

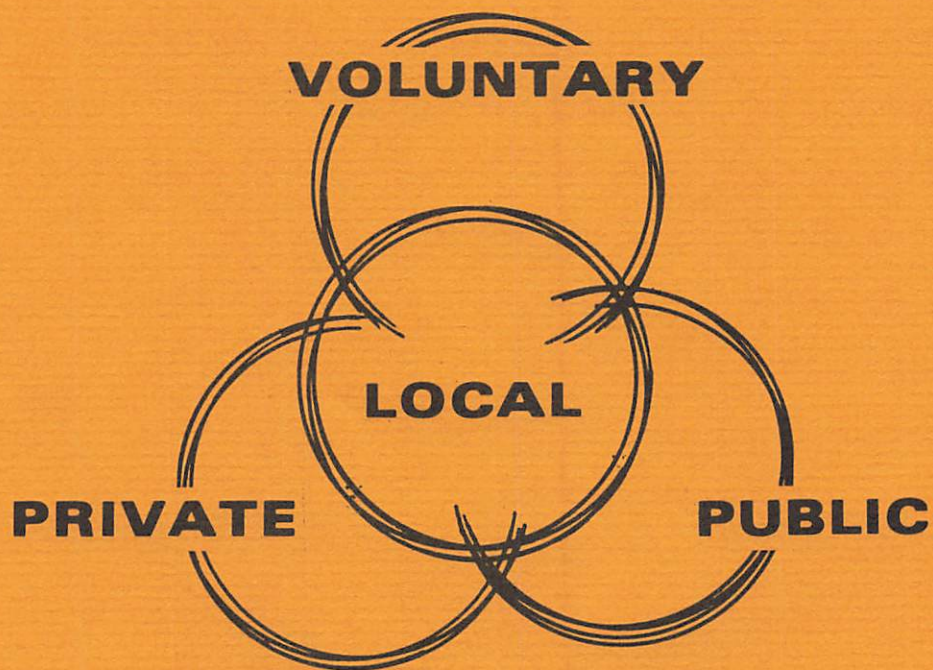

**QUARTER III & IV NEWSLETTER & GLOBAL EXCHANGE FROM
THE LOS ANGELES PRIMARY UNIT**

As we bring this 1984-85 program year to a close, we want to report to you on the events of the last quarter. We last wrote something resembling a Primary Unit newsletter in January after the Pilgimage in Phoenix. A Los Angeles Primary Unit Council was held in Los Angeles (yes, we all squeezed in!) over Memorial Day weekend. The document we produced is enclosed, but as you will notice it is full of diagrams and charts rather than jargon-filled prose so perhaps a word or two of explanation is necessary. The council both celebrated the past year of creating new operating modes and pioneering in spirit practices of our life together, and anticipated the next year with several programmatic and organizational balloons.

We began the Council by reporting to each other on the activities since the last time we met in January. Highlights of the past quarter in Phoenix include LENS workshops with Our Lady of Perpetual Help Roman Catholic Church in Scottsdale, St. Cyril's Roman Catholic Church in Tucson, and the Papago tribe Economic Development Committee. We also provided facilitator training to Papago tribe members and lead an Imaginal Education for the Sisters of Charity in Phoenix. (Imaginal Education also caught on in Denver and Seattle.) We worked with the Arizona Steering Committee for IERD Phase III to set up a Local Development Strategy Seminar in Yuma and are currently designing a program of forums in Arizona/ Mexico border towns.

In California our program activity has included strategic planning and facilitator training for Neighborhood Housing Service in San Diego and for a statewide meeting of Neighborhood Housing Service staff and board members. Neighborhood Reinvestment Corp., a public agency, has hired us as consultants in several locations including Denver, Lake Tahoe & Oakland. We are also working on a similar training program for the Los Angeles Archdiocese. Richgrove, the HDP site in the lower San Joaquin Valley, invited us to a groundbreaking celebration in February for their new waste treatment facility. This is the final step in the process toward building 45 new homes through Self-Help Housing project. Self-Help housing was represented at the Delhi event of the IERD by Bob Marshall.

Networking activity has taken place with other groups involved in research and new age consciousness, development both in the third world and the Los Angeles metropolitan area, and women interested in participating in events related to the closing Decade Conference in Nairobi. A trek by Joe Slicker, David Lazear and Roger Butcher of the Research and Interchange band in Chicago contacted organizations throughout our Primary Unit and made arrangements for 7 groups from the Western USA to play leadership roles in the Planetary Connections program in Chicago during July. The trek featured colleague events in each region and introduced some experimental spirit practices in several locations.

We have worked in San Francisco and Malibu with Interaction, a

network of international development organizations. Their convention in Malibu last weekend provided an opportunity to contact several new funding options. In Seattle networking takes place through weekly studies of the Voices of Rural Practitioners booklets produced from the compiled learnings of the IERD delegates. In Los Angeles we are organizing sponsors of the Metropolitan Exposition of Local Development. The task force will begin with a one day event bringing together representatives of the public, private and voluntary sector to develop a strategy for dealing with the rapid growth and change in the Los Angeles Basin. Denver is working with the Colorado Steering Committee for IERD Phase III on a second annual Colorado Exposition of Local Development. We even participated in networking with other Primary Units in launching a long range strategy of Linking the Americas. The initiating event was held in Mexico City and involved staff from the Mexico City, Houston, Chicago and Los Angeles Primary Units and guardians from Denver, Seattle and Mexico City.

The Women in Development program included dialogues in Denver, Seattle, Los Angeles, Marina del Rey, Pasadena, San Francisco, Phoenix and Anaheim. At these events women filled out the questionnaires which were then sent to the Wingspread conference and compiled in a document to be presented at the end-of-the decade conference in Nairobi. The Women in Development Symposia in Denver and Pasadena both documented the events of the Decade for Women and anticipated the next decade with practical strategies for women in their local communities.

We celebrated several other victories at the Council: computer Paradigm reported the best month for PAX (Pastoral Access and eXchange software for the local church) with \$1750. in income; Conna Shropshire and Bob Wilkinson announced their intent to be married within the year; plans were presented for renovation of the Los Angeles House which would add five or six rooms and three or four baths; and an Evening With the Institute at the Los Angeles House hosted 30 guests many of whom represented new people we've met in the various research & development networks we've contacted.

Now a word of explanation for a couple of things in the Council document. The first page, Indicators of Momentum Across the Primary Unit is a brainstorm of events under three categories: IERD Phase III, New Paradigm research, and ICA Finance - these were the arenas of focus, called "Doorways", at the Global Priors Meeting in Brussels in January. Once we had listed these events we determined the "crunch" or challenge in each of these arenas. The next step of our planning process was to float balloons which would deal with the crunches. Several of those complete the document including a new song which was written during the council.

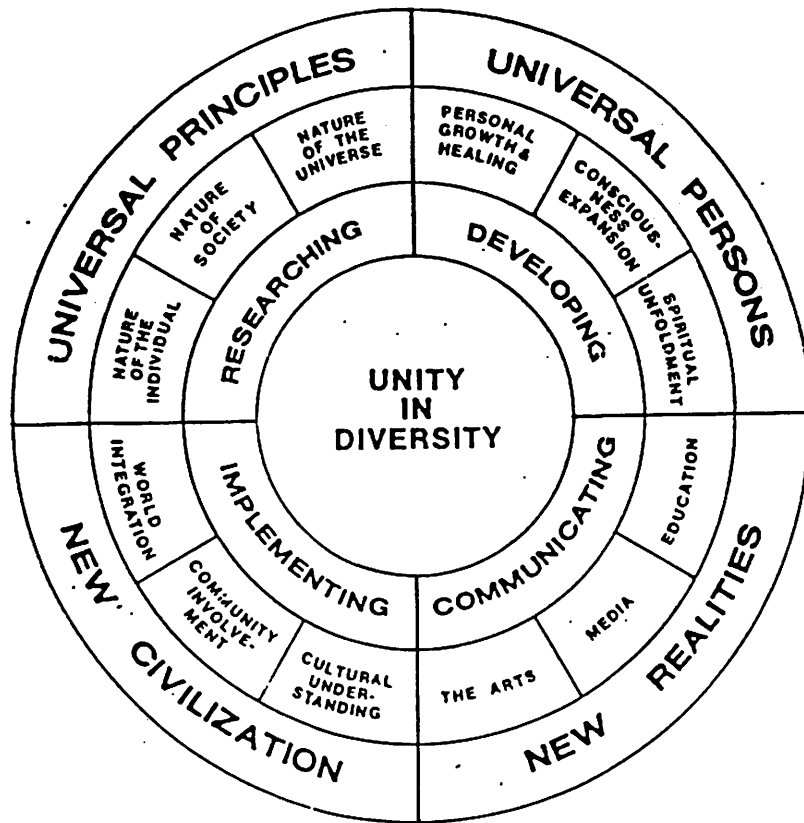
- II. Being willing to have a two-headed thrust of research and Phase III program until the time that the two can be integrated into a new phase of our program and strategy.

PROPOSED RESEARCH SCREEN

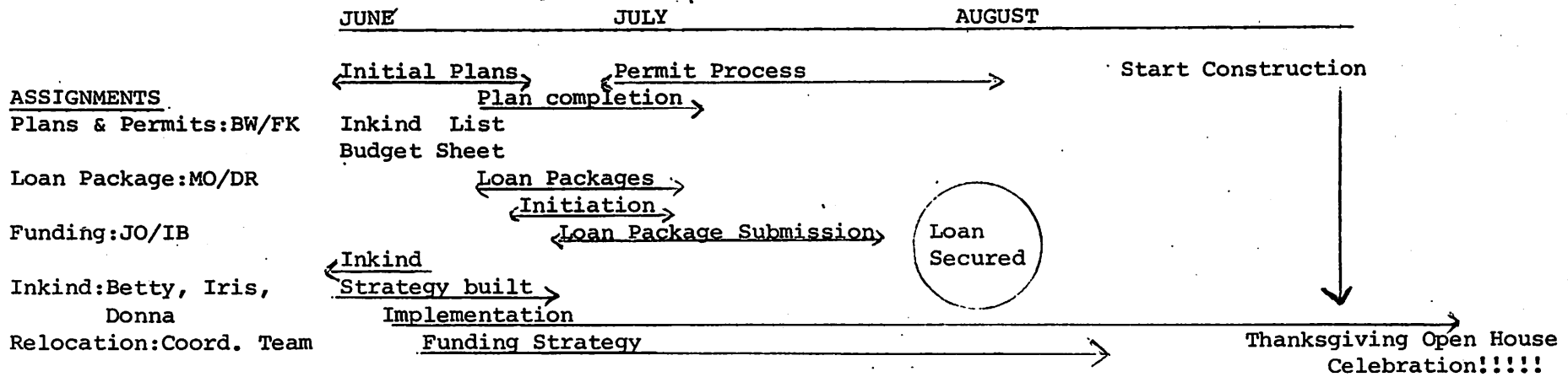

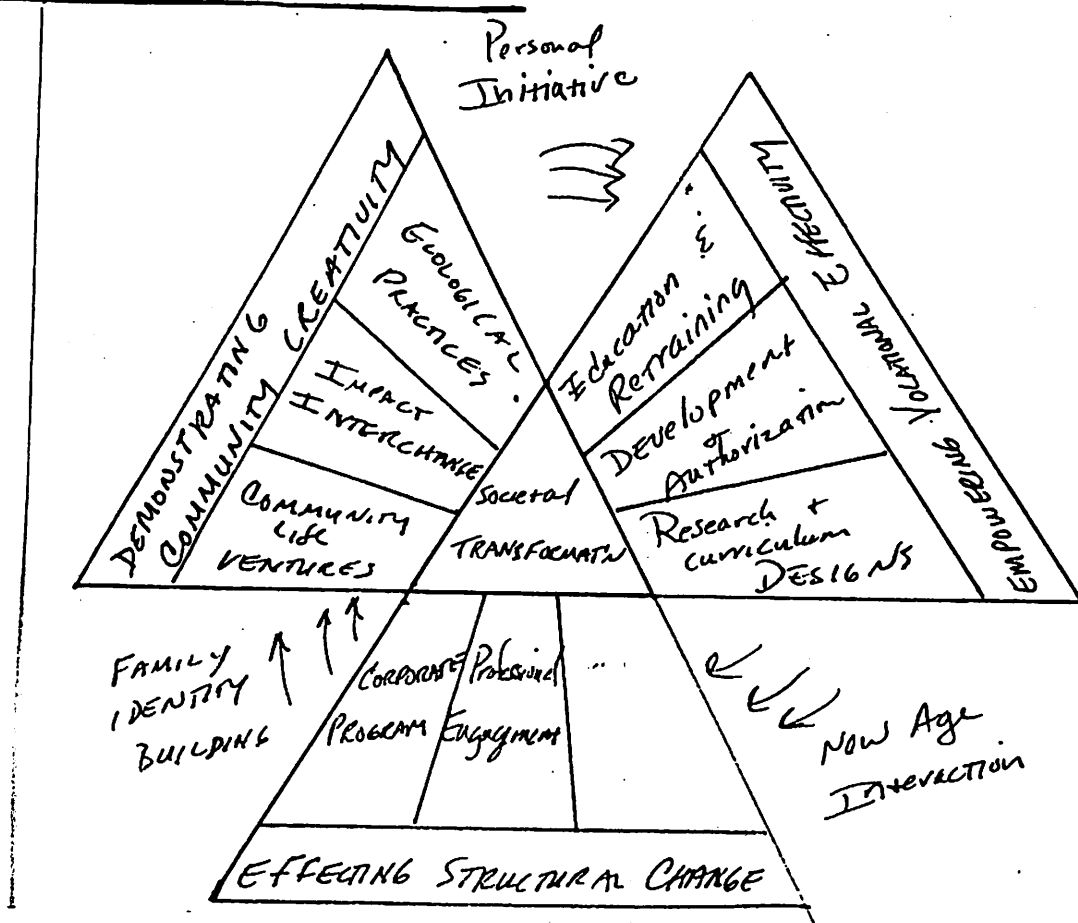

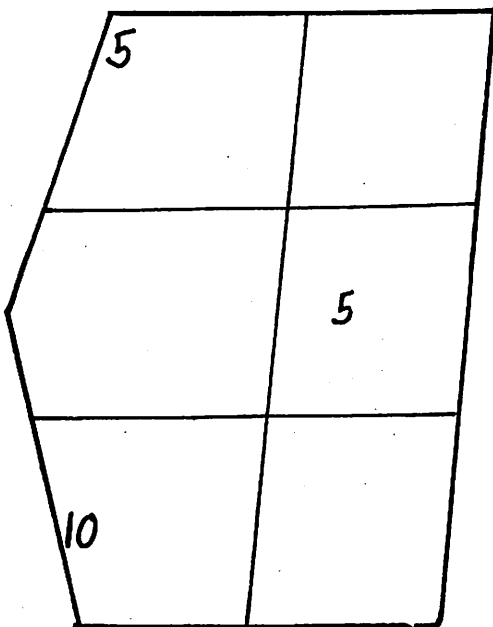

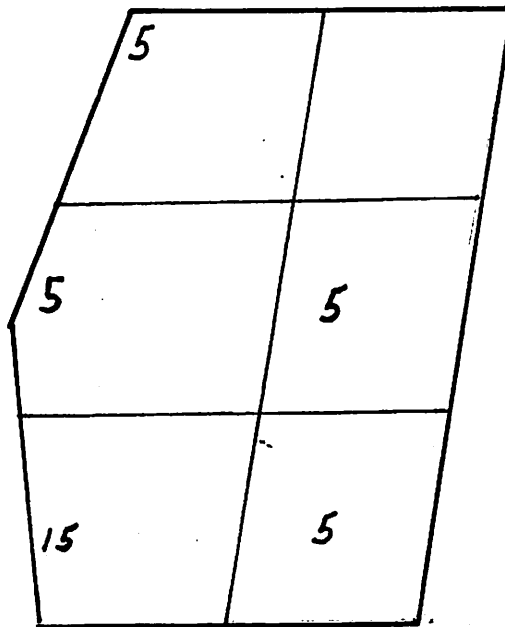
Organizational Structure
