility inner walls go up. Bayad's nearest neighbour, Sheikh Ali, has a Village Meeting.

Internal: House plus host of guests including Ken and Grace Wegner and two guests from England attend preschool teacher Mosa Salema's wedding and witness her proudly signing the wedding contract herself.

Contradiction: Enabling the village leadership to do the rest of the Village Meeting. (Wk. 12)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Area Nairobi Council brings together 252 people as graduation of 102 from HDTI takes place. Three new houses/projects are commissioned and sent out with their maneuvers for the quarter. A great news article from Firestone with pictures of Kabiro residents at work draining and cleaning the plaza gives context for Firestone's decision and presentation of support for the community. The death of one of the original farmers, Joseph Karanyo, a great spirit man and team leader who was a consultant at the Kamweleni Consult in 1978, dramatizes the symbolic power of local man.

Internal: Wayside Inn dynamic intensifies as fantastic people who just graduated from the HDTI join the House Area and Internal assignments and the Rafos family returns from Cairo and pick up critical assignment arenas as they continue to schedule LENS in preparation for September.

Contradiction: Clarifying 1980-81 model for national replication. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcell Community Health Caretaker from Stake 4 registers 150 mothers on Clinic Day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenyan Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmers preparation at farms, troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI facility. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY-MALIWADA HDP

External: Women's Advancement Module training held for 30 ICA staff women and three Sevagram HDP village women in preparation for five, 5-day modules in district projects this quarter, creates a new vision and sense of collegiality among the women of Nava Gram Prayas. First impact and GRA recruitment foray to Jabalpur reopens that region to the movement.

Internal: Global Methods School PSU creates the means to convey the depth of the internal life to the 25 district projects while HDTI recruitment teams hold collegiums on daily ritual and demonstrate use of the *Internal Life Guide*.

Contradiction: Ensuring participation of key village leadership in upcoming HDTI. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Major breaklooses occur in funding and authorization with tax exemption (100%) given for 50 villages and the block. Development raises 26,750 rupees across the continent this week plus 6,000 rupees in in-kind goods for GRC. Vaviharsh Second Consult document is produced and first continental newsletter is completed.

Internal: GRC preparation is in full swing as international faculty arrives.

Contradiction: Building realistic strategies that will release new time, energy, and money. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI-SIKROR HDP

External: Impact thrust is initiated in Area Delhi as first LENS is held with National Small Industries Corporation (Government of India). Global Film Shows are held at Australian High Commission and United Nations Office with UNDP, UNFPA and UNWFP. Actuation continues in Sikror as village finally decides to have electricity and collects deposits from 61 families.

Internal: Delhi office turned into wayside inn as LENS team arrives and quick circuit by Development Centrum provides perfect excuse for impromptu House celebration.

Contradiction: Ensuring that any action is done at the critical place and time for greatest effectivity. (Wk. 9)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Twenty farmers take a course in modern farming methods from All India Coordinated Research for Dryland Agriculture. Centrum sets up September LENS in Madras with the National Small Industries Commission. District Collector calls a meeting to set up the "Committee for the All Round Development of Nadlapur," which includes the Collector, District Department Heads, Block Officers and the VST Company.

Internal: C. Satara and R. Prabaraj return from awakening campaign in Area Calcutta.

Contradiction: Making a response to public sector pressure to expand our work while waiting for our employers' authorization. (Wk. 11)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: The first HDTI on the Continent, outside Maharashtra, opens with 40 participants around the table. Representatives are present from both areas Calcutta and Dacca.

Internal: J.P. Shrivastava and Shakuntala Shrivastava return from the Global Methods School, Maliwada, and the House hosts research.

Contradiction: Naming key parameters in relationship to site selection and village move that clarify Quarter I maneuver. (Wk. 13)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: A dozen companies are targeted in the strong working category for LENS in Malaysia this quarter. Working on LENS with ICL in Australia, and Indonesia continues at top speed. Training session for Rubber Research Institute prepares 12 people for one day self-support seminar during their annual conference.

Internal: House sends Geoff Nixon and Roxanna Harper out for first trips to Indonesia this year.

Contradiction: Forging objective guidelines as self-support deficits occasion question of which consultation fees constitute self-support. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SERUSUP-HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTs and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Excitement mounts as the government begins its utilization of the famous Sungai Lui waterfall to expand electricity to the outer boarders of the community. Introduction to a Negri Sembilan district officer is made possible through the assistance of the Kuala Pilah Band Pertanian Manager, a recent LENS grad.

Internal: Strongly impacting the House, *The Good Society* creates a foundation for reflection on the differences of Eastern and Western attitudes towards the covenant of family.

Contradiction: Keeping the victories of the strategic thrusts in view while experiencing the tactics being ground into the dust. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Community workdays complete the floor of new Kelapa Dua community center. Community Chicken Industry sells its first 200 chickens. GWF is set up with wives of rubber plantation employees.

Internal: Ecclesiola is an event with amazing depth as House probes profound function of social process triangles.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves in the middle of an unexpected new leap without the plan to capitalize on it. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN-BUBUN HDP

External: Two Global Women's Forums, two 3-month Assemblies, training from the Fisheries Department and the Education Department for the Cluster, plus meetings with the Health Department to set up Health Module for June, bring the cluster villages and the government departments together. USAID rewrite is completed to enable funding for 1980-81.

Internal: Headman of Tapak Kuda (one of the cluster villages) dies and the cluster participate in celebrating his completed life. Wa'u and Romanus are sent to the CEM in Kelapa Dua.

Contradiction: Creating the "death ground" for village leadership so they assume full responsibility. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG-BONTOA HDP

External: A hundred things go on at one time in the last week before the HDTI, a cadre meeting is held with the headmen from the surrounding villages and recruiting and cluster visiting continues. Invitations go out for the opening. People are up day and night writing curriculum, construction is still going on, office and kitchen start running and all is under way for a great HDTI.

Internal: First boat people arrive with five from Bubun. Roxanna arrives from Kuala Lumpur. Faculty space is set-up.

Contradiction: Getting the participants to decide the school

is the most worthwhile thing in their lives. (Wk. 9)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Community Extension Modules in North Seapac are completed and were reported out to the Nexus on Week II. The prediction is, these CEMs have "saved our soul."

Internal: Total House (with the exception of Research Centrum—Vergara and Bell) gathers and has a Mexican feast with David Scott and children.

Contradiction: Forging a central operating image for missional task relative to the future. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Completed slide-show and three-dimensional contour map educate villagers on the work of Nam Wai Foundation, Ltd. and show the Nam Wai land plan.

Internal: Feast at Ho Chung marks completion of Community Extension Module.

Contradiction: Keeping the interest of the whole village before the Board so that the whole village benefits from its structure and work. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: Letters to 50 companies are mailed for possible cottage industry contracts for extension villages. First core meetings are held prior to Economic Issues Forums. Two women and elders of Hai-Ou start their programs in the new Center with cosmetic demonstrations and a concert.

Internal: The House loses two iron women—Nancy is sent out for University preparation in Indiana and Linda joins the development team in Taipei for last major trek of the year—and the Cunninghams return from a Taipei Guardians evening to welcome a new sojourner from Ping Tung, Dave Ha.

Contradiction: Training and equipping new staff to play up-front roles before the week of Forums starts. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Visits with Philippine government officials, foreign embassies, and target corporations reaffirm support of ICA program for next year. Intensive follow-up on committed and working money from past development trek is continued, and telephoning blitz for next trek is begun. Philippine regions PSU on expansion of ICA bookkeeping system is held following the annual audit.

Internal: House hosts parish and school friends of Heather Howell in despedida party as she leaves for the US and student house and the movie Kramer vs Kramer addresses house as great image builder relative to responsibility.

Contradiction: Covering all the bases to enable finishing the year in the black and providing base for launching next year. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Visit to Minister K.L. Li (President's cabinet) provides an opportunity to share the funding plan for the next four years of ICA's work in Taiwan. Bristol-Meyers contacts us about an in-house LENS. "Update" mailing is sent out to ICA colleagues and supporters, now totalling almost 250.

Internal: Hai Ou sends Chinese staff to Taipei for the last major development push of '79-'80 and the House celebrates at an English pub in Taipei after the Guardians' meeting.

Contradiction: Structuring summer tasks and assignments to position us for 1980-81. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Blue Shirts play "dignitary" role at 24 Early Learning Nutrition Center graduations across the island, bestowing

diplomas. June/July maneuvers of Nutrition/Sanitation readied by teachers as 24 toilet bowls are delivered by Jardine Davies, one per village. The Island ELNC payroll is for the first time totally handled by Sudtonggan administrative staff.

Internal: A week of celebrations and a visit by the Frank Wherrys prepare the House for the send out of GRA participants to Chicago. nedensThe house receives Luzviminda Estorgio into adult structures and assigns four blue shirts in the house to self-support.

Contradiction: Breathing life into carefully drawn models of the next two months.(Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Luman HDP reports youth organize to deal with corporate agriculture projects and two waiting sheds are completed by puroks 1 and 4. Langub HDP reports profits on General State is paid to members, sewing Industry payroll hits \$4,000 and the community decides to start a new Buri Industry. National Manpower agrees to pay salary for Buri Industry. Community assembly makes plans for 2nd anniversary fair and celebration. Site visit by rural Improvement Club of Digos promote request for Town Meeting.

Internal: Five key colleagues from the cluster HDPs decide to sojourn in the house next quarter.

Contradiction: Getting the rainy season started so that the agriculture programs can break loose again. (Wk. 11)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Tokyo Boeki Co. (trade) calls back two days after our first visit to request a top management LENS this month. Well received circuit to Gumma and Niigata prefectures indicates a series of five to ten TMs in the late summer.

Internal: \$4,000 copier delivered to the House as a contribution from the Ricoh Company, the first time they have donated a machine; request and arrangements entirely handled by a Guardian.

Contradiction: Turning winning forays into major victories.(Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Twenty consultants and Guardians visit in preparation for CEM, as village bar campaign moves into final stretch of five bars.

Internal: Jeni is sent out to Seoul Region Management meeting in Seoul House.

Contradiction: Breaking loose the mythic foundations of Jeju Island for the sake of rapid and effective extension. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Fifteen people gather at new Seoul House for metro meeting and bring with them 350,000 Won. HDTs back up, with work on curriculum and Development is all-consuming.

Internal: Saturday night decor party begins the process of turning an ordinary house into a revolutionary, context-setting dwelling.

Contradiction: Planning Quarter IV using the unique missional indicatives. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: A new preschool opens in Man Chen II. The teacher spends four days of in-service training in the Kuh Du E Ri preschool under Miss Park and caps it off with a weekend curriculum workshop with the House.

Internal: Mr. Um comes to visit while his university is out and doubles our local punch.

Contradiction: Turning local pastor's passion for the preschool into useful channels.(Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: A major attack on LENS reveals 17 yesses. Eight other companies have been visited with the assistance of three advisors.

Internal: House impacted by collegium on the Fukuoka summer dance party.

Contradiction: Maintaining the momentum that LENS has given us, through the summer.(Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: A major soap company holds TM for salesmen scheduled to go to America for training. The first registration for August LENS arrives and facility is reserved. Gestetner delivers inkind used electric duplicator and a boxful of stencils.

Internal: The House gears up for a full summer with a collegium on the summer overview, flight reservations for House members headed for Chicago, Mrs. Yoshikawa getting her visa, and phone network spreading invitations for Summer '80 send-out celebration.

Contradiction: Incorporating major fund-raising into an already full summer plan.(Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO—OYUBARI HDP

External: Oyubari CEM document translation into Japanese almost completed during week II of work with Rakuno College speaking and T.M. work continue to percolate. Miss Nokaji translates for Oyubari site visits.

Internal: House summerized by removal of plastic and boards from windows yard cleaned and all participate in Elementary School sports day and kindergarten picnic.

Contradiction: Forgetting missional importance of corporate celebration and rest dynamics in the midst of heavy teaching schedule and the short time available for all the house to be present for Week II work and planing.(Wk. 11)

Brother Swain of the Selanesian Order brings his guardian to the House to plan a training seminar for his school principals.

Internal: Don Baker preaches at Riddle Park Uniting Church and E.G. have a great red man curriculum event including climbing the "Andes", bursting a pinata bursting and eating tacos.

Contradiction: Tilling the soil for the long range crop while reaping the short range harvest. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Lawrence Johnson returns from three month mechanics training in Melbourne. Two new temporary Health Care workers are hired and Professor Hallows tests community members for traucoma. New marketing contacts are made in Sydney.

Internal: A team of five travel overland to area council in Adelaide and Telford returns from CEM in Kelapa Dua.

Contradiction: Creating authentic "on behalf of" story with Murrin Bridge that will catalyse the work within the networks it is part of. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: A state advisory board cocktail party is held and is a great colleagues event. \$1,000 is received from the Brown Josephites for Indonesia, also a car worth \$1,000 is inkinded for the House. The first edition of *Have a Go Gazette* for Queensland is printed.

Internal: Four floors of the House are sanded and stained in time for area prior's visit.

Contradiction: Maintaining and building momentum toward colleague engagement through Quarter I (Wk. 13)

SUVA

Elaine Richmond, Lauri Miesen and Bruce Robertson are workshop leaders for the conference designed by Sharon Robertson and Wally Webster, Vice President and Director of Affirmative Action Department for Rainier National Bank.

Internal: New study format which lays out an in-depth look at *The Good Society* begins to excite and engage colleagues in the ecclesiola study to the point where they lose track of time and end the evening at 10:45.

Area Cairo reports the donation of \$800 worth of electrical products by the Muslim Brotherhood. Chicago Nexus reports the Million Dollar Roundtable (group of insurance salesmen who have sold more than \$1,000,000 of life insurance) have agreed to contribute \$18,000 for the Pisinemo HDP. The increased support of religious bodies (especially religious orders) is being accompanied by their increased interest and participation in Institute sponsored programs. The key contradiction is getting a picture of the future that is "beyond more programs" as a key element in the development pitch to focusing on locating the existential bite.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that GRA regional teams are taking shape with recruitment momentum building. Documentation of '79-'80 is underway with program victories charts in Brussels and Hong Kong. GRA prep in Chicago gains momentum in working on methods for creating the strategies for the 3rd campaign, Hope, and the Prophet. Prophets of hope are generating a new spirit mode for declaration in a time when the world is living under a cloud of doom. The key contradiction lies in having time to brood through the depths of spirit needed to undergird a move toward an Intraglobal Local Movement of Human Communities.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operation Centrum reports that Brussels hosts a LENS team which begins the first marketing trip of the year and leads pedagogy. The first Caracas LENS has been completed. HDTS in Pace and Cannon Ball ended this week on a high note and Tioga finished evaluation including documentation of learnings. CEM documentation has been compiled from Seapac. Majuro and Ivy City CEMs are completed, all CEMs reporting new momentum and great local support. Quarter I is already underway with Brussels sending out invitations to the October Guardians' meeting and calendars everywhere filling up. The key contradiction lies in maintaining momentum over the summer period and linking the old program with new strategy.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that end of May report forms are complete for EI, ICA, OE and Trust/Task accounts. A live pig weighing 250 lbs highlights Summer '80 inkind. Reduced staff configuration handles the load as some regulars head for GRA prep. In Chicago, all-out, one-week blitz completes five months of reports in time for the Board Meeting. The key contradiction lies in communicating management as the responsibility of every location as year-end conditions are revealed.
