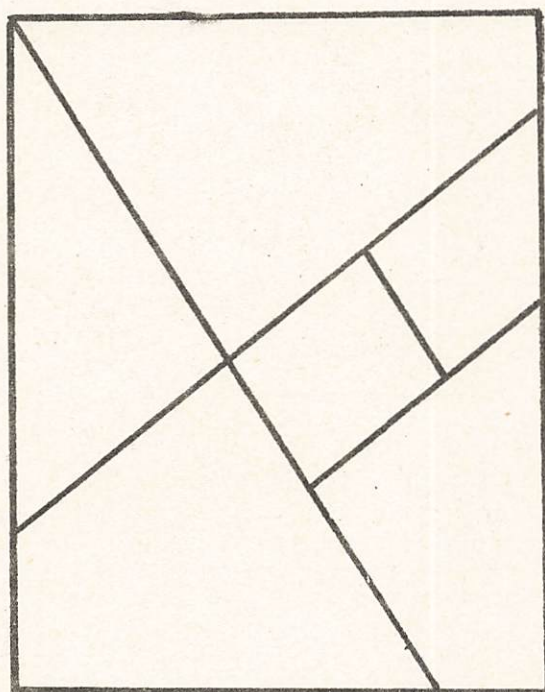

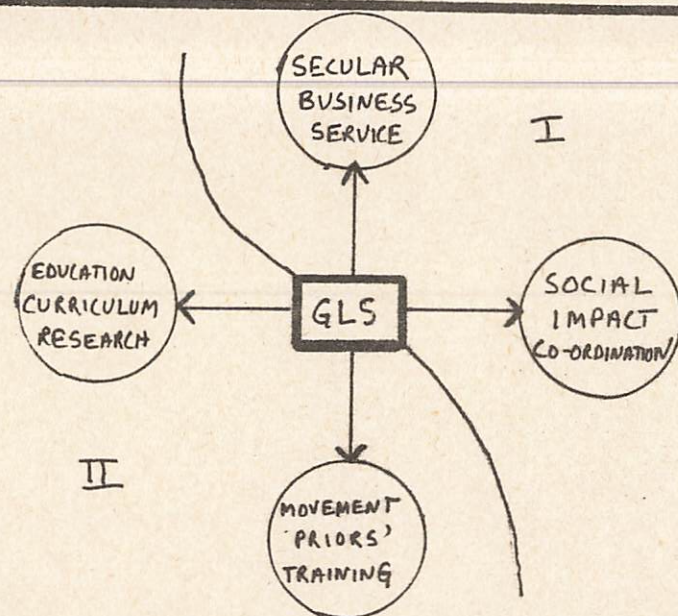

DESCRIPTION

The Global Language School is a global demonstration project as consensed on at Summer 75 in Chicago and the following Global Priors Council. The initial proposal came from Area Tokyo. Korea requested a global language school for movement leadership training and Japan requested a global language school to impact the secular business community. The Global Language School project has been in Area Tokyo for two quarters. In this time the staff has marketed the three-week intensive course to over one hundred fifty companies in Tokyo and Osaka and has taught four courses from two to ten days in length. One half of the faculty manual has been prepared and has been tested. Area Tokyo has demonstrated a passion for this project.

PROPOSAL

We propose a multi-faceted thrust to this global demonstration project in the launching of a Global Language School Network. The two primary aspects of the project will be social and movemental. In Area Tokyo the twenty-three Order: Ecumenical members assigned to teaching will form a network of common impact through the various schools and English classes. Also, we will "go into business" as the Global Language Division of the Japan Management Service in Osaka. In order to train movement leaders for global assignment the Global Language School will hold three-week intensive courses quarterly in the Seoul Program Center and in scheduled courses in the other regions. The Order: Ecumenical teachers in Area Tokyo will form a network of curriculum and methods development in the schools and classes. A staff of four are needed to be assigned as the Global Language School faculty.

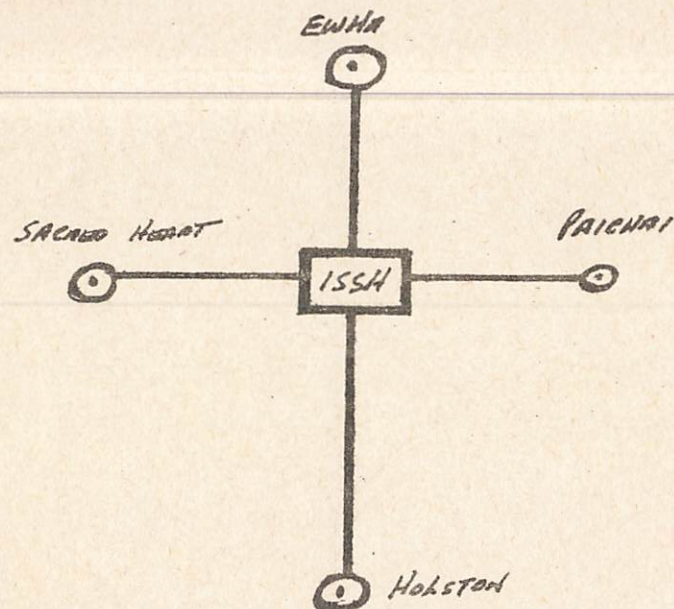
IMPLICATIONS

The formation of the Global Language School Network will impact the secular communities with global social morality, will train global priors, will research intensive indicative, indirect, secular methods, will demonstrate practical service to the world and will create an order wine press by franchising Global Language School through 101 offices of the Institute of Cultural Affairs.

DESCRIPTION

The International School of the Sacred Heart Global Demonstration Project attracted the attention of several Korean schools. At the request of the principals of Ewha, Pai Chai, Holston, and Sacred Heart, i.e. consults were held for each of the total faculties. Each school has requested a follow-up program. The schools represent 13,000 students and over 400 faculty.

PROPOSAL

We propose to create a Global School Galaxy of four Korean schools with the International School of the Sacred Heart serving as the hub. A Principals Task Force made up of the five principals and faculty representation from each school will meet monthly for long range visioning and practical co-ordination. The Education Guild composed of ten faculty from each Korean school and representation from the International School of the Sacred Heart will meet bi-weekly of Indicative Battle Planning and Implementary Modification. The proposed timeline is for seven quarters before replication locally and globally.

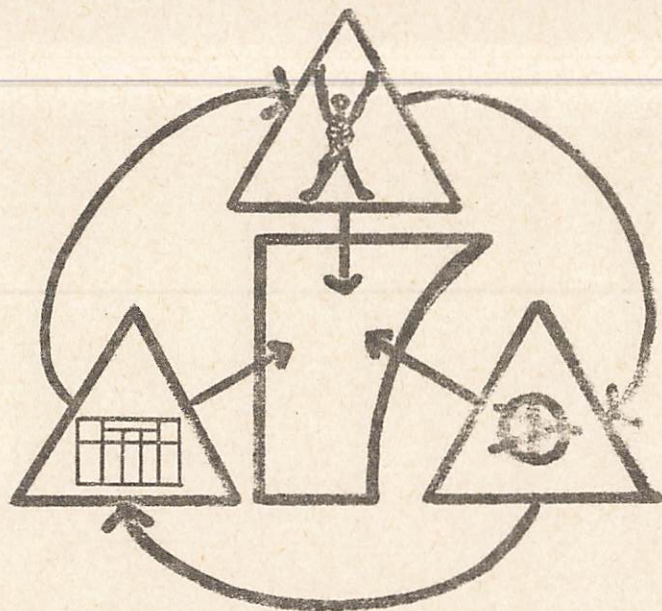
IMPLICATIONS

This project serves to recover the vocation of an international school in the nation in which it is located. The design requires the services of only one catalytic staff and is self-replicating. The project will globalize the national school system and localize the international schools. The project will serve to focus education on global development in each nation.

DESCRIPTION

Kamagasaki Parish is an area of 60,000 in population, located in the south-central part of Osaka. It has deep historical roots as a slum neighborhood populated by migrant day-laborers. This was intensified both during and after the war, as it was undamaged by the bombing and large numbers of people jammed into its housing. It is a nationally consensed problem area, consisting of four general districts: 1) districts under the control of organized gangs 2) prostitution quarters 3) day-laborer housing and 4) poor family housing. It is adjacent to Korean and "burakumin" neighborhoods. Kamagasaki has been officially designated by the city of Osaka as a special project area, and has been renamed "Airin." The city's first approach was simply to level and rebuild the neighborhood, but citizen protests convinced the city to defer its plan, and it is now trying to find local people in sufficient number to enact structural programs. The parish is bounded by two Protestant congregations, and has a few resident Roman Catholic missionaries and sisters and a Kyodan pastor. Otherwise there are no indigenous churches in Kamagasaki.

PROPOSAL

Reformulation in Kamagasaki would mean dealing in effect with the broad contradictions of the entire city of Osaka, which has a cyclical and past-oriented planning methodology, hierarchical insularity of local city and prefectural government, disestablishment stance of the various citizens and volunteer groups, victimism inherent in the common understandings that the city is only a temporary or unreal place to live. Reformulation would deal with all of the foregoing at the point of their greatest density. Its thrust would mean a relating of existing care structures to each other in such a way as to allow them to do their job. As an act of the historical church, this project would practically symbolize the new image of the church as the catalytic agent within society and as its prime servant.

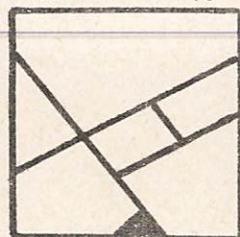
Implications for the movement would be the moving of the Religious House from Kobe to Kamagasaki. The equipping and training of Japanese staff, the development of comprehensive authorization support from the city government and local citizens' groups, broad movemental support from outside the region to facilitate the entry into the parish and to assist in developing a continual tactical system, and fostering of local contacts who can keep the house staff abreast of what is going on in the community. Assigned order forces need to reflect continuity and local expansion during the entry stage.

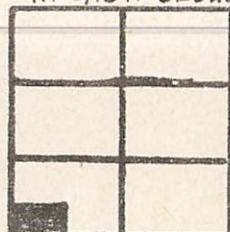
JEJU DO DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

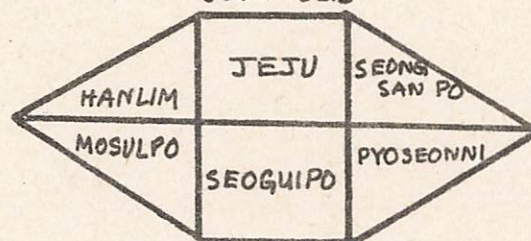

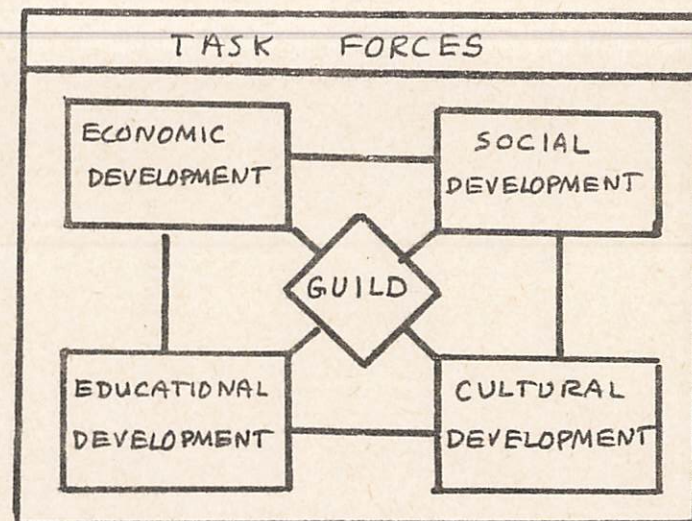
REGION SEOUL

DESCRIPTION

Jeju Island is located in Korea off the southern coast. It is 100 km long and 41 km wide, with a population of 400,000. Jeju was isolated until the 16th century thereby conserving an ancient culture and a unique language. The economic base is farming and fishing. A rural mindset is present and people are 'rearful of 'the mainland'. In modern times Jeju do has been imaged as a bridge between Japan and Korea. Jeju city has an international airport with flights to Osaka. It is a semi-tropical volcanic island.

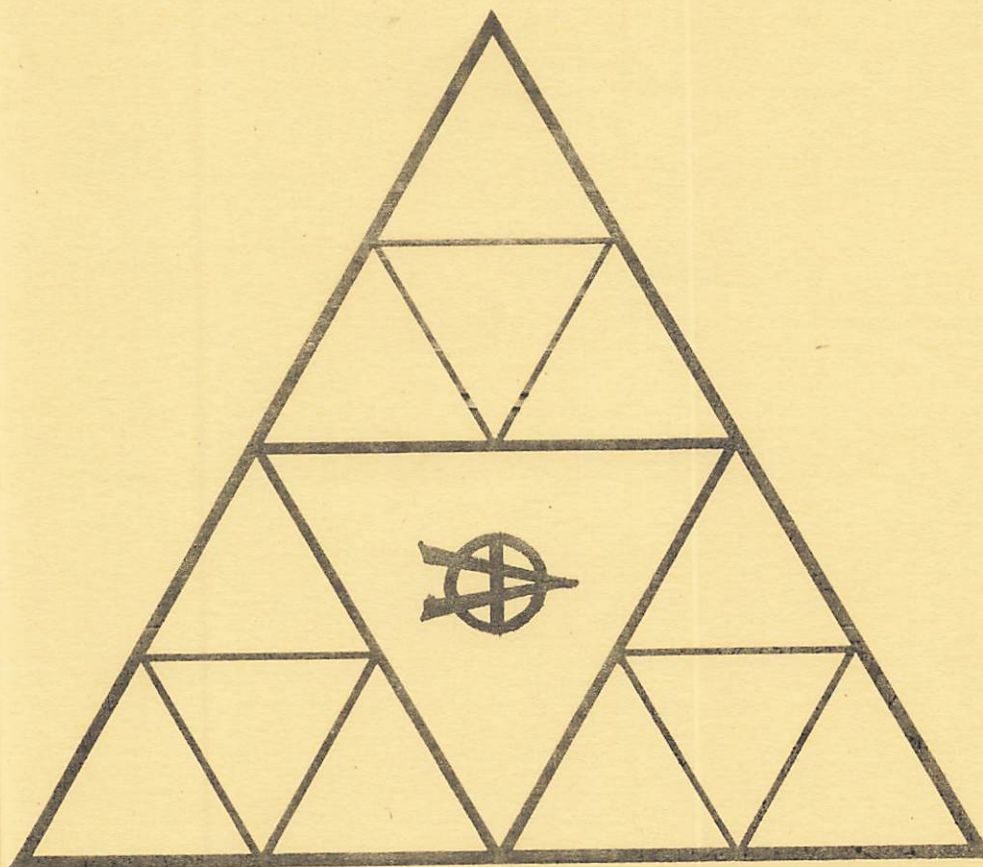
PROPOSAL

The authorization of the Korean government and Jeju churches to launch a comprehensive development project has been given. An invitation has been extended to locate a house in Jeju. Initiation will be with HRM-RSI-PLC for churches and consults with government, business and education. Follow up will be LENS, SMS, New Community Movement Training and ITI. Within one year there will be a Jeju consult with the board of consultants to create the models. Staff need will include one family experienced in 5th City, Uptown 5 or Majuro.

IMPLICATIONS

Since Jeju is the focus of an intensive government development plan, it will serve as a sign for movement service to social institutions by creating the necessary local planning methods linked with creative motivation. The future will be a urban-rural complex with free port facilities with a large center for tourism in Asia. Because it is located in Korea, it will attract world attention.

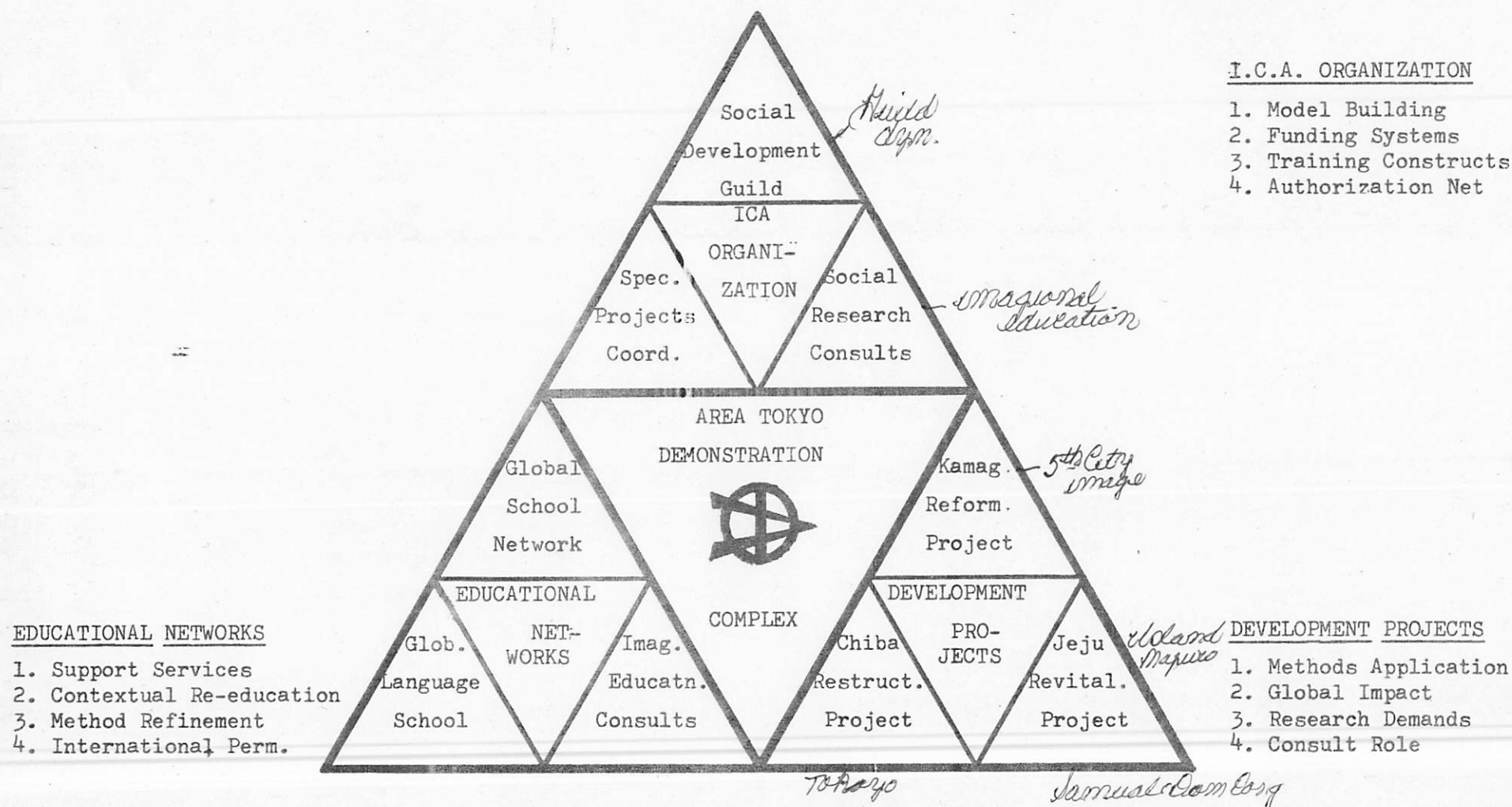
