Chicago is the third largest city in the United States, with a population of nearly three million people. Of-

ten referred to as "the city of neighborhoods" (over 200) its home to doz-ens of cultural institutions, historical sites and museums. In addition, Chi-cago is home to:

JUSTICE IN THE URBAN CONTEXT

Course Description

The ICA offers two separate service learning curricula, a six week and three week intensive service learning course. For students seeking credit, the three week course translates to three academic credit hours, and the six week six credits. The program is also open to noncredit seeking students. Students' time will be segmented into academic work, community action projects, and life in an intentional community.

Students will learn to view the world around them through several different lenses. Using the City of Chicago as their classroom, students will learn tools that allow them to approach social justice is-sues from a systems viewpoint. Through an action-reflection pedagogical approach students will come to understand their place and potential within the system.

Both programs emphasize leadership development and aim to enhance the conceptual and practical tools needed to participate in the social transitions of our time. Students will learn methods for creatively connecting higher education to ongoing efforts of local community organizations. Both programs will be most beneficial to third year and beyond students.

Program Costs
